

Wally's Java opens today

Wally's Java celebrates its grand opening at 10 a.m. today at the Col. Kenneth A. Walters Community Support Center.

Wally's takes on Walters' nickname and offers fresh brewed coffee, tea, pastries and fruit smoothies.

"Wally's Java will be a great place for Team Little Rock," said Christine Hinrichs, 19th Force Support Squadron marketing assistant. "It provides a space for Airmen, families and retirees to relax and enjoy some really good coffee and other refreshments."

"We are looking into potentially adding sandwiches to the menu and making Wally's Java available to meal-card users as well," she said.

The facility is the only eatery on base to be solely operated by the 19th FSS. The squadron has operated a number of food establishments over the years, and that experience will help Wally's Java to hit the ground running.

Hinrichs owned a coffee shop for two years, and has used her experiences in the creation of Wally's Java.

"I learned what to do and what not to do," said Hinrichs. "If we're going to do a coffee shop, then we're going to do it right."

Wally's Java sets itself apart from other competitors on base by providing free Wi-Fi, more seating and micro-roasting their coffee, which uses fresher beans to provide optimal flavor and freshness.

Wally's is open from 6:30 a.m. – 4 p.m., Monday through Friday. The coffee shop is adjacent to the main entrance of the Walters Community Support Center. The center also houses the Airman & Family Readiness Center, community activities center and the base library.

Base legal office can help with estate planning

Now that spring cleaning is over, and summer is upon us, the legal office suggests that service members, dependents and retirees review their important documents including estate planning documents.

The office provides assistance in drafting wills, living wills, durable powers of attorney, as well as general and special powers of attorney. The most important of these, of course, is your will.

The last will and testament is a legal document that is used to dispose of your property in the event of your death. It's also used to appoint people to fulfill certain duties, such as be the executor or personal representative of your estate or guardians for minor children.

Any person 18 years old or older and sound of mind can make a will. So if you already have a will -- is it up to date? The will should be reviewed and/or changed in the event of marriage or divorce, a birth or death, or a large increase or decrease in the value of your estate. Simply crossing through a name or two is not the answer, because it could invalidate the entire document.

The best course of action is to have a new will drafted and signed. For more information on wills and estate planning, call the legal office at 501-987-7886.

■ An airman first class assigned to the 19th Logistics Readiness Squadron received a reduction to the grade of airman, 14 days of extra duty and a reprimand for one violation of Article 92 – Failure to obey a lawful order, for underage drinking.

■ An airman assigned to the 19th Logistics Readiness Squadron received 14 days of extra duty and a reprimand for one violation of Article 92 – Failure to obey a lawful order, by failing

to refrain from using tobacco products in the designated locations; and one violation of Article 109 – Damage to property other than military property, by willfully damaging a table of a value of about \$398.99.

■ A first lieutenant assigned to the 41st Airlift Squadron received a forfeiture of \$500 pay per month for two months and a reprimand for one violation of Article 92 – Failure to obey a lawful general regulation, by wrongfully consuming alcohol off-base while deployed.

■ A senior airman assigned to the 41st Airlift Squadron received a suspended reduction to the grade of airman first class and a reprimand for one violation of Article 92 – Failure to obey a lawful general regulation, by wrongfully consuming alcohol off-base while deployed.

■ An airman first class assigned to the 41st Airlift Squadron received a reduction to the grade of airman, suspended forfeiture of \$867 pay per month for one month, and a reprimand for one violation Article 111 – Driving while drunk.

two months and a reprimand for one violation of Article 86 – Failure to go, by failing to go at the time prescribed to his appointed place of duty.

■ An airman first class assigned to the 714th Training Squadron received a reduction to the grade of airman, suspended reduction to the grade of airman basic, restriction to base for 30 days and a reprimand for three violations of Article 92 – Failure to obey a lawful order, for underage drinking, failing to refrain from using tobacco products in the designated locations and willfully failing to refrain from visiting permanent party, temporary duty or prior service personnel; and for one violation of Article 109 - Damage to property other than military property, by willfully damaging a table of a value of about \$398.99.

■ An airman first class assigned to the 714th Training Squadron received a reduction to the grade of airman, suspended reduction to the grade of airman basic, restriction to base for 30 days and a reprimand for three violations of Article 92 – Failure to obey a lawful order, for underage drinking, failing to refrain from using tobacco products in the designated locations and

willfully failing to refrain from visiting permanent party, temporary duty, or prior service personnel; and for one violation of Article 109 - Damage to property other than military property, by willfully damaging a table of a value of about \$398.99.

Involuntary Discharges

■ An airman basic assigned to the 19th Airlift Wing received a general discharge for failing to go to his appointed place of duty at the prescribed time on multiple occasions, failing to obey lawful orders on multiple occasions and making a false official statement.

■ An airman basic assigned to the 19th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron received a general discharge for wrongfully using controlled substances and failing to report to work on time on numerous occasions.

■ An airman first class assigned to the 19th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron received a discharge Under Other than Honorable Conditions after requesting discharge in lieu of trial by court-martial.

■ An airman first class assigned to the 19th Maintenance Squadron received an honorable discharge after being diagnosed with an anxiety disorder and a mental health disorder.

■ An airman first class assigned to the 19th Maintenance Squadron received a general

discharge for failing to go to his appointed place of duty at the prescribed time on multiple occasions, failing a dormitory inspection, and making a false official statement.

■ An airman basic assigned to the 314th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron received a general discharge for wrongfully using and possessing illegal drugs with intent to distribute.

■ A staff sergeant assigned to the 314th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron received an honorable discharge after being diagnosed with a mental health disorder.

From the 19th Airlift Wing's Office of the Staff Judge Advocate: The Uniform Code of Military Justice authorizes commanders to exercise personal discretion in evaluating each case. Commanders consider the nature of the offense, the record of the servicemember, the need for good order and discipline, the effect of punishment on the servicemember, and the servicemember's record. Every case is unique and is evaluated independently. The Manual for Courts-Martial reminds us that military law promotes justice, assists in the maintenance of good order and discipline in the armed forces, promotes the efficiency and effectiveness of the military establishment, and strengthens the national security of the United States.



Education Center continuously learning

Base education center officials are continuously studying how to best deliver the services and programs students need and want in an ever-changing landscape of learning.

The center serves a diverse community by providing educational opportunities and counseling services to active-duty personnel, Guard and reserve members, DOD Civilian employees, adult family members and military retirees, as well as off-base civilians.

Since taking over as Education Services Officer in April, Gina Thursby has been ramping up the University Center's presence through outreach programs around the base to let people know the center is there and what it offers. She is actively engaging people to find out their education needs.

"Getting an education is why some people join the military, and it changes their lives. Some of them are the first in their family to get a degree, and that is just a stepping stone for the next, and

the next and the next level -- the sky's the limit. Some people come here lost. We provide them the direction they need," she said.

One of her heartfelt goals for the colleges at the center is getting a huge response from their upcoming needs assessment survey.

"When you do needs assessments, if there is an overwhelming response for a particular program that we don't currently offer, that's what helps us bring those new programs onto the base," Thursby explained. "Without that response, without showing a need, then we really don't have the opportunity to reach out to any other colleges or to the colleges we already have to bring those additional programs here."

The key for Thursby and her staff will be turning the survey feedback into cutting-edge programs and services for students. They are taking their message of change to the Airman Leadership School, First Term Airmen Center and commander's calls, just to be visible to as many Airmen as possible.

"Master Sgt. Shawna Budde and one of our new counselors set up at the last newcomer's orientation

just to be right there visible and available to the brand new people that come on base," Thursby said. "We're partnering more with our on-base schools to educate them, as there have been a lot of changes in education over the last couple of years. I think

“The Back-to-School Brigade was extremely helpful,” said Brandi Anderson, a military spouse. “My husband was out of town last year and the program saved me a lot of time and money, especially since I have three kids.”

According to the National Retail Federation, \$669.28 is the average amount spent on back-to-school apparel, school supplies, and electronics per family.

Last year at the event on base Operation Homefront was able to serve over 250 children, representing 117 families at Little Rock Air Force

Base with over \$7,300 worth of school supplies and backpacks.

Nationally, Operation Homefront hosted 109 distribution events, distributed more than 38,000 backpacks, along with over \$5 million in school supplies. 

LRAFB supports Airborne

Members of the Air Force Reserve's 913th Airlift Group supported the Army's 1st Battalion, 507th Parachute Infantry Regiment's Basic Airborne Course July 13-17.

The mission was a Total Force effort of one C-130H and 15 Total Force crewmembers from the 327th Airlift Squadron, 50th Airlift Squadron and 913th Maintenance Squadron from Little Rock Air Force Base.

The crew, led by Maj. Claude Smith, 913th Operation Support Squadron chief of tactics, flew 20 sorties, 67 airdrop passes and dropped a total of 866 jumpers over the four-day period. In addition to supporting a class of 352 basic airborne students, eight C-130 loadmasters and two navigators from the

913th AG received Actual Personnel Airdrop re-currency training from Tech. Sgt. Nick Crawford, 327th AS evaluator loadmaster and noncommissioned officer of training.

"We had a very productive week with a fully integrated team of Reserve and active-duty crewmembers doing what we do best-- operating the C-130H," said Smith. "We can stand up a fully cohesive crew and tackle any mission the National Command Authority can throw our way."

The 1-507th, located at Fort Benning, Georgia trains Paratroopers, Jumpmasters, and Pathfinders in order to provide the Department of Defense with Soldiers, Sailors, Airmen, and Marines to conduct airborne operations anywhere DOD-wide.

LRAFB HISTORY FAST FACT

69 DAYS TO GO UNTIL LRAFB TURNS 60!



Just a few months after the first C-130s arrived at Little Rock Air Force Base, the base experienced its first fatal accident in the Hercules. A C-130E assigned to the 4442nd Combat Training Wing crashed July 30, 1970, during a training mission. The accident occurred approximately one mile west of Piggott (Clay County), killing all six crewmembers aboard the Hercules. Due to engine troubles, the crew turned from its designated training course, toward Blytheville Air Force Base, Arkansas; however, the engines soon caught fire. When the aircraft exploded, debris showered for hundreds of yards. The explosion had so much force that a portion of one wing was blown into a field, while one of the engines landed in a driveway, inches from a vehicle. No civilians were injured during the mishap. The crew on the flight was Sgt. Louis P. Belle Isle, radar scanner; Master Sgt. Charles A. Carver III, instructor flight engineer; Maj. Albert L. Wilkinson, instructor pilot; Capt. Raymond D. Rotella, student co-pilot; 2nd Lt. Lowell K. West, student co-pilot; and Navy Petty Officer 1st Class Norman C. Wagenschutz, student flight engineer.

there's some confusion and ambiguity on what they can and can't do with their marketing, so we're increasing our relationship with our local schools."

The center includes six colleges which offer associate through master's level degrees in a variety of programs to the both military and local civilian population. They are also responsible for professional military education offerings and proctoring testing for enlisted promotions.

She said there's more initiatives on the horizon such as an education fair, CLEP-A-Thons and an education tour, all with the goal of not just increasing enrollment at the schools, but helping them stay relevant.

Some improvements Thursby and her staff are working include streamlining promotion testing by making some of the steps electronic instead of paper and using e-documents to help Airmen save valuable time.

The University Center staff also helps Airmen move on once their time with the Air Force is done. Mike Jones, a newly-hired education specialist, offers the educational track for the Transition Goals, Plans, Success curriculum as part of his duties.

Transition GPS is a five-day workshop all service members attend when transitioning back to civilian life and, at the end, they have the option to go one

of three tracks: technical training, entrepreneurial and educational tracks.

Jones explained that what's been found in the past is there are many veterans who are jobless, and we want to combat that by making things available to them to help them move smoothly away from the military.

"We try to set them up for success by transitioning them; by them choosing which track they want to take. The one I teach is a two-day course called Accessing Higher Education, and what we do in this track is find the right career choice for that former Airman."

He added that although a member may have been a mechanic while serving, their goals

may be different now.

"We have ways of finding what the best career opportunities would be for them now, and we try to guide them down that path," he said. "Then we find the right school and program for them to apply to."

He also works with transitioning Airmen on funding for school and then on actually applying for college. He believes the two-day course is a great help for those wanting to pursue their higher education after the military.

"I'm really passionate about education and learning, and I don't think it should be something that ends," Jones said. "Learning is a lifelong thing; it is something we should always be pursuing."

Paddling the Arkansas Water Trails

Arkansas has an abundance of waterways for paddlers to explore. The Arkansas Water Trails project, created in 2009, is at the forefront of developing a system of mapped water trails throughout the state. A goal of the project, initiated by the Arkansas Game & Fish Commission, is to highlight the diversity of paddling terrain that can be found in the state.

Trails are added to the system as site assessments are completed and maps developed. Ten trails are currently part of the program with a route at Bayou Bartholomew in the works. Below, Kirsten Bartlow, watchable wildlife coordinator and director of the Arkansas Water Trails program, shares details on a few of the trails one can find in the program.

Bayou DeView Water Trail (Sheffield Nelson Dagmar Wildlife Management Area)

“Bayou DeView is special. It is part of the Big Woods, which is bottomland hardwood forests and an imperiled type of habitat. It’s one of the largest tracts of bottomland hardwood forests in the nation and has been designated a Wetland of International Importance. This is where the Ivory Bill Woodpecker search happened in the early 2000s. It is known for very old cypress trees that can be hundreds of years old. It’s a pretty wild trail. People need to pay attention to the signs and if you do have GPS and map and compass skills, it’s good to bring them along. Flooded timber can be a fairly easy place to get lost.

“There are a lot of different options you can do on trip lengths. You can paddle one section of trail, paddle out and then paddle back to your vehicle, or do the entire 15-mile trail with an overnight at Hickson Lake. There is now a USGS gauge to help people determine when Bayou DeView is accessible by boat.

“Generally it needs to be around 14 feet. It can be a wonderful place to paddle any time of year, but it is rain dependent and can become too low to paddle certain times of year and can become too high and the roads flood. The area is rich with wildlife including migratory songbirds and waterfowl and is popular with duck hunters. Right within the same wildlife management area is Robe Bayou (also an Arkansas Water Trail), which is a more

distinct channel and holds water year round. It is pretty as well, has great cypress trees and it is a good beginner route. And then just down the road is the Wattensaw Bayou Water Trail [also part of the Arkansas Water Trail program] and it is also a bit more of a distinct channel. We have a new camping site on the trail where visitors can do an overnight stay if they would like.

Little Maumelle Water Trail

“In general, the Little Maumelle can be paddled year round. Put in at the Pinnacle Mountain State Park boat launch and paddle down the river as far as you like and then paddle back up to the launch. Heavy rain and water flow occasionally make it hard to get back up—check in with park staff. Boat launches are also available at Two Rivers Park or at the River Mountain Park Access.

“The trail is nice because it is so near an urban area, but you can quickly get out and be in nature. It’s pretty amazing. It’s a wonderful area for watching wildlife and offers nice fishing opportunities. In the upper portions of the river up by the state park you can get out in some of those riffles and wade around and cool off.

“Common wildlife seen and heard along the trail are ospreys, red-shouldered hawks, barred owls, all kinds of waterfowl, beavers, deer, raccoons, possums, and water snakes. You can do parts of the Arkansas River Trail or hike Pinnacle Mountain and combine that with a float. It’s pretty neat to have this water trail right here by the city center.

Grassy Lake Water Trail

“This route is in the Bell Slough Wildlife Management Area. From Little Rock, you can be out there and on the water trail in 30 minutes. What’s really unusual about this trail is that it’s a loop. It goes through flooded timber and then wider pools and then back in cypress and tupelo trees.

“The wildlife viewing along this trail is excellent. There is a heron rookery and you get a lot of migratory songbirds that come through in the spring and fall. They really like that area. There are beaver lodges, frogs and toads and migrating waterfowl. This trail is within a green tree reservoir, which means we hold water on it for the winter months for waterfowl. And then we lift the gates and start letting the water back out in the spring so the trees don’t die.

“Some years we have been able to paddle it in July into the first of August but again paddling here is rain dependent. Spring is a good time to paddle there and winter too, you just need to work around duck hunters. If you want to hike, nearby there is a nature trail [Kenny Vernon Bell Nature Trail] that is within this same wildlife management area.

Felsenthal National Wildlife Refuge Water Trails

“These are the newest trails added to the program. We partnered with the Felsenthal National Wildlife Refuge and the Friends of Felsenthal. Felsenthal NWR lies within the Mississippi Flyway—this highway in the sky is used by a vast number of migrating waterfowl, songbirds, birds of prey and shorebirds.

“These water trails within the refuge offer a tremendous way to view all sorts of wildlife in their watery world. Both black bears and alligators call the area home. There are currently two loop trails and a linear trail and certain times of year, paddlers can enjoy blooming water lilies and water lotus. Be sure to check out the refuge’s visitor center and nature trails.


