

Black Knights welcome new commander

The 19th Airlift Wing and Little Rock Air Force Base welcomed their new commander, Col. Charles Brown Jr., during a change of command ceremony May 27.

The ceremony's presiding officer, Lt. Gen. Carlton D. Everhart II, 18th Air Force commander, accepted the wing's guidon from Col. Patrick Rhatigan and passed it to Brown, symbolizing the beginning of his command of the Black Knights.

"It is my honor to be back at Little Rock Air Force Base... the Home of Combat Airlift," said Brown. "The leading edge of tactical airlift, Team Little Rock has been in the Joint fight, defending the Homeland and decisively taking the fight to the enemy on foreign soil for decades... providing it in a manner that

cannot be duplicated by any other country, fellow service, or any other airlift wing in the United States Air Force."

The 19th Airlift Wing works in concert with the 314th Airlift Wing, 189th Airlift Wing, the 913th Airlift Group and 29th Weapons Squadron in all aspects of C-130 operations and training. As commander, Brown will lead the world's largest fleet of C-130 aircraft and is responsible for providing worldwide deployable C-130 aircraft, aircrews, expeditionary combat support personnel and equipment for Air Mobility Command and Air Expeditionary Force taskings.

The new commander's priorities for the base can be distilled into three words: Trust, Teamwork and Training. As the 62nd Airlift Squadron commander here from 2009-2011, Brown knows the importance of those three

ideals to the base's tradition of teamwork.

"The secret to our success lies in the seamless integrated and interdependent relationships with our teammates in the 314th Airlift Wing, our Air National Guard partners in the 189th Airlift Wing, our Reserve partners in the 913th (Airlift Group) and, to round out us out, our teammates in the 29th Weapons School.

That tradition of teamwork extends beyond the base fence line where unrivaled community support buoys base Airmen and their families.

"None of this would be possible without the love, support and leadership that the Little Rock Air Force base surrounding communities have provided us for 60 years. This has been the true core of our excellence," Brown said. "We will continue this legacy and excel in the future by continuing to foster a climate of trust

AF implements automated evaluation, decoration processing via myPers

 JOINT BASE SAN ANTONIO-RANDOLPH, Texas (AFNS) -- Beginning in May, supervisors of active-duty Airmen will be able to initiate, process, track and sign officer and enlisted evaluations using myPers, Air Force Personnel Center officials announced May 15.

Additionally, beginning in June, supervisors of active-duty members will be able to use myPers to initiate and track decorations as well.

"Airmen can view their personnel records, update assignment preferences, update their record of emergency data and more on myPers through the 'Access AFPC Secure' link," said Christine Stingley, the military future operations branch requirements and testing chief. "Enabling Airmen to manage their personnel information and perform transactions electronically creates efficiencies all around."

Adding the automated evaluation and decoration processing piece through an app on myPers called



the virtual Personnel Center (vPC) will further improve Airmen's access to personnel processes, she explained.

Once the automated process is activated in May for active duty, supervisors will be able to initiate Airmen's evaluations and route them through their respective reviewer and approval officials, much like the existing Evaluations Management System.

"Unlike the existing system, once the evaluation is signed by the ratee, the military personnel section will be able to receive and forward it to AFPC through myPers vPC for final processing into an individual's official record at the click of a button," Stingley said.

vPC is a modified version of vPC Guard and Reserve, a system used by the Air Reserve Personnel Center to support Reserve and Guard programs.

Electronic processing of awards and decorations will save members time since it will include prepopulated certificates and memorandums,

online "Décor 6" forms, automatic updates to Military Personnel Data System and automatic transfers to official records.

Active-duty decorations will be initiated, processed and tracked through the vPC app dashboard. Initially, the award automation will include the Meritorious Service Medal, Air Force Commendation Medal, Air Force Achievement Medal, Aerial Achievement Medal, Combat Readiness Medal and Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal.

Processing and submitting active-duty evaluations through myPers will be mandatory for all officer evaluations that close out on or after June 30 and for enlisted evaluations beginning with the senior master sergeant static closeout date of July 31.

Processing and submitting active-duty decorations through myPers will be phased in as base certificate stock is depleted.



LRAFB observes Police Week 2015

Little Rock Air Force Base, along with multiple police community partners, honored those who serve in law enforcement during National Police Week May 11-15.

National Police Week is held every year in conjunction with Peace Officers Memorial Day, which was first designated by President John F. Kennedy on May 15, 1962. This year's Police Week included a series of morale-building and commemorative events with eight local, state and federal police agencies.

"I have been in law enforcement for a little over ten years and I love every bit of it," said Staff Sgt. Alphonso Price, 19th Security Forces Squadron supply noncommissioned officer in charge and Police Week organizer. Deli-bakery contract awarded for 44 commissaries

FORT LEE, Va. (AFNS) — A new contractor will start taking over deli-bakery operations next month at 44 Midwest commissaries that were impacted when a contractor-provided service ceased at the end of February, due to performance issues.

“I’m pleased to announce that Military Deli and Bakery Services Inc. (MDBS), has been awarded the contract and this will allow us to transition these stores back to contractor-operated deli-bakeries,” said Joseph Jeu, the Defense Commissary Agency director and CEO.

Since the end of February, the commissary agency has been providing limited deli-bakery services



at all the commissaries with the exception of Fort Sill, Oklahoma. This was primarily done by hiring many of the former contractor’s employees on temporary appointments as government employees.

Starting Monday, MDBS will begin taking over the deli-bakery operations in a phased roll out that includes the restoration of fresh sushi bars at stores that offer this service.

The sushi bar roll out is expected to be complete by mid-July.



Filling the AFSC gap

Initiatives to meet increased mission needs

WASHINGTON (AFNS) — The Air Force is introducing several personnel and manpower initiatives to meet increased mission requirements outlined in the fiscal year 2016 President's Budget.

In order to enhance operational and mission capacity in support of combatant commanders, and to maintain readiness, the Air Force is setting a minimum active-duty force level of 317,000 as established in the fiscal 2016 President's Budget submission. The Air Force is undergoing a concerted effort to stabilize and grow the force by fiscal 2017, to include addressing key gaps in the nuclear, cyber, intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance, and support career fields.

The Air Force is using the most direct way to grow the force by increasing the accessions of enlisted Airmen entering basic military training and the numbers of officers being commissioned. To complement those efforts, the Air Force is also offering opportunities to retain key experience and increase operational manning levels through targeted voluntary high year of tenure (HYT) extensions, Voluntary Limited Period of Active Duty Program affording opportunities to members of the Air Reserve Component to serve an active-duty tour, and Direct Duty Prior Service Enlistment Program opening doors for prior-service enlisted members to return to active duty.

The focus of these programs is to increase the number of experienced Airmen in undermanned specialties such as nuclear, cyber, intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance, and special operations. The Air Force specialties covered

under these programs were not eligible to participate in any of the targeted fiscal 2014 voluntary or involuntary force management programs. The one exception was the Quality Force Review Board, where all Airmen with some negative quality factors were considered regardless of their specialty.

"While we are working to increase our overall number of Airmen, we particularly focused on adding mid-level experienced Airmen in some of our currently undermanned specialties to help meet mission requirements immediately," said Brig. Gen. Brian Kelly, the director of military force management policy.

The new programs being launched are designed to meet the need for experienced Airmen in critically undermanned specialties such as nuclear, cyber, intelligence, remotely piloted aircraft and special operations.

Voluntary HYT extensions are being offered to senior airmen, staff sergeants, technical sergeants and master sergeants in targeted specialties; however, Airmen will only be approved if recommended for the extension by their unit commander or civilian leader. The length of the extension can vary depending on each Airman's situation. Specific details on the fiscal 2015 HYT extension program will be released by AFPC and available via myPers May 18.

Opportunities to serve an active-duty tour for a period of up to three years will be offered to members of the Air Reserve Component in targeted Air Force specialties. The Voluntary Limited Period of Active Duty Program

132 DAYS TO GO UNTIL LRAFB TURNS 60!

On May 31, 1971, the host unit at Little Rock Air Force Base host unit, the 64th Tactical Airlift Wing, inactivated after only one year at the base and was immediately replaced by the 314th TAW, previously assigned to Ching Chuan Kang Air Base, Taiwan. The 314 TAW transferred to Little Rock without personnel or equipment, assuming the personnel and assets of the inactivated 64 TAW, including the 61st and 62d Tactical Airlift Squadrons. Strategic Air Command's 308th Strategic Missile Wing and the 4442nd Combat Crew Training Wing (the C-130 Formal Training Unit) were the major tenant units. The 314th remained the host unit at Little Rock AFB for the next 37 years.

allows the Air Force to increase experience in mid-level grades by leveraging trained Airmen from the Air Force Reserves and Air National Guard. These Airmen will receive the same benefits as active-duty Airmen, such as qualifying for the Post 9/11 GI Bill, while serving a tour on active duty. Further information, such as which grades and specialties are eligible, will also be available in the coming weeks.

Under the Direct Duty Prior Service Enlistment Program, applicants must have separated from the active-duty Air Force, or be separated from or currently serving in the ANG or Air Force Reserve in the grade of senior

airman through technical sergeant as a fully qualified 5- or 7-level in one of the designated Air Force specialties. Army, Navy or Marine Corps service members may also be eligible if they served in a career field equivalent to one of the specialties targeted in the fiscal 2015 program. Under this program, applicants are not eligible to receive a reenlistment bonus.

Airmen interested in applying for HYT or the Voluntary Limited Period of Active Duty Program are encouraged to review the additional eligibility details on myPers. Prior service members interested in Direct Duty Prior Service Enlisted Program can find information at <http://www.airforce.com/contact-us/faq/prior-service/> or contact their local recruiter.




