## NATIONAL SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS PREVENTION MONTH

## Be a leader to prevent, end sexual assault

President of the United States

At our country's core is a basic belief in the inherent dignity of every person. Too many women and men of all ages suffer the outrage that is sexual assault, and too often, this crime is not condemned as loudly as it should be.

Together, we must stand up and speak out to change the culture that questions the actions of victims, rather than those of their attackers. As their relatives, friends, neighbors, and fellow Americans, it's on us to support victims and survivors by providing them with the care they need, bringing perpetrators to justice, and ensuring our institutions are held responsible and do not look the other way. This month, we reaffirm our commitment to shift the attitudes that allow sexual assault to go unanswered and unpunished, and we redouble our efforts to prevent this human rights violation from happening in the first place.

Preventing sexual assault begins with everyone getting involved in promoting healthy relationships and encouraging respect for the equality of others.

For decades, Vice President Joe Biden has brought unmatched passion to this cause, working to pass the Violence Against Women Act in the Senate more than two decades ago, and continuing to fight today to transform the way we think and talk about sexual assault. In 2014, we launched the "It's On Us" campaign — an initiative that has worked with over 300 college campuses and engaged hundreds of thousands of people around our country who have taken a pledge to stand up and speak out to express moral outrage for this intolerable crime. We launched the White House Task Force to Protect Students from Sexual Assault that year as well, which continues to offer recommendations for how we can all contribute to a society that adequately prevents and responds to sexual assault.

My Administration is taking action to eliminate sexual assault in every corner of our country. This year, we announced new grants available for the National Sexual Assault Kit Initia-

tive, a nationwide, community-based effort to end the backlog of untested rape kits — instrumental tools used to collect evidence, prosecute perpetrators, and bring closure to victims in the aftermath of an assault. These funds are supporting efforts to ensure victims are notified of the testing, connected to support services, and given the option of participating in the criminal justice process. Additionally, we have offered new tools and resources to help States and communities take advantage of the best available measures to prevent sexual violence.

The Department of Justice issued new guidance for law enforcement on identifying and preventing gender bias in response to sexual assault and domestic violence. And I have directed military leadership to prioritize this issue and equip our men and women in uniform with the knowledge and tools necessary to combat sexual violence. From our military to our schools, and in law enforcement agencies in communities across America, we will keep working to address sexual violence and root it out wherever it exists.

Anyone can be a leader in the fight to prevent and end sexual assault. As employers, educators, parents, and friends, all Americans have an obligation to uphold the basic principle that every individual should be free from violence and fear. During National Sexual Assault Awareness and Prevention Month, we recommit to embracing each of our individual responsibilities to keep our communities safe from crime and to stand with survivors and victims of sexual assault.

I urge all Americans to support survivors of sexual assault and work together to prevent these crimes in their communities.

Little Rock Air Force Base experienced an EF-2 tornado April 25, 2011. The cyclone carved a five-mile path from North Pulaski High School, straight through the base housing area and across the flightline. The storm damaged and destroyed homes, C-130s and other base facilities but injured only four people, none of them seriously. The strength of the 56-year relationship between the base and the community was demonstrated as local mayors and civic leaders arrived within 30 minutes to offer their support. The storm did not delay operations. Even with power still out in many facilities, planes and Airmen deployed to support the war in Iraq less than three days after the tornado struck.

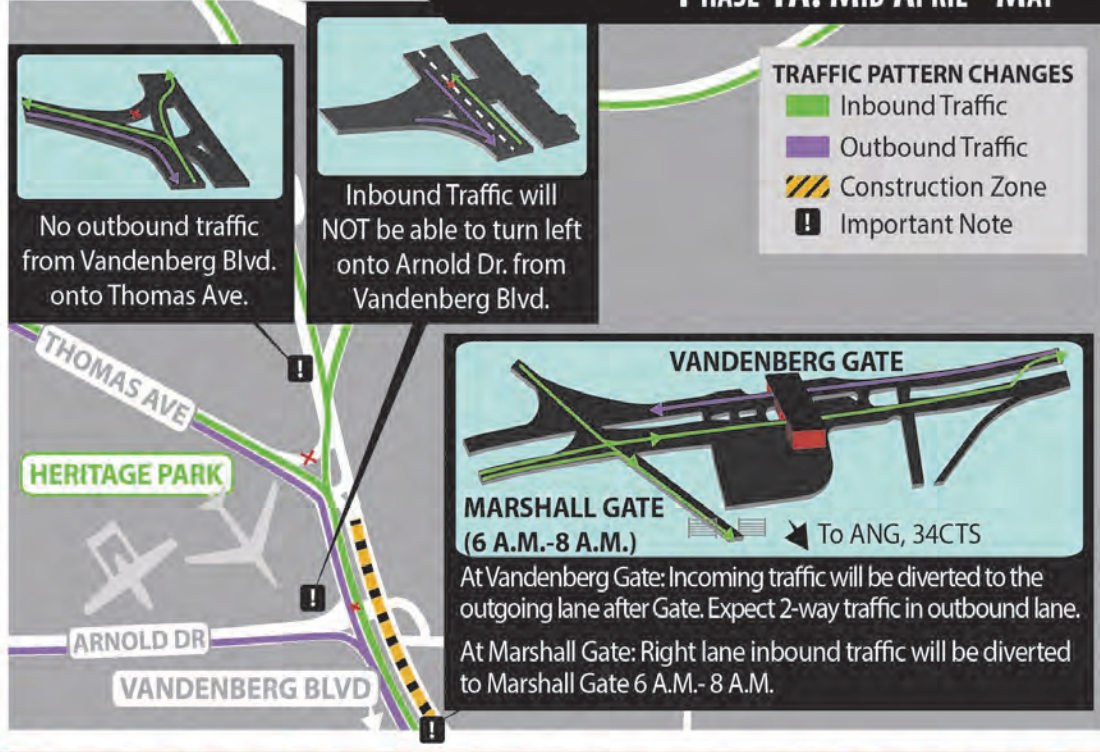

# UPCOMING TRAFFIC CHANGES: HOW YOUR COMMUTE MAY BE AFFECTED

## PHASE 1A: MID APRIL - MAY



### Vandenberg Blvd Construction Considerations:

- ▶ Inbound lanes of Vandenberg Blvd will be repaved beginning mid-April
- ▶ Vandenberg Blvd will be reduced to single-lane, two-way traffic during construction
- ▶ 25 mph is the speed limit throughout work zone
- ▶ Be aware of pedestrians due to increased traffic
- ▶ Preparation work will involve periodic single-lane closures over next two weeks
- ▶ Initial construction will address utilities and installation of a crossover lane and silt fencing
- ▶ To minimize congestion during the morning commute, drivers approaching the Vandenberg Gate in the right-hand lane will be forced to utilize the Marshall Gate between 6:00 A.M. and 8:00 A.M. Monday-Friday
- ▶ The Marshall Gate will be open to outbound traffic between 3:00 P.M. and 5:00 P.M. Monday-Friday

# Program helps 314th maintainers set PACE

Members of the 314th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron have hit the ground running, embracing the Profession of Arms Center of Excellence program to achieve a higher level of expertise.

In March 2015, U.S. Air Force Gen. Mark Welsh, Chief of Staff of the Air Force, officially activated and assigned the PACE program to Air Education and Training Command.

PACE helps Airmen embody professional proficiency and offers them helpful tools to better prepare fellow Airmen for the future. It's a place where Airmen can re-engage with Air Force heritage and internalize the core values. The program is an option for Air Force members to use in order to become the best possible leader.

"This squadron-level professional development effort utilizes small-group settings which our Airmen have told us are more effective," said U.S. Air Force Lt. Col. Darren L. Brumfield, 314th AMXS commander. "Each session focuses on a specific professional characteristic, but also encourages the Airmen to open up about any areas within the unit that require improvement."

The eight primary topics of PACE are commitment, core values, excellence, loyalty, mutual respect, oath, selflessness and trust.

The 314th AMXS has completed eight sessions so

far. In the most recent session, approximately 15 people attended—they watched a video first and then had a guided discussion centered on the specific topic of excellence.



# Three receive Art. 15 punishments

Three members of Little Rock Air Force Base were punished in January and February under Article 15 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice.

■ An airman first class assigned to the 19th Logistics Readiness Squadron received a suspended reduction to airman and a reprimand for one violation of Article 108 – Destruction of Government Property.

■ A senior airman assigned to the 19th Maintenance Squadron received a reduction to airman first class and a reprimand for one violation of Article 86 – Failure to Go, and one violation of Article 107 – False Official Statement.

■ A captain assigned to the 50th Airlift Squadron received a forfeiture of \$2,999 pay per month for two months and a reprimand for three violations of Article 134 – Adultery; Pandering and Prostitution; and Impersonating a Commissioned Officer.

## INVOLUNTARY DISCHARGES

■ A senior airman assigned to the 19th Maintenance Squadron received a general discharge for being arrested for being in physical control of his vehicle while he was impaired by alcohol; leaving two minor children unattended in his vehicle; dereliction in the performance of his duties; being pulled over for not wearing his seat belt; disobeying a lawful order; failing to report to work on time; and pleading guilty in civilian court to speeding.

■ An airman first class assigned to the 19th Logistics Readiness Squadron received a general discharge for wrongful use of a prescription medication; receiving a speeding ticket on base; failing a dorm inspection; making a false official statement; arriving late to work; and sleeping on the job.

■ An airman basic assigned to the 314th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron received an under other than honorable conditions discharge for wrongful use of a controlled substance; making a false official statement; failing to obey an order or regulation; and receiving a speeding ticket on base.

# Through a survivor's eyes

"Why don't you like sleepovers anymore?" asked a curious girl in my pre-teen dance class.

This was a question I was asked frequently, so I gave the response most people wanted to hear, that I don't like being away from home.

When I was 16, I offended people when I quickly jerked away and almost bolted out of rooms when they tried to hug me. My friends and relatives would give a similar response to explain my reaction, saying I was not a touchy-feely person. They were all guessing, but none of them knew the real reason.

How could they when I hid it from even myself?

The terrible reality is I had been sexually assaulted by a friend while attending a sleepover as a young girl. As a teenager, I was sexually assaulted multiple times in addition to continuous sexual harassment well into my mid-teens.

Despite the pain and confusion I was experiencing, I continued accepting the excuses made for me. I continued to feel the way I was expected to.

I didn't have the resources or knowledge to face the truth.

As time went on and I traveled away from home for the first time, I discovered I was not homesick as expected. Although I didn't like being touched, I could handle it just fine. This made me question my previous actions and something about it didn't sit right with me. The answers and default feelings became inadequate explanations.

Discovering the world after years of being carefully screened from reality by my family made me seek out even more new experiences. This led me to enlisting in the Air Force.

I found what I was looking for at U.S. Air

Force Basic Military Training while attending my first Sexual Assault Prevention and Response briefing. It was then I started to accept and truly understand what happened to me when I was younger.

The SAPR presenter was telling the typical scenario: a female goes alone to a place that is potentially dangerous and gets sexually abused or assaulted in some shape or form.

I related to this scenario. I recognized the situation and felt suffocated with my emotions as the realization of what I had been denying dawned on me.

I can still remember the calculated expression on the briefer's face as he asked, "Who thinks it was the fault of the girl?"

About half the people in the room – myself included – raised their hands.

"Why?" he asked the trainee next to me. "Because she knew it was dangerous, but she went anyway," he replied. "She did it to herself."

I agreed with this. Maybe if I had predicted my situation better, been smarter, been older, done any number of things differently, I could have prevented it.

I thought it was my fault.

Someone else raised their hand and said, "It wasn't her fault. Yes, she went but she didn't assault herself. The reason for it happening was the person making the decision to do it."

The thought hadn't even occurred to me. I felt relief for a moment before that old voice

telling me this was wrong demanded attention.

After speaking with various victim advocates and the Sexual Assault and Response Coordinator on base, I learned people occasionally join the Air Force for the care it provides to survivors of sexual assault.

The message that sexual assault is not tolerated was repeated again and again. Through this I learned of the availability of such resources as the chaplain, counselors and medical examiners.

By the time I reached the technical school for my profession, I had enough knowledge of the subject to know how and where to seek help. Now the problem was whether or not I wanted it. I still wasn't sure how I felt about it.

I was confused because what I had been taught by society was in direct conflict with the values and principles of the service I had committed my life to.

My journey in the Air Force was progressing as I kept learning more about myself in ways I hadn't imagined. I started to realize I wasn't to blame for what happened.

It led me to reaching out to an instructor and, without giving many details, ask for guidance. One of the things she offered was to help me make an appointment to speak to a chaplain.

The instructor wasn't certain what was wrong, but she was concerned enough to take me seriously. I had held it in for so long that the prospect of getting help was intriguing but it took me almost a month to take her up on it.

When I finally visited the chaplain he asked me if anything was wrong, and I told him I wasn't really sure. I had been living in denial for so long I didn't know if I was ready to accept the truth.

The conversation was long and personal, but one thing in particular stood out to me: I needed to stop accepting everyone else's excuses and start feeling for myself. I realized I don't owe anyone an explanation for why I feel the way I do about certain situations.

Most of the time, I am able to carry myself in a professional manner that only the most trained eye can see past. Most days I don't blame myself for the assault.

For me, the greatest help is deciding to accept how I feel every day, and not how others expect me to feel; I've learned to acknowledge what happened and I no longer hide from my past.

The SARC told me society places a stigma on those who struggle with uncomfortable realities, as if it is something to be embarrassed about.

Despite this stigma, my journey in the Air Force has taught me that I am not alone.

We, the survivors, are often silent. Sometimes it's necessary in the professional world in order to prevent preconceived notions about who we are and who we are not. This is okay, so long as you don't silence your inner voice or thoughts.

Everyone heals and reacts differently to sexual assault. Every experience is unique.

Regardless, the Air Force has a zero tolerance policy for sexual assault, and has capable personnel ready and willing to assist with the recovery process.

The amount of care and support the Air Force provides to survivors of sexual assault is immense. While I did not join in order to heal from my assault, I was able to meet this head on for once and find a way to finally recover.

Although April is sexual assault awareness month, the Air Force has help available any month at any time. For more information about recovery, or to seek help, call (501) 987-2685. More than 100 people attended the opening April 1 ceremony, where current 50th AS commander, U.S. Air Force Lt. Col. James C. O'Brien III, and the 53rd commander of the squadron, U.S. Air Force Maj. Gen. Rowayne A. Schatz Jr., Air Mobility Command vice commander, addressed the crowd.

"We are honored to have so many former Red Devils here today to help celebrate the 50th Airlift Squadron's rich heritage and long list of accomplishments," said O'Brien. "It is truly incredible and inspiring to look back at the 74 years of service this squadron has given to our nation. Activated June 15, 1942 as the 50th Troop Carrier Squadron, the unit was located at Drew Field, Fla. Less than a year later in May 1943, the squadron flew their C-47 Skytrains into combat during World War II. They

also participated in the Allied Invasion of the Europe June 6, 1944, commonly referred to as D-Day.

Its foundation built on more than 70 years of tradition, the "Fighting Five-o" has seen action in every major campaign since World War II.

Given the moniker "The Red Devils," the unit received its third Presidential Unit Citation for gallantry and heroism while performing resupply missions for U.S. Army and Marine Corps units in the vicinity of the Chosin Reservoir in Korea.

Aircrews from the Five-o frequently also flew combat support missions in Southeast Asia from 1966 through 1973. The squadron has conducted numerous humanitarian airlift missions and accomplished multiple deployments in support of Operations Iraqi Freedom, Enduring Freedom, New Dawn and Resolute Support.

"The 50th has a great history and all of you played a part," Schatz said as he addressed the crowd of attendees. "It's been a great ride for those of you who've worn this patch, once a Red Devil, always a Red Devil."

A golf tournament was held April 2 followed with a family barbecue at the base lake and included a bounce house for the children and canoes for the families to navigate the lake on.

The reunion served as an opportunity for 50th AS veterans to reconnect with each other and meet those who currently serve as Red Devils.

# DOD announces pilot-tutoring program for service members

PENSACOLA, Fla. (AFNS) – Officials with the Defense Department Voluntary Education Program and the Defense Activity for Non-Traditional Education Support (DANTES) announced the launch of a pilot tutoring program that will provide service members with tutoring support at no cost, anytime, anywhere.

“If a service member is struggling with a college course or simply needs help with a homework assignment, this DOD-funded tool offers a place to go to get answers,” said Jeff Allen, the DANTES director.

The program provides around-the-clock, online tutoring services for active-duty service members, Coast Guard members and full/part time National Guard and Reserve component members. Some family members are also eligible to use the tutoring services.

The program is available online at [www.tutor.com/military](http://www.tutor.com/military), and provides one-on-one tutoring with educators in more than 40 college subjects, including algebra, statistics, physiology and more. The tutors

provide help with all types of homework assignments and test preparation. Tutors and students communicate in a secure online classroom using text chat and by drawing on an interactive whiteboard. There are no webcams or telephones used and no personal information is shared between the tutor and student.

Students can access the online service using any internet-enabled device, including smart phones and tablets. If it’s just a quick question, tutors are available on demand, or students can schedule future tutoring sessions or upload papers for offline review.

“The Defense Department wants service members to be successful in pursuing professional development,” Allen said. “DOD currently maintains a variety of education resources to help members pursue their education. Tutoring services are being piloted to further explore the addition of this type of tool as another way to help service members succeed in their military careers.”

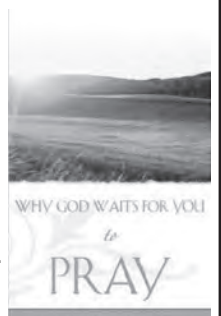
