The 913th Airlift Group provides Combat Ready C-130 tactical airlift and support resources world-wide!

COMPOSITION:

Made up of 7 squadrons and a group staff
Employs nearly 500 people (traditional & full time)
35% of the 913th Airlift Group’s work force is comprised of full-time U.S. Civil Service Civilians or Air Reserve Technicians
Air Reserve Technicians maintain dual status as a traditional reservist and civil service employee
Most members of the 913th Airlift Group live locally and contribute to the Central Arkansas economy
The Group was activated on July 13, 2014 and is part of the 22nd Air Force, Air Force Reserve Command



The 29th WPS is a geographically separated unit under the USAF Weapons School, Nellis AFB, Nevada. The squadron provides graduate-level instruction for C-130J pilots running 2 courses per year.

AIRCRAFT:

“Home of C-130 Combat Airlift” – Combat-focused operators and the Formal Training Unit
Approximately 60 C-130H/J aircraft are on the flight line at any given time.

WING SNAPSHOT:

Students – Trains 350+ students on any given day

Partnerships – Partners with Lockheed Martin and CymSTAR to execute 44,000 C-130H/J simulator flight hours per year in the largest C-130 simulator complex in the world

Training – Provides capstone training and award final aircrew qualifications

International Training – Operates the DoD's largest international flying training program

International Impact – Has trained more than 800 international students from 47 nations since 2012

Heritage – Founded in 1942 as a Troop Carrier Group, the 314th has contributed to every major conflict since World War II



The 189th Airlift Wing provides elite C-130H aircrew training and worldwide airlift capability, and provides effective and prompt support to Arkansans whenever the Governor calls!

A COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATION:

PEOPLE: The majority of the 189th's 920 professional men and women – mostly drill status Guardsmen – live and work in the central Arkansas area, providing a \$53 million boost to the economy

READINESS: Guardsmen are trained and ready to serve the people of Arkansas in emergencies or natural disasters, as directed by the Governor

PARTNERSHIPS: The 189th is a key part of Team Little Rock

WING SNAPSHOT:

Training – Responsible for the C-130H Formal Training Unit (FTU) mission

EAAS – Enlisted Academic Aircrew School provides training for Air Force, international, and U.S. Marine Corps C-130 flight engineers and loadmasters

Dual Mission – More than 400 members stand ready for possible world-wide deployment

High Tempo – Flies an average of 6,000 plus hours, and 3,000 sorties per year – 10 sorties per day; 28,000 maintenance actions

Heritage – The Arkansas Air Guard has been a part of Arkansas' skies since 1925
