Preventing fraud takes teamwork

The Air Force Office of Special Investigations needs everyone to help in identifying and reporting fraudulent activities.

Besides general crimes, counterintelligence and research and technology protection missions, a significant amount of AFOSI resources are dedicated to fraud investigations, recovering more than \$1 billion defrauded from the U.S. Air Force worldwide.

Fraud is defined as the crime of obtaining money or other benefits by deliberate deception and comes in many forms which can be tricky to find. Bribery, identity theft, money laundering, embezzlement and submitting false documentation are a few examples.

By preventing fraud, waste and abuse, service members can save the U.S. Air Force money.

These things can get complicated and are often covered up very well, so it's important to be on the lookout for the following:

- Tools or parts breaking at an unexpectedly high rate is an indication that lower quality products were substituted

for the higher quality tools or parts.

- If someone who spends government money has an unusually high volume of purchases, strongly favors a particular supplier or appears to be spending more money than he or she makes, it may be an indication that they are stealing government money.

- If someone with authority over government resources spends time outside work with employees of a company that contracts with the government, or has an immediate family member that works for a government contractor, this may be an indication of conflict of interest.

- If someone with access to government money or contracts is living beyond his or her means or unjustifiably favors a particular contractor, this may be an indication of corruption or bribery.



HISTORY FACT

On Dec. 5, 1942, the 62nd Troop Carrier Squadron activated at Sedalia Army Air Base, Mo. Aircrews, equipped with a full complement of new C-47 Skytrains, soon deployed for World War II. The 62nd TCS's first station was French Morocco to support combat operations in the North African Campaign. Crews flew transport and resupply operations as well as casualty evacuation of wounded personnel deployed to the Mediterranean theater of operations. While participating in combat operations, 62nd TCS crews also participated in the famous D-Day aerial assault by delivering paratroopers into Normandy on June 6, 1944. Since World War II, the 62nd Airlift Squadron has proudly borne the nickname of the “Yacht Club.” Each unit had a codename in an attempt to create operational security. The codenames were used so that taskings could be passed over unsecured telephone lines.



Airmen's rights, responsibilities when participating in political activities

As election season reaches its peak, service members and civilians are encouraged to vote and exercise their civic rights responsibility. However, service members should know the rules regulating Department of Defense personnel and their participation in political activities. These rules are intended to strike a balance between encouraging government employees' involvement in the political process and avoiding any improper appearance of DOD endorsement of a particular political party, candidate, cause or issue.

Air Force member's participation in political activities are governed by Air Force Instruction 51-902, Political Activities by Members of the U.S. Air Force. Airmen may – and are encouraged to – register to vote and express a personal opinion on political candidates and issues, but Airmen may not do so as a representative of the U.S. Air Force.

Airmen may:

- Make a monetary contribution to a political organization or political committee favoring a particular candidate or slate of candidates, subject to limitations under federal election laws.

- Attend political meetings or rallies or even join a political club as long as they do not attend these events in uniform.

- Display a small political sticker on their private vehicle or wear a political button when not in uniform and not on duty.

- “Friend” or “like” a political candidate’s Facebook page or follow the Twitter, Instagram or Snapchat accounts of a political party, partisan candidate, campaign, group or cause.

- Use social media platforms to express their own personal views on public issues or political candidates.

Airmen may not:

- Engage in any partisan political activities. This means that members may not participate in activity directed at the success or failure of a political party, partisan political candidate, campaign, group or cause.

- Use their official authority or influence to interfere with an election or to affect its course or outcome.

- Solicit votes or monetary contributions for a particular candidate or issue nor display a large political sign or banner visible to the public at on-base residence.

- Serve as an officer of a political club, march in uniform in a partisan parade, or speak at a partisan gathering of any kind to promote a political party, candidate, or cause.

- Suggest that others like, friend or follow partisan social media accounts.

- If using social media platforms to express personal political views and the member is identifiable as military (such as if a member has a social media profile picture in uniform), then the message should clearly state that the views expressed are those of the individual only and not those of the DOD.

DOD civilian personnel are governed by the Hatch Act and DOD policy.

DOD civilian personnel may:

- Vote, express personal opinions about political candidates and issues, make monetary contributions to a political campaign or party (except while on duty or using government equipment), display a small political sticker on a personal vehicle, attend and be active at political events and rallies, and volunteer with a partisan campaign.

Civilian personnel may not:

- Solicit, accept, or receive campaign contributions, regardless of when or where these actions take place, nor can they be candidates for public office in partisan political elections.

- Display campaign materials in a Federal building or engage in political activity while using a govern-

Hunting season now open

Extended deer and gun season is in effect until the end of February 2017 due to an increased population of deer on base. As a result, all hunters on base must wear a blaze orange vest and hat at all times.

Arkansas Game and Fish Commission has issued 50 unrestricted weapon doe tags allowing holders the use of a gun during archery season.

Currently, 40 tags have been issued out and 10 are available for check out at the 19th Security Forces Squadron front desk for use around the airfield.

"We use the hunting program to keep the deer numbers down so it decreases the chance of one running onto the airfield," said James Popham, 19th Civil Engineer Squadron natural resources manager.

Rules to keep in mind during hunting season:

- Do not take your blaze orange vest/hat off. It is required even inside a box stand.
- Individuals with an unrestricted weapon doe tag are not authorized to use guns within archery only areas.
- All hunters are expected to know hunting area

Hunting Safety

-All hunters must wear a blaze orange vest and hat at all times while hunting.

-Blaze orange is required in box stand.

-Guns are not authorized in archery only areas.

-All hunters are expected to know hunting area parameters.

parameters before proceeding to ensure mission safety and the safety of personnel on base.

"Most of our hunting areas have distinct boundaries including roads and tree lines," Popham said. "There are also numbers imprinted on trees to identifying the hunting area, if you have passed the tree line or don't see

numbers you have gone too far."

All restricted areas on base are marked on the hunting map to include the Explosive Ordnance Disposal and munitions storage areas.

ment-owned or -leased vehicle.

■ Display a large political banner visible to the public at an on-base residence.

Campaigning on base is specifically prohibited, since it creates the appearance of government endorsement of a candidate. Department of Defense Instruction 4165.70, Real Property Management, prevents installations from

engaging in political activities and prohibits candidates from using installation facilities for political campaigns, press conferences or any other activity that could be construed as partisan in nature.

Responsible participation is the key with regard to political activities. Violations of AFI 51-902 are punishable under Article 92, UCMJ, for Failure to Obey a Lawful Regulation. While there are restrictions on partisan political participation, it's important to remember that all DOD employees are encouraged to carry out the obligations of citizenship and exercise their right


to vote. The DOD actively supports the Federal Voting Assistance Program to ensure its personnel have the resources, time and ability to participate in their civic duty.

Renovations complete: Herk Hall reopens doors

The Herk Hall, formerly the base theater, reopened Oct. 1 after nearly two years of renovations. The combined efforts of the 19th Civil Engineer Squadron's Simplified Acquisition Base Engineering Requirements Team, 19th Contracting Squadron and contractors made the project happen.

Team Little Rock had been without its theater since the spring of 2014. The original construction overhaul fixed the building's roof after a severe storm. After the temporary repairs were made, it was determined more repairs were needed in order to make the building safe. In September 2014, a \$1.3 million project was awarded to thoroughly repair the storm damage.

Due to the scope of the project, management would be a large task that would take several parties to help accomplish. One of the largest challenges was when the contractors discovered the theater's roof was not the only faulty portion of the building. However, after countless modifications, purchase new curtains, installation of new audio visual equipment, and secure a lighting upgrade, the project's original amount increased to nearly \$2 million.

In spite of the obstacles and delays this renovation has overcome, the building has been returned to its former glory and is now once again operational. The new layout has a seating capacity of more than 550 occupants, which more than doubles the capacity of any similar gathering facility on the base.

The demonstration showcased the Honor Guard's capabilities and mentored new team members on funeral service procedures.


