

# Base C-130J's flex muscle at exercise

The 41st, 48th and 61st Airlift Squadrons delivered Herculean muscle to Operation Dragon Spear Aug. 6.

Dragon Spear was one of the most complex joint-training exercises in more than a decade. The Joint Force Exercise at the U.S. Army's National Training Center on Fort Irwin, Calif., included more than 1,500 fighting forces from XVIII Airborne Corps; 82nd Airborne Division; 75th Ranger Regiment; 3rd Battalion, 10th Special Forces Group (Airborne); and the U.S. Air Force.

Joint Forcible Entry exercises train the Global Response Force and demonstrate their readiness to deploy and fight globally within hours as a Joint force. Joint Force Exercise Dragon Spear focused upon the interoperability, interdependence and integration of Conventional and Special Operations Forces in a complex dynamic combat scenario

March Air Reserve Base was used as a staging ground for aircraft, paratroopers and heavy equipment. C-130's and C-17's were used to carry and drop more than 600 paratroopers from the Army's 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 82nd Airborne Division. The cargo planes also delivered more than 30 Army assets such as militarized all-terrain vehicles, howitzers and M1126 Stryker combat vehicles.

Not only was the mission of the C-130's to deliver equipment and personnel during the exercise, but also to sustain the Army after their initial needs were met, such as re-supply, follow-on forces and to medevac injured personnel.

"This was new territory," said Lt. Col. Thomas Lankford, 41st Airlift Squadron commander. "The Army has never done an airborne assault like that there before and we have never executed out of that location before."

The new environment and the opportunity for

Team Little Rock to work with sister services provided a unique learning experience for the Airmen.

"This exercise was a great experience for the Airmen because it was different," said Lankford. "It was phenomenal training because it got everyone out of their comfort zones, and we don't always get the opportunity to train with the Army and their equipment."

Lankford went on to explain that day-to-day training revolves around airdrops. "We've been deployed back-to-back and the squadron has been very combat-focused in the last year, so what we have to do is get back to the basics- get back to the airdrop missions. It's a core competency and something the Army expects us to be good at," he said.

With most exercises there are areas of improvement identified and lessons learned,

# Nurse assistant training offered for 15 spouses

The Air Force Aid Society Spouse Employment Training Program has granted the Little Rock Air Force Base Airman & Family Readiness Center additional funding to provide 15 fully paid slots to attend the Arkansas Nursing Assistant Academy.

All applications are due by Tuesday, Aug. 18, at 4:30 p.m. All applicants will be notified of selection or non-selection.

The 13-day long nursing assistant course begins on Aug. 26, 2015 and includes 90 hours of instruction. Classes will be held at 425 North University Avenue in Little Rock.

In early 2015, the A&FRC had ten slots to the academy that filled up completely. All of the students graduated, so the Air Force Aid Society allotted more slots specifically for spouses at Little Rock AFB.

"This is a great opportunity for spouses," said Michael Rudisill, the 19th Force Support Squadron A&FRC employment coordinator. "There are approximately 23 hospitals and clinics within 75 miles of the base."

All active-duty Air Force spouses are eligible to apply for the grant. Spouses of Arkansas Air National Guard or Reserve Airmen are also eligible if the Airmen are currently on Title 10 orders for more than 15 days.

The grant covers the cost of instruction, State of Arkansas Certification, processing fees, scrubs and a gait belt. The Arkansas Nursing Assistant Academy is approved by the Arkansas State Board of Private Career Education to operate a certified nursing assistant school.

If you are eligible and wish to enter, pick up an application from the A&FRC inside the Walters Community Support Center on Canon Drive. They are open Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

# Ethics rules govern gift card, cash

In our previous articles on gifts from outside sources, we have discussed the general rules, common exclusions (things that don't legally count as a "gift"), common exceptions (gifts that you can legally accept under limited circumstances), and what to do with a gift when none of those apply.

This time we will talk about the restriction on cash gifts from outside sources. The Standards of Conduct (5 C.F.R. § 2635.204(a)) allows acceptance of gifts from prohibited sources or gifts given based on the official position of the employee valued at \$20 or less, with no more than \$50 in total gifts from any single source per year. However, that same section prohibits gifts of

cash altogether, even if \$20 or less.

That raises a big question though: what is meant by "cash"? Does it include gift cards? The answer depends on the type of gift card. Store gift cards may be accepted under the \$20/\$50 exception. To count as a store gift card, the card must only be usable with a single merchant or affiliated group of merchants. Furthermore, the gift card cannot allow the holder to withdraw cash from an ATM. Finally, it doesn't matter how many items the store has, so long as you're limited to spending your money there.

However, general-use pre-paid cards count as cash and cannot be accepted under the \$20/\$50 exception, regardless of their value. If you can spend the money

anywhere that accepts that kind of prepaid card (e.g., Visa MasterCard, or American Express), the card is treated as cash. For a more in-depth discussion of these rules, please read Office of Government Ethics Legal Advisory LA-15-04.

As a reminder: if you dispose of an improper gift in accordance with the rules, either on your own initiative or on the advice of your ethics counselor, 5 C.F.R. § 205(c) states that you won't be found to have improperly accepted an unsolicited gift from an outside source.







# **Keeping planes mission-ready**

# Keep eye on spotting, backing safety

Statistics show that nearly a quarter of all deaths involving vehicles at work happen when the vehicle is reversing ... usually because the driver or pedestrian did not pay attention.

The role of a spotter is to minimize and eliminate potential backing and equipment incidents by communicating with a driver the hazards present in their operating environment.

The purpose of a spotter is to expand the driver's sense for right, left, front, and rear space cushions

## **Spotter Situations**

- When backing any vehicle;
- Where negotiating forward or backward turns with tight side clearances;
- Where overhead clearances are low or uncertain;
- When the driver's view is obstructed:
- When objects in the area are within equipment's blind spots; and
  - Visibility is limited or impaired.

## A blind spot is:

- Any area a driver of a vehicle or piece of equipment is not looking or cannot see;
- Any area a spotter is not looking or cannot see; and
- Created by obstructions, lighting conditions, weather conditions and vehicle design.
- Blind spots are determined for equipment by walking out prior to use, if the driver can't see your feet you are in the blind spot.
- Driver to spotter communication is critical:
- It allows driver to determine spotter capability;
- It ensures both parties understand the signals that will be used;
- Discussion should take place pre-task to identify hazards;
- At night, use flashlights/wands to help the driver see you;
- In congested or tight areas, use more than one spotter if necessary; and
- Stop the backing process and regroup if required.

# LRAFB HISTORY FAST FACT

# 55 DAYS TO GO UNTIL LRAFB TURNS 60!

On August 10, 1964, the first B-58 Hustler arrived at Little Rock AFB, from Carswell Air Force Base, Texas. Local leadership, including Governor Orval Faubus, welcomed the first B-58 at 10 a.m. that morning when a pilot, assigned to the 43rd Bombardment Wing, landed the "Pulaski Hustler." The B-58 was capable of sustained Mach 2 supersonic flight and could reach altitudes above 60,000 feet. During the remainder of August 1964. the entire fleet of Hustlers relocated to Central Arkansas. The 43rd BW was the first wing equipped with the Hustler and operated the aircraft for 10 years. From 1960 to 1970, crews set many speed and distance records receiving the Mackay Trophy, **Thompson Trophy and Bendix Trophy** for their achievements. In 1970, the US Air Force ended the B-58 mission, retiring Little Rock's the final B-58s.









