
### Lt. DAN BAND BUS ROUTE

# Black Knights welcome new command chief

U.S. Air Force Chief Master Sgt. Kenneth Carter recently stepped into his new role as the command chief for the 19th Airlift Wing. Having served in various roles ranging from an aircrew flight equipment technician to an instructor to a first sergeant, Carter is ready to use his experience to take care of the Little Rock Air Force Base Airmen and ensure the Combat Airlift mission is carried out successfully.

During the first few weeks on the job, Carter has focused on learning as much about the mission as possible in an effort to connect to the Airmen and be knowledgeable of the responsibilities they are charged with carrying out.

Below are a few of the questions Carter answered about what his hopes and goals are as the command chief of the Black Knights:

**Q: What do you hope to bring to Team Little Rock?**

*A: Out of my 26 years of service, I think experience is really what it's all about. The Air Force trains us during basic military training, technical school and through on-the-job training when we reach our bases. Everything we learn - all the experiences that we have - I think builds body of work that can be used later in your career you get to leverage. I think carrying (those experiences) forward, sharing what you've learned is one of the most important things you can do because we are developing people who can do the mission well and eventually replace us.*

**Q: What key items so you plan to invest in with regard to the enlisted force?**

*A: Colonel Brown really emphasizes what it takes to complete the mission in the Air Force, and that's the people, partnerships and readiness. I think most important is trying to figure out how you fit into that. Whatever your (Air Force Specialty Code) is, every day you should be thinking how do you fit into that concept.*

**Q: What are your priorities?**

*A: I hope to get back to the basics and invest in the camaraderie, the teamwork and the family you develop in the Air Force. We are a family, and just saying it isn't enough. We have to invest in our people and take care of them. A priority to me is asking questions, listening to what people say and then taking action. I want to reach out and touch as many people as I can. I want to go out and meet people in their work spaces so I can learn what they do, what's important to them, what their priorities are, what their values are, and what their goals are. Whether they stay four, six, 10, 20 or 30 years, I want their (time in service) to be a great experience.*

**Q: How will you ensure 19th AW priorities of People, Readiness and Partnerships are embraced?**

*A: When I am out and about with the commander and vice commander, I just like to stop at places and just say hi and shake hands and tell people thank you. We had a great team out at KUDOS, it's just amazing, you look around and you'd think*

*you'd see a lot of senior leadership coming out of those different offices and organizations to be out there with the families and kids and it's just a lot of young Airmen, excited to be doing what they do. Some have been here two weeks some have been here 7 or 10 years and they are still out there loving what they do, loving their job, loving their profession and sharing their craft now they are out there sharing it. Sharing the message and the mission of TLR and taking care of specifically the people, partnerships and readiness.*

**Q: How do our Airmen of today not only support the mission here for Combat Airlift, but the greater mission with joint and coalition forces?**

*A: We have a very smart force of enlisted, officer and civilian Airmen. We're leaner but it's amazing to hear the people talk about what they do and the different places they've been and the experiences they have had. When I see a C-130 take*

19th Bombardment Group aircrews participated in the Battle of Coral Sea May 4-8, 1942. During the battle, 19 BG crews raided enemy transportation and communication targets as well as troop concentrations while the Japanese attempted to invade New Guinea. Crews assigned to the group staged missions from multiple airfields and operated B-17s in sorties, some lasted up to 18 hours. The Battle of Coral Sea featured the first naval engagement fought by aircraft as the opposing ships made no contact. At the end of the battle, U.S. forces had successfully thwarted a Japanese invasion of Port Moresby, New Guinea, a location that would have allowed the Japanese to launch an invasion into Australia.

# Keep 'Eagle Eyes' out for suspicious activity

By being the eyes and ears in our local community, every citizen — military or civilian — can have a positive impact in the war on terror and the nation's security.

With this in mind, the Air Force Office of Special Investigations initiated the Eagle Eyes program. The program is an anti-terrorism campaign that teaches individuals how to identify terrorist activity when they see it. Armed with this information, people are able to report such activities to OSI or federal and local law agencies to ensure appropriate action is taken.

"We depend on everyone that's on base, whether that's Airmen, Department of Defense contractors or civilians to provide information that can help us detect threats so we can react to them," said Meghan Hilton, an AFOSI Special Agent.

The Eagle Eyes program offers a 24-hour hotline, so information is reported as soon as suspicious activity is observed.

"From reports we're able to create a threat assessment that we can provide commanders with, where they can take immediate action," she said. "It also helps to drive what our force protection condition levels are."

Warning signs of what to look for in daily life include:

**Surveillance:** Someone recording or monitoring activities to include using cameras, note taking, drawing diagrams, using binoculars and annotating on maps.

**Elicitation:** The attempt to gain information about military operations, capabilities or personnel through methods such as mail, fax, telephone or in person.

**Tests of Security:** Attempts to measure reaction times to security breaches or to penetrate security barriers or procedures in order to



assess strengths and weaknesses.

**Acquiring supplies:** Purchasing or stealing weapons, explosives, uniform, badges or any other controlled military item.

**Suspicious persons out of place:** Anyone who seems like they don't belong in the workplace, neighborhood, businesses or anywhere else.

**Dry runs:** Terrorists going through their plan of attack by putting their people into position and moving them around according to their plan.

**Deploying assets:** People and supplies get put into position to commit the act. This is a person's last chance to alert authorities before the terrorists act occurs.

An important factor in the success in combating terrorism is communicating with the Jacksonville community.

"The biggest thing is for people to get out and talk to each other," Hilton said. "Whether it's me talking to other federal and local law enforcement or whether it's an Airmen making civilian friends off base and just talking with them."

With the participation of the local community and Airmen, everyone has the power to prevent terrorist attacks from occurring.





# Goldfein nominated as the 21st CSAF

WASHINGTON (AFNS) — Defense Secretary Ash Carter announced April 26 that the president has nominated Air Force Vice Chief of Staff Gen. David L. Goldfein to be the 21st chief of staff of the Air Force, succeeding Gen. Mark A. Welsh III, who has served in the position since 2012.

"I'm extremely humbled by the nomination to serve as the Air Force's 21st chief of staff. If confirmed, I pledge to serve our Airmen and their families unwaveringly and honor our remarkable heritage and legacy of integrity, service and excellence," Goldfein said. "I also look forward to joining my fellow service chiefs as a member of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. General Mark and Betty Welsh continue to be exceptional stewards of our service, and Dawn and I are honored to follow in their footsteps."

Goldfein entered the Air Force in June 1983 as a graduate of the U.S. Air Force Academy. He has been assigned to numerous operational, command and staff positions. He currently serves as the vice chief of staff, where he presides over the Air Staff and serves as a member of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Requirements Oversight Council and Deputy Advisory Working Group.

"I am pleased to support the nomination of General David Goldfein as our next chief of staff," said Air Force Secretary Deborah Lee James. "General Goldfein possesses the experience and vision needed to address dynamic global challenges and increasing

military demand. He knows how to build and sustain key partnerships, has important warfighting experience, and will exercise the critical judgement required to balance our manpower and resources as we shape tomorrow's Air Force. There is not a better person to lead our Airmen into the next century of airpower dominance."

Prior to his current position, Goldfein was the director of the Joint Staff at the Pentagon in Washington, D.C., where he assisted the chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff in fulfilling his responsibilities as the principal military adviser to the president and secretary of defense.

"Dave Goldfein is an Airman who epitomizes warrior leadership, and that's exactly what our Air Force deserves," Welsh said. "He connects deeply with Airmen, he supports their families relentlessly, and he absolutely recognizes the criticality of our service's mission. Most importantly, he and Dawn understand the remarkable privilege they've been afforded in serving the nation."

Goldfein is a command pilot with more than 4,200 flying hours in the T-37 Tweet, T-38 Talon, F-16C/D Fighting Falcon, F-117A Nighthawk, MQ-9 Reaper, and MC-12W. He has flown combat missions in operations Desert Shield, Desert Storm, Allied Force, and Enduring Freedom. Goldfein has received numerous awards for his military service including the Defense Distinguished Service Medal with oak leaf cluster, the Legion of Merit with two oak leaf clusters and the Distinguished Flying Cross with Valor device and oak leaf cluster.

off from here, I wonder where they are going and if they are going somewhere to provide supplies and support across the United States. I wonder if they are providing disaster relief or going somewhere overseas to support the Combat Airlift mission and the different countries we are allied with. Every person on this installation supports that and they should take pride and be very proud of that mission: The combatant commanders

know they can rely on our team here and I think that's really important. Showing the connection on what they do every day and how impacts the bigger picture. So when you turn the news and you see supplies and vehicles being offloaded, those things got there, probably from one of our C-130s. People need to understand what they do every day is very important to Combat Airlift.

Showing the impact Combat Airlifters have on current operations — whether it's training, humanitarian support or aiding the combatant commanders — Chief Carter is dedicated to taking care of the people so the mission will not fail.



During Green Flag 16-06, international partnerships played a vital role in mission accomplishment. In one 24-hour iteration of the Green Flag 16-06 exercise, service members from the Royal Australian Air Force provided essential air support to an aircrew from a RAAF C-130J.

The crew airdropped critical supplies to a group of U.S. Air Force Airmen from the 61st Airlift Squadron at Little Rock Air Force Base. The 61st AS Airmen found themselves grounded behind enemy lines, as part of the exercise scenario. The aircrew navigated through the woods with no radio transmission but still managed to signal the RAAF C-130J overhead.

The RAAF crew airdropped heliboxes with supplies and transferred information to the 61st AS Airmen. The "stranded crew" successfully maneuvered through thick woods, brush and marsh to their extraction point, where the team was recovered by U.S. Army soldiers. Green Flag 16-06 provided realistic, tactical-level, joint combat airlift training for multiple nations.

The goal of the exercise was to boost successful communication and relationships built between joint and coalition forces to improve airlift capabilities.

# Premier training receives AMC accolades

Green Flag 16-06 provides extensive hands-on training to multiple service members - both joint and coalition forces -- in a short span of time which existed between April 14 to 24, 2016.

Wanting to get a firsthand look at the foundation provided by the 34th Combat Training Squadron, U.S. Air Force Maj. Gen. Jerry Martinez, Air Mobility Command Director of Operations, immersed himself into the exercise so he could witness the operations and meet the participants.

Martinez put boots-on-the-ground April 18, in Fort Polk, Louisiana, to view the main staging area for the exercise and saw quickly why Green Flag is known as the premier Mobility Air Forces training exercise.

“The 34th CTS is one of the premier training squadrons in our entire command and their reputation is amazing,” Martinez said. “They not only train our Airmen, but they work with other departments and other services in order to make our Airmen better.”

You don’t want to figure TTP’s out when you’re on the battlefield; the time to figure those out is while you can do it in a good constructive training environment. That is exactly

what we do here, and that is why it’s so important.”

Inclement weather consisting of heavy rain and thunderstorms did not deter the general from visiting the troops. The elements only added to illustrate how seriously this training is taken.

“Every time I go out to the field, I get to see my fellow

Airmen doing their job and it makes me so proud. I see these individuals -- these young men and women -- who are so smart, so technical, so scientific, and can adapt (to any situation),” said Martinez. “You see them and realize there is a reason we are the best Air Force in the world; it’s because of our people.”
