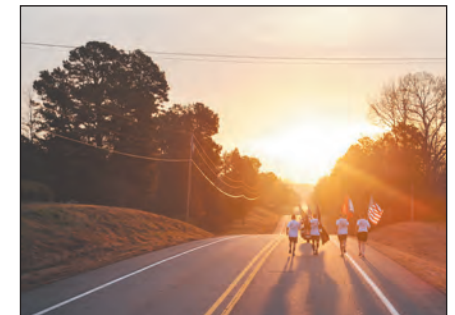

Little Rock delivers

Performing combat airlift at Little Rock Air Force Base would be impossible without cargo. C-130s are designed to deliver supplies and personnel worldwide. The Airmen responsible for safely and quickly loading cargo are called aerial porters. Along with loading cargo onto planes, the aerial porters also palletize loads, weigh cargo, review travel documentation for passengers and perform fleet-service functions. Food, water, medical supplies, Humvees, training pallets and Airmen are all skillfully loaded onto cargo planes by aerial porters, or “port dawgs.” A team of approximately 50 “port dawgs” from the 19th Logistics Readiness Squadron air transportation aircraft services flight contributes in executing C-130 airlift daily. Last year, the aerial port team moved more than 1,500 passengers and approximately 750 tons of cargo.

Commemorating Col. Walters

Base unveils new community center

Team Little Rock celebrated the grand opening of a state-of-the-art Commons facility today with a dedication ceremony to honor one of the community's true champions of quality of life projects.

The family of the late Col. Kenneth Walters, former 19th Mission Support Group deputy commander, represented their father and husband at the unveiling of the new Walters Community Support Center.

The \$3.7-million Walters Center centralizes key support services for military members and their families — the base library, Airman and Family Readiness Center and Community Activities Center — into a convenient location at the heart of the base, Bldg. 940 on Arnold Drive.

However, the most valuable thing about the building isn't tangible; it's the memory of the life of a man who touched so many lives as he fought for his own.

"We couldn't be more honored that he will be immortalized in this way," said Amy Walters, Col. Walters' wife. "It pleases us all to know that this building in particular houses the things he was most passionate about: families, education and community."

As the base remembers her husband's legacy, Amy talked with the *Combat Airlifter* and shared some treasured memories of her husband of 24 years and the impact their time at Little Rock Air Force Base had on their family.

Who was Col. Kenneth Walters?

He was a comedian for sure, and he had a zest for life. He could make anyone feel at ease. He was kind, fair and easy-going, and enjoyed helping others. He didn't come from a privileged family, so Kenny believed hard work was the road to success. He believed in taking the initiative, and he jumped in with both feet on every project. He motivated others with encouragement and led by example. He very much believed "the speed of the boss is the speed of the team."

How did Col. Walters feel about his work at Little Rock Air Force Base?

He came to Little Rock to take his first command with the 348th Recruiting Squadron. That job was his favorite, to that point, and we really saw him in his element. He was such a people person, and working with the young recruiters, mentoring and leading them, was very important to him.

What was Col. Walters' motivation to continue to work while battling cancer?

He was diagnosed on Sept. 24, 2008. Kenny's request from the start with me and with his doctors

a father kept him alive for three and a half years.

His reasons to continue working were several. First, he loved working for the Air Force and with his fellow military members. Second, he was determined to provide for his family. He wanted to get promoted to Colonel with the pay grade and retirement that accompanied it. And last, he wanted to live a normal life and not focus on dying but on living.

What is a fond memory you have here with Col. Walters at Little Rock?

It's going to sound strange, but my fondest memories there include when he was sick. We grew extremely close during this period. We spent so much time together during hospital stays, driving to doctor's appointments, sitting in waiting rooms, and flying to Houston for treatments during the last year that we had the opportunity to really talk and grow in our marriage. He relied completely on me, and I had the honor of being his caregiver.

was simple, "Don't tell me how long I have or when I'm going to die, tell me how to live."

Some may not know that he had to fight not be medically discharged from the Air Force. He had to drive to San Antonio for a hearing at Lackland to fight for his job. He never wanted to give up. He wanted to work and be normal and not lay on the couch waiting to die. Working and staying active as

What did he want people to remember him by most?

We never talked about it, because he refused to face his mortality, but I would think he would want others to remember his carefree, jocular, personality. He would never want anyone to remember him with cancer. He never let it define him.

What do you remember about him most?

Kenny was my rock and my best friend for nearly 30 years. I have very few memories that don't include him. But, what I think of daily was his sheer determination to get through the bad days and face them head-on. He was my hero.

How does your family continue to keep his memory alive?

My family would say I do that a little too extreme. His uniforms still hang on the back of my bedroom door. My license plate is RMBR KEN. He is in pictures all over our house. He made too much of an impact to be forgotten. Most of all we talk about him and about his crazy antics- he was really a funny guy who easily put a smile on everyone's face.

What would Col. Walters say if he was here to see the grand opening?

He would be humble and thankful and claim he was undeserving, but inside he'd be waving a checkered flag and doing his victory lap. He would love that his hard work and commitment both in his career and in his battle with cancer was being celebrated in this way.

The Arkansas Home Solicitation Sales Act protects Arkansas residents from falling prey to improper sales tactics.

Armed with the following facts about the AHSSA, consumers can feel a better sense of confidence in purchasing things from door-to-door salesmen. First, sellers must verbally

Getting up to speed on tornado safety

It's 5 a.m. and what starts out as a deep low siren begins to climb higher into a loud three-to-five minute wailing steady tone.

For many Arkansas residents, the tornado siren is a familiar sound; some people will ignore it and others will not know what to do.

Tornado season is upon Central Arkansas yet again.

The base is not immune from severe weather. The aftermath of the April 2011 EF-2 tornado that ripped through the base left more than 100 on-base houses destroyed, three C-130 aircraft inoperative and buildings along the flight line damaged. Likewise, the devastating EF-4 tornado in April 2014, killed approximately 15 people in Vilonia, injured dozens more and destroyed multiple homes.

Nonjudicial punishments for January and February

Article 15 Actions (Non-Judicial Punishment)

■ An airman first class assigned to the 19th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron received a reduction to the grade of airman and a reprimand for a violation of Article 111 – drunk driving, for driving while intoxicated in base housing.

■ An airman first class assigned to the 19th Maintenance Squadron received forfeitures of \$200.00 pay per month for two months, 20 days extra duty, and a reprimand for a violation of Article 92 – Failure to obey an order or regulation and Article 107 – False Official Statement, for lying to Security Forces about having firearms in his home and not having them registered.

■ An airman first class assigned to the 19th Maintenance Squadron received forfeitures of \$392.00 pay per month for two months, 45 days extra duty, and a reprimand for a violation of Article 86 – Failure to Go, Article 81 – Conspiracy and Article 107 – False Official Statement, for lying to his supervisor about a medical appointment and providing false evidence.

■ An airman first class assigned to the 19th Maintenance Squadron received a reduction to the grade of airman, and a reprimand for a violation of Article 107 – False Official Statement, for lying to his first sergeant about having permission to leave the Dining Facility to go to breakfast and was then later found wandering the BX.

■ A senior airman assigned to the 314th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron received a reduction to the grade of airman first class, forfeitures of \$250.00 pay per month for two months suspended, 30 days extra duty, 15 days extra duty suspended and a reprimand for a violation of Article 86 – Failure to go, failing to go to his appointed place of duty.

■ An airman first class assigned to the 19th Operations Support Squadron received a reduction to the grade of airman, and a reprimand for a violation of Article 92 – Dereliction of Duty, possessing alcohol in his dormitory while under the legal drinking age of 21.

■ A senior airman assigned to the 61st Airlift Squadron received reduction to the grade of airman first class and a reprimand for a violation of Article 134 – Drunk and Disorderly, for being disorderly in hotel and for becoming belligerent with local police when they tried to apprehend her.

Courts-Martial

■ Airman First Class Daniel Pentalow, 19th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron, was found guilty at a Special Court-Martial of one specification for using cocaine in violation of Article 112a, Uniform Code of Military Justice.

As a sentence, Pentalow received a reduction to the grade of E-1, forfeiture of \$1,031 pay per month for one month, and confinement for 20 days.

Involuntary Discharges

■ A captain assigned to the 19th Operation Support Squadron received an under other than honorable conditions discharge for possessing and distributing hundreds of images of child pornography in a deployed location.

■ A senior airman assigned to the 19th Maintenance Squadron received a general discharge for: failing a quality verification inspection, failing a PT test, failing to complete annual flight line driving training, failing to follow instructions, failing to follow orders, failing in financial obligations, and failing to report government vehicle damage.

■ An airman assigned to the 19th Maintenance Squadron received a general discharge for: failing to comply with instructions, dereliction in duties, failing to meet suspense dates for

5-skill level training, failing to properly document, failing to complete an order, failing in financial obligations on numerous occasions, driving with expired vehicle registration, cutting wires on equipment, and a failing a fitness assessment.

■ An airman first class assigned to the 19th Medical Support Squadron received a general discharge for: committing fraud, failing to validate name and birthdate of patient, disobeying a lawful order, and dispensing medication to the wrong patient.

■ An airman assigned to the 19th Security Forces Squadron received a general discharge for consuming alcohol while under the legal drinking age of 21, and for being diagnosed with a mental health disorder.

■ An airman first class assigned to the 50th Airlift Squadron received an honorable discharge for being diagnosed with a mental health disorder, and intentionally making false official statements.

■ An airman assigned to the 19th Airlift Wing received a general discharge for: failing to refrain from traveling before his official leave began, failing to report on time, failing to stop at a stop sign, wearing inappropriate clothing outside the dorm and for being willfully absent from quarters after 12 a.m. and before 4 a.m.

■ An airman basic assigned

to the 19th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron received a general discharge for being found guilty of using cocaine.

■ An airman first class assigned to the 19th Maintenance Squadron received a general discharge for: failing to refrain from consuming alcohol while under the legal drinking age of 21, failing to obey civilian traffic regulations, and failing a Career Development Course 5-Level.

■ An airman first class assigned to the 19th Maintenance Squadron received a general discharge for: failing his dorm room inspection six times, failing to have properly fitting uniform, defaulting on Military Star Card credit payments, and failing to properly adhere to Air Force grooming standards.

From the 19th Airlift Wing's Office of the Staff Judge Advocate: The Uniform Code of Military Justice authorizes commanders to exercise personal discretion in evaluating each case. Commanders consider the nature of the offense, the record of the servicemember, the need for good order and discipline, the effect of punishment on the servicemember, and the servicemember's record. Every case is unique and is evaluated independently. Running to Remember

March 20-22 marked the fourth annual Arkansas Run for the Fallen. Service members from all branches ran 146 miles dedicating each mile to a fallen hero.

Runners, who carried a small American Flag with a biography attached to it, made their way through the normally bustling streets of Ozark, with only one objective in mind, to honor those who have made the ultimate sacrifice.

The biography card tells the story of a fallen Arkansan who has lost their life protecting the rights and freedoms all Americans enjoy.

The running team stopped at each mile where they present an American Flag and a biographical card in honor of a fallen service member in an effort to create a 146-mile memorial trail through Arkansas. Once they placed the flag into the ground at the designated memorial site for the fallen service member, the team then rendered a salute and hugged the family members who patiently waited at their loved ones designated memorial, before grabbing their flags and pressing forth to the next hero.

According to the official Arkansas Run for the Fallen website, their mission is to raise awareness for the native Arkansans who fought and died supporting the Global War on Terrorism. The purpose is also to provide support, hope and healing to families grieving the death of a loved one who served in the military service regardless of relationship or circumstance of death.

"The cost that the families of these brave sons and daughters have made will never be forgotten so long as blood courses through my veins," said Chief Master Sgt. Bubba Beason, 19th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron section chief and creator of the Arkansas Run for the Fallen.

For the fourth year in a row, the three-day event began in Ozark, after a small ceremony and the singing of the national anthem. Volunteers this year included bikers from the group Rolling Thunder, runners, state police, as well as military

personnel and civilians.

This year, runners were grouped into five-person teams. One runner carried the American flag, the second, the Arkansas state flag, the third, the Remember the Fallen flag, the fourth, the Prisoner of War, Missing in Action flag and the fifth a smaller American flag attached with the biography of the fallen hero.

"I'm very passionate about this," Beason said. "I read a quote once that said, 'One person with passion can accomplish more than 40 people with an interest.' I've got passion for this. To me, this is a calling."

Beason said he discovered his calling March 27, 2007. He was participating in the Bataan Memorial Death March in White Sands, New Mexico, a 26.2-mile ruck march through desert terrain symbolizing the march that American

and Philippine soldiers endured at the hands of the Japanese in World War II. It wasn't the race, however, that made the impression that would stay with Beason for life. It was a chance encounter with Janice Bridges, a Gold Star Mother. Her son, Michael Paul Bridges, was killed while serving in Iraq. Bridges introduced herself to Beason as a Gold Star Mother. He had never heard of the organization and questioned her about it.

"I was so embarrassed," he said. "I was speechless. I looked like a fool."

A gold-star parent is the parent of a fallen service member, whereas a blue-star parent is the parent of a service member who's still actively serving.

Beason loves meeting and helping gold-star families in any way he can; that's why Beason was chosen as the 2009 USO

Service member of the year. Beason was also named as the 2014 American Hero. He was invited to the 43rd Annual Awards because of his participation in these events. He was named as the 2014 Hero of Hope.

Once a bombardment wing, the 308th Strategic Missile Wing re-activated April 1, 1962, with the mission of manning the 18th Titan II silos under construction around Central Arkansas. Components of the 308th Strategic Missile Wing consisted of the 373rd and 374th Strategic Missile Squadrons. Crews from the 308th SMW held the distinction of being the first and last combat-ready missile crews to fire Titan IIs from Vandenberg Air Force Base, California. From 1963 to 1987, crews maintained missiles on 24-hour alert, ready to launch within minutes after receipt of authenticated orders from the National Command Authorities.

inform buyers of their cancellation rights and provide the buyer two copies of a cancellation form and a copy of the contract or receipt. Moreover, consumers can cancel any home-solicitation sale within three days of purchase, for any reason.

Even if the seller has already installed equipment, you still have the right to cancel the contract within three days. Be aware that the AHSSA only applies to purchases more than \$25, and does not apply to repairs to personal property, such as HVAC systems or appliances. Know your rights as a consumer and buy with confidence.

Tornadoes can appear in the blink of an eye, and everyone needs to be prepared, have a plan and stay safe.

"Whether a person has been around tornados their whole life or you are new to them, preparation is still very crucial," said Rick Myers, 19th Airlift Wing safety manager. "Practice drills frequently, especially if you have children; that way, everyone knows what to do."

Something many people confuse is the difference between a tornado watch and a tornado warning. A tornado watch means there are possibilities of a tornado; continue to remain alert. A tornado warning, on the other hand, means a tornado has been indicated by the weather radar system or visibly sighted.

Once the sirens sound, seek shelter immediately.

"Stay informed about the weather as much as possible. If a tornado warning is underway, go to the innermost part of the structure to take cover," Myers said.

Before the storm, everyone should be

prepared and know what to do in the event of a tornado.

One way to be prepared is to have a weather kit, which should include water, food, flashlights and a National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration weather radio. This will help ensure you can stay informed about the weather if there is a possible power outage.

Always remember to develop a plan for the safety of you and your family.

The best places to take cover are in a bathroom or basement. Stay away from windows and always stay indoors.

If you are caught outdoors or perhaps in your car, get out and find the closest ditch or lowest point to take cover in. Stay away from overpasses if possible, which is an easy place to be swept up by the tornado. Never try to outrun a tornado in your car.

There are many different ways to stay updated on the weather such as weather alert apps, radios and TVs. It's also important to update your AtHoc notification system to receive updates straight to your phone about what's going on, on base.


