## Nearly 100 TLR Airmen deploy to Southwest Asia

The 61st Airlift Squadron was filled with Airmen cherishing their final moments with their children, parents, spouses and friends before deploying to Southwest Asia May 4 at Little Rock Air Force Base.

More than 70 Airmen from the 61st AS were apart of nearly 100 who headed downrange in support of combat airlift missions. Airmen from the 19th Operation Support Squadron, 50th Airlift Squadron and 19th Medical Group were also part of this deployment rotation.

With the help of a number of Team Little Rock units, the 61st AS was able to focus their pre-deployment training for the challenges of flying in Afghanistan. The 19th Logistic Readiness Squadron helped provide engine offload training and also training with loading and unloading fuel trucks onto the aircraft which are common tasks downrange.

"The home station training prepares us to help out our brothers and sisters that are on the ground," said Lt. Col. Eric Westby, 61st AS commander.

The revolving door of deployments for the 61st AS will continue with another rotation slated to deploy later this year.

# Fall Protection focus of week

The Air Force Ground Safety Fall Protection Focus week aimed at reminding all community members of the dangers of preventable falls ends on May 15.

The initiative is a partnership with the Occupational Safety and Health Administration and National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health's campaign, "National Safety Stand-Down."

During fiscal years 2010-2014, the Air Force had 7,671 injuries from falls resulting in 44,000 lost work days at a cost of more than \$30 million; which includes three fatalities. According to OSHA, over the last 10 years, more than 3,500 workers have died from falls which remains the leading cause of death in construction, accounting for more than a third of deaths in the industry.

"During fiscal years 2012-2014, Little Rock AFB had 18 mishaps contributing to falls resulting in 90 lost work days at a cost of more than \$72,000," said Rick Myers, 19th Airlift Wing ground safety manager. "The proper training, appropriate equipment and work center inspections, as well as risk management techniques will assist in the reduction of these types of mishaps."

Supervisors should also conduct an in-depth review of all job safety analyses for each work task not governed by tech data or other definitive guidance and ensure all associated risks are identified and control measures are implemented to reduce potential fall mishaps.

"Fall protection or prevention is not only for activities related to heights that are encountered every day on-the-job, but also includes, for example, falls that can happen because of wet floors or obstacles on a walkway," said Bill Parsons, Air Force chief of ground safety. "We want everyone to remember that preventable falls are inexcusable and that we must continue to do all we can to protect ourselves and each other."





TEAM LITTLE ROCK HISTORY FACT OF THE WEEK · 153 DAYS TO GO UNTIL LRAFB TURNS 60!

19th Bombardment Group aircrews participated in the Battle of Coral Sea May 4 - 8, 1942. During the battle, 19 BG crews raided enemy transportation and communication targets as well as troop concentrations while the Japanese attempted to invade New Guinea. Crews assigned to the group staged missions from multiple airfields and operated B-17s in sorties that could last up to 18 hours. The Battle of Coral Sea featured the first naval engagement fought by aircraft as the opposing ships made no contact. At the end of the battle, U.S. forces had successfully thwarted a Japanese invasion of Port Moresby, New Guinea, a location that would have allowed the Japanese to launch an invasion into Australia.
