In 2009, President Barack Obama proclaimed June as Lesbian, Gay and Transgender Pride month. This year's theme for LGBT Pride month is "Celebration."

Like a majority of the observation months, LGBT Pride celebrates diversity and observes changes the military has undergone in order to encourage and embrace diversity.


So what is there to celebrate? What will I celebrate? It's been more than five years since the repeal of the Don't Ask, Don't Tell policy, and our fellow Airmen no longer have to hide who they are in order to serve.

Additionally, Secretary of Defense Ashton B. Carter added sexual orientation to the protected categories under Equal Opportunity last summer. As a result, our fellow Airmen can serve openly – free from discrimination.

For me, I celebrate because I see this change as a non-issue. While others may not agree, I believe this change in policy has been overwhelmingly welcomed or at least not opposed. Before the repeal, there was concern about a change in effectiveness and morale. But it didn't happen. The bottom line is, being a professional at work is about treating people with respect and focusing on the work to be done regardless of race, creed or sexual orientation. We still fly, fight and win, period. No one's rights were restricted, no one was displaced. Everyone we work with has chosen to be here; the sacrifice is the same.

In my career, I personally witnessed the strain DADT put on our members. I watched them leave when it was too much, and I watched them fight for those still serving in silence. I then watched them fight to come back to service. That is a sacrifice and struggle most of have not endured or made. I celebrate those that want to serve. I want them on my team.

I celebrate the perspectives and insight brought to any discussion or problem by someone whose experiences and opinions may differ from mine. It is what allows us to explore the boundaries of the possible and progress. When



we differentiate good and bad, in terms of behaviors and not by category or identity we truly overcome discrimination and increase our effectiveness.

I celebrate the LGBT community that has served alongside us throughout history. The greatest success of now having the right to serve openly is the new generation of service members who have never served under isolation. Just last month, on May 17, Eric Fanning was confirmed by the U.S. Senate as the Secretary of the Army. He is the first openly gay head of any service in the U.S. military.

June is a time to celebrate and embrace each other as brothers- and sisters-in-arms to our country. I am proud to know that the LGBT community is serving; proud to call them Airmen and friends. Thank you to all who serve.

## HISTORY FACT

On June 28, 1955, Little Rock AFB experienced its first aircraft fatality when its only aircraft, a C-45G, assigned to the base for administrative purposes, crashed near luka, Ky. Col. Joseph Thomas, the first installation commander, and Maj. Roy Lachmund, base purchasing and contracting officer, were traveling to an air base commander conference at Lockbourne AFB, Ohio, when the aircraft developed problems. Two of the aircraft's three crew members perished when the Expeditor's propeller cracked, causing the engine to vibrate and pull away from its mount. While Maj. Lachmund, the pilot, attempted to land the aircraft, the crew hit some high trees, throwing the plane into the ground. Tech. Sgt. William Sutherland, flight engineer, survived the crash, but was severely burned after attempting to rescue the other crew members from the burning plane. For his efforts, Sutherland received the Cheney Award for his heroism and self-sacrifice.

# Little Rock Airman soars above standards

Standing at a slender 6 feet tall, U.S. Air Force Senior Airman Vincent Williams, a 48th Airlift Squadron aviation resource manager apprentice, has a dominating presence. However, it is not his stature that makes him a force to be reckoned within his career field.

Williams has a relentless work ethic and calm demeanor that sets him apart head and shoulders above his peers. His hard work and dedication to the 314th Airlift Wing's training mission has earned him a multitude of awards and recognition throughout his career.

Williams was named the 314th Operations Group Mission Support Enlisted Member of the Year for 2015 at Little Rock Air Force Base, Ark.

He led the annual profile review by auditing 64,000 training events which led to a 89 percent mission ready status for the 314th AW and the 189th Airlift Wing. His relentless work ethic allowed for the creation of one thousand flight orders which validated 3,600 events and ensured the training completion of 383 aviators across four Air Force Specialty Codes.

Before Williams would accomplish these feats, he was a regular high school graduate trying to find his place in the world.

"I joined the service after I realized I needed to do something



meaningful with my life," Williams, a Dawson, Georgia, native, said. "Before I came in, I spent a lot of time playing video games, but since joining, I haven't had the time."

He now devotes all his attention and skills to his career field and bettering himself as an Airman through the mentorship of his supervisors and the training he receives.

"I'm always training," Williams said. "I'm that Airman that will ask for a task evaluation just so I'm signed off on it, and my leadership and I know that I'm doing my job correctly."

Training is vital to mission success and it's what drives Williams. The competitive atmosphere of today's work force also motivates him to better himself and push his limits.



# Little Rock AFB airlift squadrons participate in 72nd D-Day anniversary events

NORMANDY, France – In commemoration of the 72nd Anniversary of D-Day, U.S. Airmen from the 48th Airlift Squadron and 62nd Airlift Squadron of the 314th Airlift Wing from Little Rock Air Force Base, Arkansas, transported on June 5, 2016, more than 60 U.S. Army paratroopers from the 82nd Airborne Division from Fort Bragg, N.C., and the 173rd Airborne Brigade from Vicenza, Italy, over the “Iron Mike” Monument and La Fiere Drop Zone in Normandy, France.

The airdrops of paratroopers symbolizing the role the 314th Troop Carrier Group – the 314th AW’s predecessor -- played during the Normandy invasion of World War II. During the invasion, the 314th TCG delivered paratroopers from the 82nd Airborne Division over Normandy, France. This is the first time the 314th AW has been able to participate in the D-Day commemorative events.

This year, festivities were held in

the local communities surrounding St. Mere-Eglise, one of the first French towns liberated by the Allies during World War II. These events, which began June 1, 2016,

and continued up to the grand commemoration on June 6, 2016, highlighted just how important remembering the importance of what happened 72 years

ago and how crucial it is to not repeat the past. Local residents and thousands of tourists all came together to touch a piece of history, and to see the legacy continued by today’s military.

“Seeing so many people come together and appreciate what we do makes me appreciate what I do even more,” said U.S. Air Force Staff Sgt. Rachel Stewart, 314th Operations Group C-130J loadmaster. “It also makes me realize the impact of our roles, not just on an Air Force level, but on a global level.”

This year the 48th AS will be deactivated in September making their participation in this year’s commemorative events especially poignant.

“It’s a big year for the 314th AW,” said U.S. Air Force Maj. Bryan Lucas, 314th OG C-130J pilot. “Participating in the anniversary is bittersweet. The 62nd AS is transitioning from the C-130H to the C-130J while the 48th is standing down. It’s wonderful to see these two squadrons who flew over Normandy in 1944 can fly one more time here.”

# DoD ramps up training on Blended Retirement

WASHINGTON — The Defense Department's new retirement system will affect some 2.2 million people who all need to get smart on what it will mean.

Two subject-matter experts from the department's personnel and readiness branch described the issues involved to DoD News: Army Sgt. Maj. Luther Thomas Jr., senior enlisted advisor to the Defense Department's Manpower and Reserve Affairs Division, and Wayne Boswell, DoD's director of financial readiness.

Thomas described the four-phase overall training program planned for the Blended Retirement System, or BRS, as "a very comprehensive financial education strategy."

The leader training module will be available starting today, June 1, on the Joint Knowledge Online portal and the MilitaryOneSource website.

"I'm going to have service members whose situations are all different. I can go up online to JKO, click 'launch the class,' and then look in the glossary and get the specific information I need to be able to talk to my service member one on one," he said.

Thomas said that while leaders are required to take the first round of training, it's also available to those who aren't yet in leadership roles. Boswell noted that the online availability also will help family members learn about the new retirement system.

"We know a lot of these decisions will be made around the dinner table, with families' input in terms of the impact of lifelong financial decisions," he said.

The training is designed to inform leaders about BRS "to be able to translate this for their members," Boswell said.

### MODULES AND MILESTONES

The learning strategy for BRS includes four separate modules:

- Leader training starts June 1;
- Training for installation and command financial counselors rolls out in the fall;
- Opt-in training for current service members begins in January 2017; and
- Service members who join after January

2018 will receive training during their first months of service.

Everyone serving as of December 31, 2017 will be grandfathered under the current retirement system. Service members who have served fewer than 12 years on active duty or accrued fewer than 4,320 retirement points in the reserve component will have the option of remaining covered under their current retirement system or enrolling in BRS. Those with greater than 12 years on active duty or more than 4,320 retirement points in the reserve component will stay under their current system.

The training course for leaders/supervisors can now be accessed via [www.militaryonesource.mil](http://www.militaryonesource.mil). Although this first course is targeted for supervisors, it is available now for everyone.

# AF Men's Health Month promotes better health and better care

FALLS CHURCH, Va. – According to the National Institutes of Health, compared to women, men are more likely to smoke, drink, make unhealthy choices and delay regular checkups and medical care. While mental health issues are more common in women, men are much less likely to seek care.

Many of the major health risks faced by men can be prevented or treated with early diagnosis, according to NIH. U.S. Air Force Lt. Col. (Dr.) Lori Diseati, chief of Health Promotions, Air Force Medical Operations Agency, encourages men to adhere to recommended screenings and routine check-ups, including mental health care, which can lead to fuller, healthier lives.

In the U.S., the top causes of death among adult men include heart disease, stroke, cancer and chronic lower respiratory disease, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.


According to Diseati, 70 percent of diseases that kill are preventable through changes in controlling weight, stress, tobacco use, poor sleep and other factors related to lifestyle. Even small personal lifestyle changes can significantly lower the risk of the greatest health threats.

Diseati provided these men's health tips and guidance for better health and better care:

■ High BMI, stress, tobacco, poor sleep and other behavior contribute to heart attacks and stroke. Regular physical activity can help to reduce stress and is associated with lower rates of diseases like osteoporosis, dementia, anxiety and depression, along with better libido and better mental health. Exercising as little as 10 minutes a day can lead to an increased lifespan. The recommended target for each week is 150 minutes of moderate exercise or 75 minutes of vigorous exercise, including strength training at least twice per week. Some men use supplements to enhance body building or health. While some supplements are safe, their contents are not regulated. It is important to exercise safe supplement use and review safety reports prior to taking dietary supplements.

■ It's recommended that adults get at least six to seven hours of restorative sleep each night. If you do not feel refreshed after a night's rest on two or more nights per week, seek help from a primary care provider to learn how to get better sleep.

■ Men have higher risk of heart disease than women. Risk increases over the age of 45. Other risk factors for men include a strong family history of heart disease, smoking,



high blood pressure and leading a sedentary lifestyle. Men with these risk factors should be screened for cholesterol disorders starting at age 20.

■ Men without heart disease should get cholesterol testing starting at age 35.

■ For men over 50, regular screening is critical to preventing colorectal cancer. Men with a family history of cancer or who have other diseases should get screened more frequently and see a specialist about this recommendation. Prostate cancer screening standards have changed. Starting at age 40, men should have a discussion with their primary care manager to find out if screening is necessary in their specific situation.

■ Men who have ever been regular smokers should have a screening for aortic aneurysm, even if they quit smoking many years ago. An ultrasound of the aorta is recommended for men between the ages of 65 and 75.

“In terms of health behavior and a healthy lifestyle, there is a strong movement towards mindfulness –the state of active, open attention to the present,” said Diseati. “When we observe our actions, we can make better decisions if we step back and think about why we are making the decisions we make. It is important to be more deliberate in our actions. This is the foundation for making desired health changes.”
