HISTORY FACT

Why are 19th Airlift Wing members known as Black Knights? The Black Knight mascot originated in 1961 when the 4137th Strategic Wing, then stationed at Robins Air Force Base, Ga., won the Best Overall Wing Award during Strategic Air Command's Combat Competition at Fairchild Air Force Base, Wash. Along with increased rank and pay, the team received an unusual trophy - a 6-foot-tall papier-mâché knight, donated by the Spokane Chamber of Commerce. From that time forward, the wing began calling itself the Black Knights. The Black Knight mascot passed on to the 465th Bombardment Wing in 1963 upon the inactivation of the 4137th SW, before being adopted by the 19th Bombardment Wing five years later. With the 19th BWs activation at Robins AFB on July 25, 1968, the Black Knight mascot again exchanged hands. The 19 BW moved, without personnel and resources, from Homestead Air Force Base, Florida, to assume the inactivating 465th BWs B-52 mission. The former members of the 465th BW, now assigned to the 19th BW, brought with them the Black Knight mascot and the "Checkmate to Aggression" motto. In January 2009, the 19th AW dropped the "Checkmate to Aggression" slogan, and officially returned to its original motto, "In Alis Vicimus" - "On Wings We Conquer."

Little Rock AFB pushes through construction with Expo

Little Rock Air Force Base, the Home of Combat Airlift and the Combat Airlift Center of Excellence, is no stranger to high operations tempo. Deployment and training operations haven't slowed down since the runway construction project kicked off in July 2015.

Since 1955, the base's runway has been utilized for a variety of missions throughout its 60 years of operation. The current construction project will be updating the runway from its original build and is scheduled to last approximately two years.

"As of right now, we're in the second phase of construction," said Kerry Miller, 19th Operations Support Squadron airfield manager. "During this phase, the assault zone airstrip, which simulates a deployed location landing, will be replaced. Once we begin the third phase, we'll open up that area and get a portion of the runway back."

Despite only a portion of the runway being used during the phased project, the mission doesn't stop. The runway supports a variety of missions between

the 19th, 314th and 189th Airlift Wings such as airdrops, personnel transport and C-130 pilot training.

"There is an average of approximately 1,200 to 1,300 sorties each month," Miller said.

While the base runway currently supports the C-130J Combat Airlift mission, there isn't enough runway space available to support a full airshow performance. However, the base will be hosting a Military Expo on Sept. 17.

The base is partnering with Camp Joseph T. Robinson and other military units around the state to showcase various capabilities such as equipment, aircraft static displays, flyovers, personnel and cargo drops, military working dogs and explosive ordinance disposal.

"The state of Arkansas and the local communities support our military in a variety of ways," said U.S. Air Force Maj. Julie Honeycutt, Expo director. "The Expo is an amazing opportunity to show our community how their support helps us accomplish our mission and contributes to the larger national defense."

OSI seeks special agents

The Air Force Office of Special Investigations is looking for enlisted Airmen from any career field to cross train as an AFOSI Special Agent.

Applicants should be senior airmen, staff sergeants or technical sergeants and have three to 11 years of time in service.

AFOSI Det. 327 routinely holds recruitment briefings on the first Thursday of each month at 9 a.m. at Bldg. 670.

"The ideal applicant has strong moral character and an outstanding work ethic," said Special Agent Bradley Byington, Det. 327 commander. "Applicants must be able to work successfully as part of a team and also individually, with little supervision."

AFOSI is the Air Force's premier investigative agency. First established in 1948, AFOSI was modeled after the FBI. Today, there are more than 200 operating locations worldwide, and AFOSI welcomes more than 180 officer, enlisted and civilian special agents each year into the command.

AFOSI special agents focus on three primary missions:

FELONY CRIME INVESTIGATIONS

The vast majority of AFOSI's investigative activities fall in this mission area. These crimes include murder, robbery, sexual assaults, illegal narcotics offenses and a full spectrum of other criminal acts.

COUNTERINTELLIGENCE (CI)

This mission includes investigating, espionage, sabotage, terrorism, illegal technology transfer and computer infiltration.

ECONOMIC CRIME INVESTIGATIONS (FRAUD)

Some of these investigations include violations of contracting matters, pay and allowance matters, and environmental crimes.

The recruitment process to become an AFOSI Special Agent can be lengthy. Applicants must meet requirements to obtain a top secret security clearance and initial training is conducted at the Department of Homeland Security Federal Law Enforcement Training Center in Brunswick, Georgia.

"If someone thinks they have what it takes to become a part of AFOSI, they should call our office at (501) 987-6116 and we can set up a pre-screening interview," Byington said.

2 simple steps for military members to vote from anywhere

On a ship? In a combat zone? On base? No matter where you are, you can vote.

If you're active duty and living away from your voting residence, you can have your absentee ballot sent to you this election year.

Here's how:

1. Register to vote and request your ballot with one form.

It's called the Federal Post Card Application, FPCA. You can get it at FVAP.gov or the Voting Assistance Office where you're stationed.

At FVAP.gov, select your State for all the info and materials you need. You can use FVAP's online assistant to help fill out your FPCA. Or print it and fill it out by hand.

Then send it to your local election official. Find the address at FVAP.gov to mail it. Or check if your State allows you to send it in by email or fax if that's easier.

For the General Election on November 8, plan to mail your FPCA by Aug. 1, 2016 (or later depending on your state). Check FVAP.gov for your state's specific deadline.

You have to send in a new FPCA every year to receive your absentee ballots for all 2016 elections — even if you've done it before.

2. Fill out and send in your ballot when it arrives.

Once you receive your ballot, fill it out and send it back to your local election official.

Like the FPCA, you may be able to return your ballot by email or fax, so check what your State allows.

For the general election, you should receive your ballot by early October.

And you should send it back by:

■ Nov. 1, 2016 if you're stateside

■ Oct. 15, 2016 if you're outside the United States.

■ Oct. 10, 2016 if you're on a ship at sea

If you don't get your ballot by October 8, that's no problem. Get a Federal Write-In Absentee Ballot, or FWAB, from FVAP.gov or your Voting Assistance Office. Fill it out and send it like your regular ballot.

After you send in your ballot, you can even check if it was received. Select your state at FVAP.gov to check the status of your ballot.

The FVAP makes it that simple. Visit FVAP.gov; call (800) 438-VOTE; or email vote@fvap.gov to make sure you can vote from anywhere. Sign up for voting alerts at FVAP.gov and check out FVAP's Facebook and Twitter.

MYTHS VS. REALITIES

MYTH: I have heard that absentee ballots only count in close elections.

Reality: No. In fact, absentee ballots submitted in accordance with State laws are counted for every election. The difference is that in a close election, the media reports that the outcome cannot be announced until after the absentee ballots are counted. However, all ballots are counted in the final totals for every election — and every vote (absentee or in-person) counts the same.

MYTH: States all have the same election rules and deadlines for military and overseas voters.

Reality: False. States have different rules in regard to how and when the forms are returned. Visit FVAP.gov for state-specific guidelines.

MYTH: Military spouses and dependents cannot use military absentee voting forms.

Reality: No. In fact, military family members who will be 18 years old by Election Day should use the same Federal Post Card Application, or FPCA, and Federal Write-In Absentee Ballot that members of the Uniformed Services and overseas citizens do, even when voting absentee stateside. Dependents attending college overseas should also use those forms.

MYTH: Absentee ballots are not secret.

Reality: Not true. State absentee ballots and the Federal Write-In Absentee Ballot are designed with a "Secrecy Envelope" allowing for the separation of the voter's identity from the cast ballot. Voting Assistance Officers also ensure voters casting absentee ballots on Department of Defense (DoD) facilities are able to do so in a private and independent manner. Local election officials are professionals who go to great lengths in their ballot handling procedures to ensure your vote, and personal information, are kept private.

MYTH: I can't vote if I'm deployed.

Reality: False — you absolutely can vote while deployed. If you're registered to vote while deployed and you don't get your State ballot in time to vote from your location, you can use the Federal Write-In Absentee Ballot (FWAB) found at FVAP.gov. Remember to submit the form at least 30 days before the scheduled election.





Despite sporting a brace from his right wrist to shoulder immobilizing his recently broken elbow, McFadden personally interacted with the campers on the field showing his enthusiasm and love for the game. He broke his elbow over the Memorial Day weekend after slipping on cement at a friend's pool.

The collegiate All-American and two-time Heisman Trophy runner-up encouraged the youth with a mantra of "work hard and be humble" – ideals that has led the him from Pulaski County's Oak Grove High School Pulaski County all the way to NFL stardom.

"Continue to work hard," he said. "(It's) not something that everyone has in them, but it's something I want to instill in people and continue to do."

Born in Little Rock, Arkansas, McFadden played college football for the University of Arkansas. At the end of his college career, he was the most decorated player in the school's history, and was picked fourth overall by the Oakland Raiders in the 2008 NFL Draft.
