Every Service member, at every level in our military, must know, understand, and adhere to Service values and standards of behavior in order to eliminate sexual assault, and other inappropriate behavior.



Snapshot: Col. Charles Brown Jr.

(Editor's note: 19th Airlift Wing and installation commander Col. Charles Brown Jr. talked about his vision, goals and plans for the wing in an interview July 15 with Senior Airman Scott Poe and Tech. Sgt. Jason Armstrong, 19th Airlift Wing Public Affairs. An edited transcript follows.)

Q. How did it feel to be selected to come back to Little Rock AFB as the installation commander?

A. It was definitely humbling. The thing that I probably thought about the most in the lead up to taking command is 'what is the best way I can take care of that wing and the installation and really share what the base has to offer to the community and what the community has to offer to the base?'

[I didn't have] a lot of sleepless nights, but I definitely had a lot on my mind as to not wanting to fail. [I have] so much passion and love for the mission and the Airmen here that it's a lot of weight to put on one person's shoulders. I'm the commander by position, and that comes with its own scope

of authorities and responsibilities, but it's actually a team. That was the part that really was the 'warm blanket' that brought me in and took some of that pressure off of me. You would think the pressure got greater when I took command, but it actually was lessened when I saw the quality of our Airmen and the quality of the mission—the genuine trust I could have in the Airmen to do their jobs day-to-day and see them well-balanced and fit. I saw families out doing things together and saw the community rallying around them.

It's really hard to describe what it feels like for someone who hasn't had a genuine home in over 21 years to actually come back to the place that feels like home, live on the installation and be reunited with friends and family.

You know, if my career were to end today, I wouldn't be happy about it, but it would definitely be at my high point being here.

Q. What is your vision for Little Rock AFB under your command?

A. To do the mission day-to-day, and not have to worry about [those little details] at my

level. I don't need to dive down into the lowest tactical levels to find out if people are doing their jobs. Knowing those questions are already answered probably saves me six months [of time] so I can do things like reach out to the community, and I can host civic leader tours. [This allows us to] expand our horizon by

transforming the wing into a C-130J wing, ensuring it's right-sized and that it's resourced to be combat effective. We'll be first to get there, in what has been an 11-year transformation of transferring C-130H and E aircraft either into retirement or into the Reserve or Guard components. By producing combat aviators and C-130J's that come together and go out into the far reaches

of the globe and execute that mission comes a new paradigm, if you will, of looking at the way we do business. Being able to ensure that from the flightline to the front gate we're resourced properly, our personnel are here properly, and that our infrastructure is right-sized—we don't have excess capacity where we don't need it.

What that means to us is we are being

Vandenberg road project starts Saturday

Little Rock Air Force Base is currently undergoing one of the largest construction projects in the base's history.


The \$108 million runway upgrade is a well-known project; however, a multitude of other projects are taking place to ensure the safety of Airmen and the future viability of base infrastructure.

From Saturday to Tuesday, incoming traffic on Vandenberg Boulevard will be reduced to a single lane. The project will reduce speeds in the construction zone, which consists of the area near the intersection of Vandenberg Boulevard and US-67.

The routine maintenance construction will only affect inbound traffic to the base.

Other summer road repairs can be seen on the base as well. The current and planned road construction projects include an area of Lachmund Drive near the Child Development Center, the parking lot of the Walters Community Support Center and Cannon Drive near the Base Exchange.

"Base drivers will notice ongoing road

construction for the rest of the summer through early fall. To ensure safety, drivers need to be aware of and follow road signs," said Jennifer Harris, 19th Civil Engineer Squadron deputy base civil engineer.

Airmen from the 19th CES will continue to make smaller road repairs where needed. Follow Little Rock AFB on Facebook to be aware of construction projects and traffic slowdowns that may affect daily commutes to work.



PT exemptions, dwell time for new AF mothers increase to one year

Washington (AFNS) – The six-month deferment for female Airmen to accomplish their fitness assessments following childbirth will be increased to 12 months to align with recent changes to the deployment deferrals, Air Force officials announced July 14.

The deployment deferment policy, as part of the Air Force's 2015 Diversity and Inclusion initiatives, increases the deferment from deployment, short tour or dependent-restricted assignment, and temporary duty to one year, unless waived by the service member.

“The goal is to alleviate the strain on some of our talented Airmen who choose to leave the Air Force as they struggle to balance deployments and family issues, and this is especially true soon after childbirth,” said

Secretary of the Air Force Deborah Lee James.

The one-year deferment applies to female Airmen who gave birth on or after the effective date of March 6, 2015, to provide predictability with minimal disruption to Airmen and the deployment process.

As dwell times for deployment, permanent change of station and TDY increase, so too will the exemption from the current fitness assessment for female Airmen following pregnancies lasting 20 weeks or more (delivery, miscarriage, etc.). The service does not anticipate significant mission or readiness impacts associated with extending this action.

“Like many other programs announced earlier this year, such as the Career Intermission Program, we recognize the potential retention benefits associated with providing our female Airmen options that allow them to serve and

support their family without having to choose one over the other,” James said.

Air Force Guidance Memorandums will be available detailing the changes to both policies in the coming weeks.

The Air Force continues to research opportunities, in conjunction with the Department of Defense, to extend the maternity and convalescent leave period, similar to the recent changes announced by the Secretary of the Navy.

Airmen currently receive six weeks (42 days) of maternity leave, in line with the Department of Defense policy. By direction of the President, federal agencies can advance up to six weeks of paid sick leave to federal employees with a new child.

“We want to make sure we develop an equitable policy that supports all of our Airmen and also maintains the ability to execute our mission,” James said.

Deployed Airman ensures lifesaving equipment ready



BAGRAM AIRFIELD, Afghanistan – Senior Airman Greg Flannigan, 455th Expeditionary Airlift Squadron aircrew flight equipment journeyman, is responsible for making sure C-130 aircrews are supplied with lifesaving equipment prior to flying a mission here.

Flannigan inspects and maintains all the lifesaving equipment that pilots and aircrew may use in the event of an aircraft emergency, whether it is in the air or on the ground. The equipment he supplies may be used to save a pilot or crew members life while in flight, or if the aircraft goes down.

“If there is a situation with an aircraft, we provide them with all the necessary equipment that may save an individual’s life. Without us providing this equipment they really wouldn’t have a good chance of survival if something were to happen,” Flannigan said. “It’s a satisfying feeling knowing that the equipment we issue can be used to save someone. If the aircrew gets stuck in a sticky situation, our equipment could help make the situation better...it’s just a good feeling.”

Flannigan is a part of the “1000s of Hands” of the 455 AEW Airmen who are crucial to the wing’s mission to generate and sustain airpower on the combat frontier of Afghanistan’s NATO’s Resolute Support mission and Operation Freedom’s Sentinel. The “1000s of Hand” project highlights Airmen who have a hand in delivering a blanket of steel technology and courage to protect the face in the field and support Afghan National Defense and Security Forces.

LRAFB HISTORY FAST FACT

76 DAYS TO GO UNTIL LRAFB TURNS 60!

In July 2003, base leaders dedicated the base lake in honor of Kenneth (Pat) Wilson, one of Little Rock AFB's "founding fathers." In 1957, while construction workers removed soil from the area for use during construction of family housing, laborers uncovered a spring. When workers removed the soil, they created a depression that water from the spring filled. Wilson suggested the area be developed as a base lake and recreation area; however, policy at that time required Air Force personnel to return the land to its original condition. Undeterred, he pursued his vision and was ultimately successful. If not for Wilson, the base lake may not exist. He was vital to the base's founding, and his devotion was instrumental to the creation and preservation of the base.





around and use opportunities to boost pride. Thank people for what they do. Coach, teach and mentor our young Airmen. Moreover, be a good example. How can we expect to see pride, if we do not show pride?

Discipline. Commitment and pride are born out of discipline. Discipline involves abiding by standards whether you like them or not. good stewards of taxpayers' [money] when we're doing everything we can, and we've ensured we have all the resources and training that we need. We trust our civilian leaders, and they trust us back; we have confidence they have our back, and we will do what we're asked when called upon. Then to know I don't have to worry about unit level dynamics: one, because I have great group commanders and unit level commanders, but, two, because the Airmen know what they're doing and the pride they have in mission success goes beyond any need for me to ever micro-manage them.

Q. How would you describe the importance of our relationship with the Central Arkansas community?

A. What I see is not necessarily a 'need' to have an Air Force base here, but a true desire

to have the Air Force base here. There are a lot of other places where you could fly C-130s, and we exhibit that in the state of Texas and Japan and Germany, but the reason we're home to Combat Airlift and the center of all things C-130 is because we have a community that's embraced our mission.

We have a partnership with the 314th Airlift Wing, 189th AW and the 913th Airlift Group that they find value in being in Arkansas; they genuinely enjoy being in Arkansas. When you have the perfect combination of an 'at-home' advantage, as well as mission impact, and then you have people who want to be here and people who strive to stay here and [thousands] who decided to retire here—I think that's a testament to the community. Their desire to keep the mission here and the advantage we have is that we are much more effective through the community support we have—from all the way down to Hot Springs, north up to Vilonia and Russellville and across the state.

Q. What are your thoughts on leading

Combat Airlifters?


A. I tell you, the thing that has made me put my uniform on every day and gotten me out the door is the Airmen. Whether I'm in the position to lead or whether I'm being charged to follow, the folks I have worked with over the last 21 years are the best people I've ever met.

The leadership part is an honor. It's really sad when it goes away. I hope to lead every day; I hope to end each day thinking to myself 'did I make a difference in anybody's life today?' Did I stop and talk to an Airman who I thought could use a 'hello' whether they were in a good mood or bad mood? And so, if I can't find time in my day to do that, I regret it at the end of each day. I do my best to get out there and genuinely thank them, because as far as I'm concerned, I have the best job in the Air Force and if I can't share that and make this tour as valuable for everybody on this base as it is for me, then I don't feel like I did my job to its fullest.
