# Simple changes can help lead to healthier lifestyle

JOINT BASE SAN ANTONIO-LACKLAND, Texas -- Living a healthy lifestyle is not always an easy step to take. However, a few simple changes in your daily routine can help improve overall health might prevent future heart problems.

While doctors and nutritional experts may be able to help reduce heart problems, they cannot cure them.

"The heart is responsible for circulating the blood throughout the body, providing oxygen and nutrients to all the other organs," said Lt. Col. (Dr.) Gilberto Patino, cardiology consultant for the Air Force Medical Service and the 959th Medical Operations Squadron chief of cardiology. "Maintaining a healthy heart increases the chances for a long and active life."

According to Patino, a poorly functioning heart can result in many symptoms that can limit a person's ability to participate in physical activities. Having an unhealthy heart can also increase a person's risk of dying.

One step toward preventing any chance of heart hazards is to identify and control any risk factors. It is important to know your risk factors for developing heart disease, Patino said.

"Some risk factors such as age, gender, and family history cannot be modified, but many other risk factors such as high cholesterol, high blood pressure, being overweight, physical inactivity, smoking, and poor diet can be aggressively managed and significantly reduce your risk for heart disease," he explained.

Regular exercise is also very important, according to the American Heart Association.

It recommends that adults participate in at least 30 minutes of moderate to intense aerobic activity at least five days per week for a total of 150 minutes per week. The association also estimates that less than 50 percent of American adults reach this goal. Regular exercise strengthens the heart, lowers blood pressure and cholesterol, and promotes maintaining a healthy weight.



People should also strive to maintain a healthy diet, Patino advised. When making diet changes, consider making a few small changes at a time as this will increase the chances of maintaining the changes overtime.

"Basic diet recommendations include avoiding excessive calories and limiting salt intake," Patino said. "Healthy food choices include fresh fruits and vegetables, whole grains, low-fat dairy products, skinless poultry and fish, nuts and legumes, and non-tropical vegetable oils."

People with a history of cardiovascular disease should be very diligent about controlling risk factors that can lead to disease progression. They should adopt healthy lifestyle changes to include regular exercise and a heart healthy diet. It is also important to follow-up regularly with your health care provider and comply with any medical therapy prescribed, he added.

## HISTORY FACT

Personnel assigned to the 308th Missile Maintenance Squadron removed the last Titan II missile Feb. 23, 1987, from the site located one mile northwest of Judsonia (White County). The deactivation of this intercontinental ballistic missile was the end of the Titan II era for Strategic Air Command. The 17 ICBMs removed from sites around Arkansas were shipped to Norton Air Force Base, California, for storage before moving to Vandenberg AFB to launch satellites into orbit. In the months after removal, the ICBM sites were deactivated by purging the underground plumbing, shutting down environmental systems and dismantling the site. The nose cone from the Judsonia Titan II now resides in Heritage Park.


# Round two of time in grade, service points phase out

JOINT BASE SAN ANTONIO-RANDOLPH, Texas – Changes announced to the Weighted Airman Promotion System model in July 2014 included a reduction in the points associated with time in service and time in grade to place further emphasis on performance.

The multipliers for calculating total time-in-grade and time-in-service points will be reduced again by another one third for the 2016 promotion cycle, impacting the 16E5, 16E6, 16E7, 16E9, and 17E8 promotion cycles.

The Air Force will again conduct analysis on the impact of this change and determine if future reductions will continue in calendar year 2017, which would completely eliminate TIG and TIS weighted points used in the calculation of composite promotion scores under the Weighted Airman Promotion System.

Time in grade will be reduced from a maximum of 40 points to a maximum of 20



Time in Service and Time in Grade points will be reduced again by one-third for the 2016 promotion cycle.

points. Airmen will be awarded 0.16667 of a point for each month up to 10 years as of the first day of the last month of the promotion cycle.

# Zika virus questions and answers

SCOTT AIR FORCE BASE, Ill. — With Mobility Airmen working around the globe, the Air Mobility Command Surgeon General has issued answers to common Zika-related questions. For more information about the Zika virus please visit the CDC's website <http://www.cdc.gov/zika/>.

**Q: What is the Zika virus?**

A: The Zika virus is part of the Flavivirus family which includes other viruses like West Nile, dengue, encephalitis, chikungunya, and yellow fever. This virus has been endemic in Africa and Southeast Asia and the Pacific Islands for years, but this is the first time it's been confirmed in the western hemisphere.

It is spread by a mosquito, more commonly by the aedes aegypti and the aedes albopictus mosquito breeds. The most important thing to remember about those mosquitos is they are aggressive day time biters.

**Q: How is Zika contracted?**

A. The only way to contract the Zika virus is to travel to an area where it is endemic or where it's being transmitted right now. Currently, the Zika virus is not being transmitted within the United States. There have been people who have returned to the U.S. who have contracted the virus in South America, but they did not catch it here.

**Q: What can people do to reduce the risk of contracting Zika?**

A: You prevent contracting the Zika virus the same way you prevent mosquito bites. Deployers need to make sure they treat their uniforms and clothing with permethrin. Wear long sleeves and long pants during the day, and make sure you are wearing DEET mosquito repellent.

**Q: Is insect repellent safe for**

**pregnant women and small children?**

A: Mosquito repellent is safe for children two months old and above as well as pregnant women as long as it is FDA approved.

**Q: If bitten by a mosquito how do you recognize the symptoms?**

A: Unfortunately the symptoms of the Zika virus are similar to many of the other viruses in the Flavivirus family. Symptoms that should concern you are headaches, muscle aches, joint pain, conjunctivitis, and rashes. If you end up with two or more of those symptoms and have been in an area where the Zika virus exists, you should see your doctor. Interestingly, 80 percent of people who contract the Zika virus never show any symptoms at all.

**Q: Does the Zika virus kill?**

A: Most people will contract the virus and never know it. Very few people will be hospitalized and almost no one dies from it.

**Q: Is there a vaccine for Zika?**

A: Currently there is no vaccine for Zika. However, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention is discussing working on one.

**Q: What is the treatment for Zika?**

A: Treatment includes rest, fluids, and over the counter medications for fever and muscle aches.

**Q: Can it be transmitted to others? Can it be transmitted via bodily fluids?**

A: Right now we do not have the answer to that. There is a case study about a man who in 2008 contracted the virus in Senegal [Africa], he went home and his wife then contracted the virus. She had not been traveling to any places where the virus was prevalent, so they are concerned he spread that to her, possibly through sexual transmission. There have also been animal studies that show that it may be sexually transmitted. Right now that is an unproven hypothesis and there are no cases in our hemisphere that we know of where Zika has been transmitted from one human to another.

**Q: If I am pregnant and catch the virus, how does the virus affect the fetus?**

A: Pregnant women who contract the virus do not become any sicker than women who are not pregnant. However, specifically in Brazil, they are concerned they are seeing a link between babies who are born to women who have contracted the Zika virus and microcephaly. Microcephaly is condition where the brain doesn't develop properly in the uterus and the baby's head is smaller than normal when born.

**Q: Should pregnant women avoid**

**travel to a country with Zika?**

A: Currently the CDC is recommending that women who are pregnant or are planning on becoming pregnant who don't need to travel to Central and South America don't do it. If travel to areas where Zika is prevalent is unavoidable or if a women is already there and becomes pregnant and starts seeing symptoms, then she should see her physician who is providing her maternity care. The current recommendations are that she has an ultrasound to examine the baby and see if there are any problems.

**Q: What are your recommendations for deployers in Central and South America?**

A: If travelers are going overseas, they should contact their base Public Health office for information on medical threats and prevention methods to ensure they remain healthy during the trip. We advise our deployers on mosquito precautions because there are mosquito borne diseases throughout the U.S. Southern Command's area of responsibility. Specifically we worry about dengue, chikungunya, and yellow fever. So we ask our deployers to pretreat their uniforms and deploy them with a good supply of DEET. If they should show any symptoms of any of the mosquito borne viruses [are headaches, muscle aches, joint pain, conjunctivitis, and rashes] they should go see their provider and discuss whether or not they should be tested for the Zika virus.

If you think you have contracted the Zika virus or any other mosquito borne viruses, you should see your medical provider.



# AF implements new DOD-wide changes to maternity leave

WASHINGTON (AFNS) — Beginning Feb. 5, active-duty female Airmen will receive up to 12 continuous, non-transferable weeks of fully paid maternity leave in accordance with Defense Department-wide changes to the policy outlined in Defense Secretary Ash Carter's Force of the Future announcement Jan. 28.

This new policy applies to all Airmen in the active-duty component, and those Reserve component service members on orders to active service for a continuous period of at least 12 months.

"This change, like many others we've made, will help ensure our high-performing female Airmen can continue to serve both their families and the Air Force," said Secretary of the Air Force Deborah Lee James. "In this case, these Airmen can concentrate on their family without the undue stress or pressure associated with returning to their job on a short timeline. This change in policy carefully balances mission effectiveness with our ongoing efforts to retain talent."

Airmen who are currently on maternity leave will

automatically be granted a 42-day extension. Those Airmen currently on approved ordinary leave in conjunction with their maternity leave are authorized to convert their regular leave to non-chargeable maternity leave, not to exceed a total of 12 weeks.

Commanders may not disapprove maternity leave, which begins immediately following a birth event or release from hospitalization following a birth event for a continuous 12-week period. This policy in no way restricts unit commanders or medical professionals from granting convalescent leave in excess of 12 weeks if a medical authority deems that leave is warranted.

A birth event refers to any birth of a child or children to a female service member wherein the child or children are retained by the mother. Multiple children resulting from a single pregnancy will be treated as a single event so long as the multiple births occur within the same 72-hour period.

The new policy also protects Airmen from any disadvantages in their career, including but not limited to assignments, performance appraisals or selection for profession-

al military education, as a result of maternity leave taken.

"While some initiatives are force-wide, others are more targeted, but all have the same objective," said Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. Mark A. Welsh III. "Where we can, we will ease the burden on our Airmen by not forcing a decision between either having a family or career. We believe our Airmen should be able to have both."

In addition, DOD is requesting legislative changes to paternity leave. "We will seek authorities to increase paid paternity leave for new fathers from 10 to 14 days, which they can use in addition to annual leave," Carter said.

Airmen with questions can contact their chain of command or local force support squadron for more details on eligibility, applicability and any other specifics related to the new benefit as the Air Force begins incorporating the changes into appropriate regulations and guidance.

The time in service calculation for promotion to the grades of staff, technical and master sergeant will be reduced from a maximum of 26 points to a maximum of 13 points. Airmen will be awarded 0.05416667 of a point for each month of Total Active Federal Military Service (TAFMS), up to 20 years, as of the last day of the last month of the promotion cycle.

The time in service calculation for promotion to the grades of senior and chief master sergeant will be reduced from a maximum of 16 points to a maximum of 8 points. Senior NCOs will be awarded 0.03333333 of a point for each month of TAFMS up to 25 years computed as of the last day of the last month of the promotion cycle. All TIG/TIS computations are cut-off after the second decimal place.

## 2015 tax requirements

Effective for tax year 2015 is another form in MyPay under Taxes, the IRS Form 1095. The Affordable Care Act signed into law March 23, 2010, requires all U.S. citizens and legal residents to obtain and maintain a minimum standard of health care insurance. For 2015, taxpayers are required to prove that they have obtained the minimum essential coverage, TRICARE qualifies for this coverage.

Proof of coverage is the Department of Treasury Internal Revenue Service Form 1095: Employer Provided Health Insurance Offer and Coverage. Active duty, Air National Guard, Air Force Reserve, retiree and civilians will need to have the IRS Form 1095 to file their 2015 taxes.




