
DINING FACILITY CLOSED

Will you be that mentor?

In the past year, I've had the distinct privilege of officiating a retirement ceremony, multiple promotions, a re-enlistment and even had the privilege to commission one of my former Airmen to Second Lieutenant at Officer Training School.

Protocol dictates a certain flow for these events, but each of them had touches that made them unique and special to the individual being recognized at the moment. Some were in the Uniform of the Day while others were in their service dress. Some had the Honor Guard present the colors; some had a chaplain or local clergy member from their church offer a prayer. However, what always stands out to me on these occasions is the speech that the honoree gives at the end.

In every one of the aforementioned events, in front of all the attendees there to honor and congratulate them, the honorees took time to thank those individuals who helped them along the way. Rather than talk about themselves, the majority of the time was willingly, if not downright enthusiastically, spent talking about the service of others that helped them achieve the celebrated milestone. While this speaks to the humble nature of these Airmen, it also speaks to the value of mentoring.

There's an old saying, "Nobody cares how much you know until they know how much you care!" When I think about the individuals I consider to be mentors, each one of them cared enough to get to know me and took an interest in my development. I don't necessarily mean development in my military career, but as an individual. They took time out of their demanding schedules in an attempt to make me a better officer, aviator, father, husband or friend. My mentors didn't have to be asked for their guidance; they gave it freely. Sometimes, they offered criticism, but it was done constructively and not to ridicule or belittle. Good mentors aren't exclusively senior in grade or even in the military. My wife is one of the best mentors I've ever had

(although in fairness, good nature ridicule is in her arsenal as well).

I believe mentoring is at the very heart of our Air Force Core Values and would argue that it's one of the most important things we can do. It all starts with Excellence in all you do. Have you ever met or seen someone you thought was sub-par and thought, "I want to be like them?" Neither have I; so be that mentor who people look up to because of what you represent and not what rank you hold. Additionally, a good mentor has unquestionable Integrity. In direct or indirect observations, good mentors follow the Golden Rule and care about making everyone around them better. Be the mentor that cultivates growth, not just for the sake of a performance report or quarterly award or because someone is watching, but because it's the right thing to do. Perhaps most importantly, every mentor embodies Service before Self. Be the mentor that takes the time to help guide those around them, even if that means you may have to stay a little later in order to finish the work that you put off to help someone else reach their goals.

Here's the catch with mentoring: you don't get to choose to be a mentor, but you can certainly choose not to be. A command or promotion board can't appoint you as a mentor. Unlike a rank or duty title which conveys certain authorities, a mentor is chosen by those who find you to be worthy of their trust and respect. Will you be that mentor? If you're like me, you have never heard someone tell you they consider you a mentor directly and you probably never will. They'll most likely never tell you until they are having that ceremony, and thanking you publicly for setting that example and helping them achieve that milestone in their careers.

We owe it to the Air Force to continue to develop and mentor the next generation to carry on the proud legacy that our predecessors handed down to us. Being a mentor takes time and effort, it offers no monetary or physical value, but it's an investment that will outlive your own service and a legacy that you can take pride in. Will you be that mentor?

I believe mentoring is at the very heart of our Air Force Core Values and would argue that it's one of the most important things we can do.

HISTORY FACT

On April 29, 1975, Herk C-130A 56-0518, the C-130 that sits on display at the base’s front gate, flew the last mission out of Vietnam during the fall of Saigon. With more than 100 aircraft destroyed on the flightline at Tan Son Nhut Air Base, it was the last flyable C-130. In a panicked state, hundreds of people rushed to get aboard, as the aircraft represented a final ticket to freedom. The number of individuals aboard the plane and standing on the rear ramp required the pilot to taxi forward before hitting the brakes, which allowed the loadmaster to successfully close the doors. In all, 452 people were on board, including the 32 in the cockpit. It was estimated the aircraft was overloaded by at least 10,000 pounds. Consequently, the Herk used every bit of the runway and overrun before it was able to get airborne. After getting lost, the pilot landed the C-130 at Utapao, Thailand. The aircraft has been a fixture at Little Rock Air Force Base’s front gate since June 1989.



Excellence achieved in CCRI


Team Little Rock earned an excellent rating from the Defense Information Systems Agency's week-long Command Cyber Readiness Inspection that ended April 8.

The purpose of the CCRI was to test the base's network and physical security procedures for security vulnerabilities.

The inspection consisted of security scans of the nonclassified Internet protocol router network and the secret Internet protocol router network. It also included physical security scans such as the removal of common access cards from computers and traditional building security systems.

"It was really important because this was our first ever CCRI, whereas other bases have already had two or three," said Master Sgt. Kenneth E. Brown, 19th Communications Squadron CCRI preparations team superintendent. "We worked hard for this and as a team we came together; everybody was doing a part and even people who were not responsible for servers were going out around base and making sure people had their desk set up correctly."

The communications squadron worked for more than six months prior to the inspection. With help from the information protection office, network operations and security center, and the network control center team working 12-hour shifts making sure everything was configured and patched correctly.

"We put in a lot of man hours; our technicians worked really hard, day in and day out, with no weekends off until we reached the goal we wanted," said 2nd Lt. Ryan Nartea, 19th CS CCRI preparations team deputy officer in charge.

Another part of the preparation was an awareness campaign featuring cat memes highlighting components of inspection items. According to the communications team, the support and awareness of every network user was crucial to the inspection's success.

"The cat pictures we put up on login screens helped educate our users and made them more aware of the inspection," said Nartea.

STOP. THINK. CONNECT.

In Air Mobility Command, our critical global mission makes us a target for the adversary.

Between 2012 and 2013, the number of reported cyber incidents involving government agencies increased by 28%.

STOP. Before you use the Internet, understand the risks and learn how to spot potential problems.

THINK before sending sensitive information, posting questionable content or tracking location.

CONNECT on only secured wireless networks. Be cautious on publicly accessible computers. Take steps to avoid the theft of portable devices.

Keep a clean machine/device.

PROTECT personal information. (make passwords long and strong, set privacy/security settings on information sharing and use separate passwords for every account)

Be a good online citizen. What you do online has the potential to affect everyone.

REPORT stolen finances or cybercrime to local law enforcement and the Internet Crime Complaint Center (www.ic3.gov).



Being Wingmen amidst adversity

Team Little Rock personnel came together to attend the Survivors Breakfast, the testimony of two service members hosted by the Sexual Assault Prevention and Response office April 13 in the Walter's Community Support Center ballroom.

As U.S. Air Force Staff Sgt. Ashley Hasan-Kerr walked to the lectern, the room grew silent.

Starting her journey in Air Force more than nine years ago, Hasan-Kerr had been a material management supervisor, in addition to being an active volunteer, taking on the role of becoming a victim advocate.

She was heavily invested in her Airmen until she was sexually assaulted at work by someone she had trusted and worked with.

Hasan-Kerr recounted for the audience what her recovery process was and the struggles she faced along the way.

Being a victim advocate, the struggle was not finding a program or an avenue of help.


"I needed a Wingman." Hasan-Kerr said

This need was met when one of her co-workers stepped up to help her seek guidance and believed her.

"Someone believing me helped," Hasan-Kerr said. "It made me feel safe."

Hasan-Kerr struggled with self-blame,

making the process of seeking closure and help difficult.

"I blamed myself so I could feel like I was in control," Hasan-Kerr said.

Urging TLR personnel to listen to victims of sexual assault, the staff sergeant finished recounting her story.

"Be a Wingman," Hasan-Kerr said. "Believe them."

Her courage in recounting her story was met with applause, as the next speaker, U.S. Air Force Tech. Sgt. Felicia Exum, came forward.

Having the support of Wingmen was also important in the process of her recovering from domestic violence.

"Who is going to want me?" Exum asked herself before she had support from her fellow Wingmen.

With the conclusion of the testimonies, U.S. Air Force Col. Charles Brown, 19th Airlift Wing Commander, thanked the survivors for sharing their stories and spoke of the importance of professionalism and the Air Force's Zero tolerance policy toward assault.

"We're all Combat Airlifters, we're all humans, and we all have dignity and respect," Brown said.

Both briefer's stories promoted the idea that having a Wingman is an important part of the recovery process. For more information about recovery, or to seek help, call 501-987-2685. 2015 tax requirements

Available for tax year 2015 is another form in MyPay under Taxes, the IRS Form 1095. The Affordable Care Act signed into law March 23, 2010, requires all U.S. citizens and legal residents to obtain and maintain a minimum standard of health care insurance.

For 2015, taxpayers are required to prove that they have obtained the minimum essential coverage, TRICARE qualifies for this coverage.

Proof of coverage is the Department of Treasury Internal Revenue Service Form 1095: Employer Provided Health Insurance Offer and Coverage. Active duty, Air National Guard, Air Force Reserve, retiree and civilians will need to have the IRS Form 1095 to file their 2015 taxes.
