

Excellence—more important now than ever

Would you agree there are opportunities for Airmen of all ranks to improve their individual performance? If so, how does one become better ... even excellent as an Airman? I say “Just do it!” I could stop there, as I believe the classic slogan is brilliant and applicable to almost any situation.

Many times as human beings we decide to better ourselves in some capacity. Perhaps it's the realization that one needs to lose weight, improve on physical fitness or be better educated. Maybe it's a desire to be promoted and the subsequent recognition that to achieve that goal a study regimen must be applied. Whatever the case, talking about it isn't enough. Action must be taken; we must just do it!

The challenge in this is although we may have the best of intentions, the follow through doesn't always occur. Airmen get tired for a myriad of reasons whether it's tied to ops tempo, family-related requirements or, arguably the most obvious, because they're human beings. Additionally, doing what we know or have always done is easier than stretching ourselves or stepping out of our comfort zones. In essence, striving to improve one's self is work; however, I submit it's absolutely work worth doing!

For almost my entire 27-and-a-half year enlisted career, our nation has been at war. Throughout this period, I have witnessed many manpower-mission dynamics: more than enough manpower to accomplish the mission, doing more with less, doing less with less and finally, doing what we have to do ... with what we have. Regardless the characterization, one thing is seemingly constant: resources – whether manifested in money or manpower – are finite. Because of this, it's imperative that each individual member of Team Air Force is the best they can be. Teams are undeniably important, but are in fact comprised of individuals.

As the Air Force begins recovery from its lowest manpower level in its 69-year existence, dependence on and confidence in the Airmen who remain is paramount. Additionally, our core values of Integrity, Service and Excellence – both in word and deed – are arguably more critical now than they have ever been. As the institution evolves, so too must its Airmen. This

evolution causes stress, which can be good or bad depending on an individual's ability to adapt. The mental, physical, social, spiritual domains of Comprehensive Airmen Fitness help provide a solid foundation to anchor upon during periods of turbulence. If an Airman strives to better themselves across these domains, they will logically be more prepared to deal with adversity, as well as manage the rigors of daily duties.

Adherence to our core values is critical. Of the three, the one I latch on to the most is excellence. This is not intended to imply the other two are less important; rather that, to me, if an Airman earnestly practices excellence in all they do, then integrity is likely present with service as the foundation. I contend one can possess integrity, and place service before self without necessarily being “excellent.” Moreover, it's abundantly clear to me that “good enough is no longer good enough!”

Words alone won't produce an “excellent” Airman, but they can communicate a common focus, and when consistently demonstrated, maximize trust. Our Airman's Creed inspires camaraderie by capturing who we are or should strive to be: a “wingman, leader, warrior.” I personally witnessed 591 Airmen swell with pride as they emphatically recited the words “... and I will not fail!” at a recent basic military training graduation ceremony. The unfortunate reality is sometimes we do fail: whether on PT tests, meeting standards, being good wingmen, or being excellent. Therefore we must continuously strive to be better, or else the words of our creed and core values will ring hollow.

Collectively, we are the best Air Force in the world. To retain that title, we must focus on deliberate development, innovation and adherence to established standards. We must also recognize that leadership begins with the individual, who then, when the opportunity presents itself, leads others.

Along the way we all get tired, but in those moments ... lean on one another, practice the tenets of CAF and live the Air Force core values and creed. Focus and application will make the individual better, strengthen the team and preserve the legacy of those who have gone before us.

It won't always be easy ... but in periods of uncertainty – just do it! After all, who joined the U.S. Air Force to be average?

HISTORY FACT

From 1963 to 1987 Little Rock Air Force Base was home to helicopter operations. This included the H-19 Chickasaw, UH-1F Huey and HH-1H Iroquois. From December 1973 to August 1987, the HH-1H Iroquois helicopters were assigned to Detachment 4, 37th Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Squadron. The unit’s mission primarily focused on supporting the 308th Strategic Missile Wing by delivering equipment and personnel to the 18 Titan II missile silos located around central Arkansas. The helicopters were instrumental in responding quickly to disasters at the missile silos, including the 1980 emergency in which the unit was credited with saving three lives that day. The helicopters also assisted in search and rescue missions for both military and civilian emergencies. Following the inactivation of the 308th SMW, the Air Force reassigned the helicopters and crews to other bases. The Iroquois located in Heritage Park was assigned to Little Rock AFB from 1979 until 1987. In 1995, the helicopter was dropped from Air Force inventory and has been on display since 2004.

"The Environmental Element is small but mighty," said Ron Love, 19th CES Environmental Element chief. "It brings together existing environmental programs and mission management processes into an integrated network that enables the installation to control the environmental impact of its activities, products and services."

The award-winning 19th CES Environmental Element provides, operates, maintains and protects both the natural and man-made environments at Little Rock AFB as a sustainable platform for the Combat Airlift mission.

With only five civilians and four contractor positions, the team relies on additional manpower from other organizations to help carry the work load.

"Strong relationships with the 19th CES Utility Shop and Fire Department Spill Response, Bio-Environmental Monitoring and Sampling along with local and state agencies allow the team to meet mission objectives

Base honors service, sacrifices of retirees

“Honor to the soldier and sailor everywhere, who bravely bears his country’s cause. Honor, also, to the citizen who cares for his brother in the field and serves, as he best can, the same cause,” a quote from President Abraham Lincoln.

Today, many veterans have made it their responsibility – long after they have traded in their uniforms for civilian attire – to continue caring for their fellow service members.

According to the 2015 Statistical Report on the Military Retirement System, over 2 million military retirees live in the U.S. That is 2 million friends, neighbors or family members who have sacrificed their time, body and mind to the freedom Americans enjoy today. But some continue to serve even after their call of duty.

Retirees who serve at the 19th Airlift Wing Retiree Activities Office continue their service to their nation by ensuring veterans have the resources and support system needed to transition from military service, seek help in navigating the process in attaining military benefits or simply providing a support system for those who still need the camaraderie offered while serving alongside their brothers and sisters in arms.

For retired U.S. Air Force Chief Master Sgt. Donald Smith, a director for the base RAO, the transition from active-duty service into the civilian sector allowed him the opportunity to reflect on what left the greatest impression on him while serving.

“What do I miss most? The people,” said Smith, who served in the U.S. Air Force from 1968 to 1998. “I miss it because I’m not able to have an input and impact on people’s lives in that manner.”



Retired Army Col. Henry Ward, 19th Airlift Wing Retirees Activities Office director, served 37 years in the Arkansas Army National Guard from 1955 to 1992. Ward now provides assistance and guidance to all retirees of all services through the RAO. The RAO will host Retiree Appreciation Day at the Walters Community Support Center on Saturday.

For retired U.S. Army Col. Henry Ward, it was about continuing to serve the people who honored their nation by serving in the military.

“The main reason this country is what it is today is because of (the veterans) who fought for our freedoms and believed in this country,” said Ward, who served 37 years in the Arkansas Army National Guard from 1955 to 1992.

Together, along with other volunteer

retirees, the RAO staff continues their service by helping Arkansas’s 25,817 strong retiree community.

Some of the things the RAO provides is assistance with the Veteran Affairs system and other processes veterans may need to enact.

“We try to put out information to all branches of the service that need help as far as pay, lost records, referrals to the VA, coordinating (help) with benefits

that they deserve and do not have at the moment – things of that nature,” Ward explained.

Taking care of people is a characteristic instilled throughout service member’s careers. For Ward and Smith, it was this principle they apply to serving the tight-knit retiree community they are a part of. Helping others is not a choice, but rather what they always have done and continue to do.

“During my enlistment, I saw a lot of retirees that didn’t have a place to go or have anyone to talk to when they had a problem,” Smith said. “This program gives a retiree a place to come to and have a face-to-face discussion with an individual about any problem they might have.”

Because the RAO takes great pride in providing a sense of community to Veterans, they look for opportunities to connect retirees. One way they do that is with their main annual event: Retiree Appreciation Day.

“It’s the most special event we do on Retiree Appreciation Day,” Ward said. “I would love to see all active-duty personnel on base come by and see what goes on!”

Retiree Appreciation Day is Oct. 22, 2016, from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. and is scheduled to be held at the Walters Community Support Center on Little Rock Air Force Base, Ark. The event will boast an array of informational booths open to all Team Little Rock in support of Arkansas’s retiree community.

Immunization policy changes

This season, the Department of Defense's entire supply of flu vaccinations will be administered through the inactivated influenza vaccine or the flu shot.

The FluMist will not be available at DOD facilities or covered by TRICARE. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommended against using FluMist this year due to its ineffectiveness in preventing the flu among certain age groups.

"Everyone who would like to or has to receive the flu vaccine (service members) will be vaccinated with the inactivated influenza vaccine or the flu shot," said U.S. Air Force Staff Sgt. Ryan Duckett, 19th Medical Group Immunizations Clinic NCO in charge.

In the past, FluMist was either comparable to, or better than, injectable vaccines in certain younger populations.

However, in recent years that advantage was not evident. According to the CDC the reason for the recent poor performance is not yet known.

"We do not expect a flu vaccine shortage for the 2016-2017 season," said U.S. Army Col. Margaret Yacovone, Defense Health Agency Immunization Healthcare Branch chief. "The DOD has contracted for 3.6 million doses of injectable flu vaccine, which is expected to fulfill our immunization needs."

Service members may go to the immunizations clinic at the 19th Medical Group to receive the mandatory vaccination.

"It's important for service members to receive the flu vaccine to help prevent them from contracting the flu virus, which may result in them missing work or possibly being hospitalized in more severe cases," Duckett said.

Airmen's rights, responsibilities when participating in political activities

As election season reaches its peak, service members and civilians are encouraged to vote and exercise their civic rights responsibility. However, service members should know the rules regulating Department of Defense personnel and their participation in political activities. These rules are intended to strike a balance between encouraging government employees' involvement in the political process and avoiding any improper appearance of DOD endorsement of a particular political party, candidate, cause or issue.

Air Force member's participation in political activities are governed by Air Force Instruction 51-902, Political Activities by Members of the U.S. Air Force. Airmen may – and are encouraged to – register to vote and express a personal opinion on political candidates and issues, but Airmen may not do so as a representative of the U.S. Air Force.

Airmen may:

- Make a monetary contribution to a political organi-

zation or political committee favoring a particular candidate or slate of candidates, subject to limitations under federal election laws.

- May attend political meetings or rallies or even join a political club as long as they do not attend these events in uniform.

- May also display a small political sticker on their private vehicle or wear a political button when not in uniform and not on duty.

- May "friend" or "like" a political candidate's Facebook page or follow the Twitter, Instagram or Snapchat accounts of a political party, partisan candidate, campaign, group or cause.

- May use social media platforms to express their own personal views on public issues or political candidates.

Airmen may not:

- May not engage in any partisan political activities. This means that members may not participate in activity directed at the success or failure of a political party, partisan political

candidate, campaign, group or cause.

- May not use their official authority or influence to interfere with an election or to affect its course or outcome.

- May not solicit votes or monetary contributions for a particular candidate or issue nor display a large political sign or banner visible to the public at on-base residence.

- May not serve as an officer of a political club, march in uniform in a partisan parade, or speak at a partisan gathering of any kind to promote a political party, candidate, or cause.

- May not suggest that others like, friend or follow partisan social media accounts.

- If using social media platforms to express personal political views and the member is identifiable as military (such as if a member has a social media profile picture in



uniform), then the message should clearly state that the views expressed are those of the individual only and not those of the DOD.

DOD civilian personnel are governed by the Hatch Act and DOD policy.

DOD civilian personnel may:

- May vote, express personal opinions about political candidates and issues, make monetary contributions to a political campaign or party (except while on duty or using government equipment), display a small political sticker on a personal vehicle, attend and be active at political events and rallies, and volunteer with a partisan campaign.

DOD civilian personnel may not:

- May not solicit, accept, or receive campaign contributions, regardless of when or where these actions take place, nor can they be candidates for public office in partisan political elections.

- May not display campaign materials in a Federal building or engage in political activity while using a government-owned or -leased vehicle.

- May not display a large political banner visible to the public at an on-base residence.

Campaigning on base is specifically prohibited, since it creates the appearance of government endorsement of a candidate. Department of Defense Instruction 4165.70,



POLITICS AND WORK DON'T MIX

Be aware of DOD policy before you get involved

- ▶ **ACTIVE DUTY** personnel may express personal opinions on political candidates and issues as well as make monetary contributions to a political campaign or organization and attend political events as a spectator when NOT in uniform.
- ▶ **ACTIVE DUTY** personnel must not engage in partisan political activities or campaign for a partisan candidate, campaign or cause.
- ▶ **ALL DOD PERSONNEL** must not engage in political activity while on-duty or in a federal building (including forwarding political emails and posting political messages on any social media outlet).
- ▶ **ALL DOD PERSONNEL** identified by a social media site as a DOD employee must clearly and prominently state views expressed are those of the individual and not of the DOD.

For more guidance on military members and Air Force civilian employees, reference DODD 1344.10, AFI 51-902 and The Hatch Act

Real Property Management, prevents installations from engaging in political activities and prohibits candidates from using installation facilities for political campaigns, press conferences or any other activity that could be construed as partisan in nature.

Responsible participation is the key with regard to political activities. Violations of AFI 51-902 are punishable under Article 92, UCMJ, for Failure to Obey a Lawful Regulation. While there are restrictions on partisan political participation, it's important to remember that all DOD employees are encouraged to carry out

the obligations of citizenship and exercise their right to vote. The DOD actively supports the Federal Voting Assistance Program to ensure its personnel have the resources, time and ability to participate in their civic duty.






