New policy prohibits GPS tracking in deployed settings

WASHINGTON – Deployed service members may have to ditch their fitness trackers in response to a new memo from Deputy Defense Secretary Patrick M. Shanahan prohibiting the use of GPS functions in deployed locations.

This includes physical fitness aids, applications in phones that track locations, and other devices and apps that pinpoint and track the location of individuals.

"Effective immediately, Defense Department personnel are prohibited from using geolocation features and functionality on government and nongovernment-issued devices, applications and services while in locations designated as operational areas," Pentagon spokesman Army Col. Robert Manning III told Pentagon reporters.

Deployed personnel are in "operational areas," and commanders will make a determination on other areas where this policy may apply.

The market for these devices has exploded over the past few years, with many service members incorporating them into their workout routines. They use the devices and applications to track their pace, running routes, calories burned and more. These devices then store the information and upload it to central servers where it can be shared with third parties. That information can

present enemies with information on military operations.

Using GPS Devices Poses Risks

"The rapidly evolving market of devices, applications and services with geolocation capabilities presents a significant risk to the Department of Defense personnel on and off duty, and to our military operations globally," Manning said.

These Global Positioning System capabilities can expose personal information, locations, routines and numbers of DoD personnel. Their use in overseas locations "potentially create unintended security consequences and increased risk to the joint force and mission," Manning said.

Personal phones and other portable devices also contain apps that rely on GPS technology, and they will be affected. Commanders will be responsible for implementing the policy, and they will be allowed to make exceptions only after conducting a thorough risk assessment.

Security is at the heart of this guidance. DoD seeking a balanced way that allows for legitimate official and personal uses of geolocation technology that does not impact security.

Manning said the department will continue to study the risk associated with these devices and change the policy as needed.

Your Voice – Your VoteDon't miss your opportunity!

The November 2018 general election is quickly nearing. To find your state's election website for specific information on candidates, elections, contact information, and links to your local election offices, visit the Federal Voting Assistance Program's (FVAP) page at fvap.gov/info/contact.

FVAP works to ensure that service members and their eligible family members along with citizens living overseas are aware of their right to vote and also provide the tools and resources to be able to do so. FVAP recommends that all individuals living outside of their voting jurisdiction whether CONUS or OCONUS send in a Federal Post Card Application (FPCA). The FPCA can be used to register to vote while simultaneously requesting an absentee ballot. It can also be used to submit a change of address to your local election officials. You can now go online at https://www. fvap.gov/r3/fpca/home and use the FPCA Wizard that will help you register, request your absentee ballot and/or change your address while providing you with all of your state-specific information and requirements to vote.

Federal Write-In Absentee Ballot (FWAB): The FWAB can be used as a backup in case you have already



registered to vote or sent in an FPCA to both register and request your absentee ballot, but you have not yet received your absentee ballot from your state. Like the FPCA, you can go online to fill in the FWAB at https://www.fvap.gov/r3/fwab/home and use the FWAB Wizard that will help you to vote in Federal elections, even filling in your candidate choices based on your State of residence.

Little Rock AFB Voter Assistance Office is here to help you exercise the very right you protect — your right to vote! We can help you register to vote, request an absentee ballot and notify your local election officials back home of a change of address. Your Voting Assistance Office can help you fill in and mail your voting materials if you need the assistance. Staff Sgt. Johnson leads maintenance supply operations for the swing shift. She provides logistics readiness support for 14 C-130J aircraft, enabling programmed flying training operations to annually produce more than 800 combat airlifters for five major commands and 13 partner nations. Johnson personally revamped the bench stock program by deleting obsolete items to recoup funds back to the Air Force. She has also created a real-time asset tracking system, which improved the 12-hour fix rate by 3.5 percent over a six month period. She also manages the unit's Due-In From Maintenance program, which enables assets to be returned to the supply pipeline to generate mission capable aircraft.





In addition to providing advice on military justice issues, the legal office at Little Rock Air Force Base, Arkansas, handles civil law matters as well. This includes providing legal assistance on a variety of topics as well as drafting wills, powers of attorney, interpreting Air Force instructions, and providing legal reviews for claims, contracts, fundraisers and other financial matters.

"Our mission is to provide agile and dependable legal advice," said Senior Airman Peter Davis, 19th AW JA general law paralegal. "Being able to help people, especially, right before they go on deployment would probably be the most rewarding part of the job for me."

work schedule of providing swift legal advice goes hand-in-hand with being a part of the Judge Advocate team. From late-night calls to constant paperwork and meetings with hundreds of clients monthly, paralegal Airmen exemplify service before self and show an interest in their craft from day one.

"You never know exactly what's going to walk through that door, so you have to know what you're doing," Davis said.

Keeping a close eye on easily overlooked details comes in handy for judge advocate Airmen when they're dealing with important or stressful cases. Being able to scrutinize such large volumes of legal documents during this process doesn't just come from extensive training, but also an innate interest in the role of an Airman.

"What drew me to this careerfield is being able to help people directly," said Capt. Nate Freeman, 19th AW JA chief of legal assistance. "It's one of the things that keeps me going during afterhours work."



LRAFB civic leaders learn from Airmen during recent visit to McConnell AFB

"What does downrange mean?"

This question was a subtle reminder there are some civilians with limited military experience who may not understand the jargon used daily in that world.

Twenty civilians from communities surrounding Little Rock Air Force Base, Arkansas, posed many questions while attending a civic leader tour July 26-27, 2018, hosted by Little Rock AFB and McConnell AFB, Kansas.

This tour exposed civic leaders to two military installations, and their mission sets and a multitude of Airmen's jobs to help them better understand the Air Force, Air Mobility Command, and their communities.

The participants first gathered at Little Rock AFB early that Thursday morning to meet with uniformed leadership from across the base for breakfast and briefings highlighting Team Little Rock's combat airlift missions.

Col. Gerald Donohue, 19th Airlift Wing commander, greeted the men and women representing Little Rock's Community Council and a wide variety of businesses and agencies from towns around Little Rock AFB.

"Community support is very important to us," Donohue said. "Our Civic Leader Tour program is a great tool we have available to show our mission to you, with the hope that you become strong supporters of Little Rock AFB and AMC and share that mission as well."

After viewing the installation mission video, hearing briefings from the 314th Airlift Wing, 189th Airlift Wing and 913th Airlift Group, the civic leaders and base leadership boarded a C-130J waiting for them on the flightline and buckled into the red-webbed seats.

After flying to McConnell AFB, they invested a day and a half in learning first-hand about Team McConnell's people, facilities and mission, focusing on KC-135 aerial refueling, the development of the KC-46 Pegasus program, and how those aircraft impact Rapid Global Mobility.

The civic leaders gained more insight into the activeduty and Air National Guard sides of the base, toured a KC-135 and a brand-new, multi-million dollar high-tech hangar, and met with McConnell's community support group – Friends of McConnell – for dinner.

Throughout the tour, the civic leaders spoke with Airmen about their facilities and their jobs, getting a better feel for their missions and how they fit within AMC.

Gina Radke, chief executive officer of Galley Support Innovations in Sherwood, Arkansas, who is new to the military, enjoyed meeting the Airmen while learning about the refueling mission at McConnell.

"I had heard about refueling in the sky, but I had no idea how it worked," Radke said. "How precise it had to be. How stressful that must be for the pilots to hold two multi-million dollar aircraft 13 feet apart and try to refuel them with thousands of pounds of fuel a second.

"And I think the big thing about that is it keeps our Airmen safe because they aren't having to land in a warzone. They are refueling in the sky. That part of Air Mobility Command keeps our most valuable assets, our Airmen, safe."

Another valuable thing the civic leaders learned was about the Airmen's different career fields.

"I think the biggest thing I learned Air Force-wide is the fact that you have to have every position," Radke added. "It all works toward the mission. Whether you are on the dining staff, whether you are a photojournalist, or whether you are a boom operator, or mechanic or pilot, they all have to work together."

Jim Cargill, president and CEO of Arvest Bank Central Arkansas, was inspired by McConnell's relationship with their community.

"It was an eye-opening experience," Cargill said.

"It's really a world I wasn't acquainted with, and an impact that I wasn't fully appreciative of until I made this trip. And at dinner with the McConnell community leaders, I got to see how other communities like Wichita really appreciate and value McConnell as part of their community and how it benefits them."


