# Ready Warriors connect during resilience initiative: Airmen's Time

The 19th Airlift Wing hosted the first iteration of Airmen's Time at Little Rock Air Force Base, Arkansas, Feb. 14, 2020.

The intent of Airmen's time is to dedicate time for Airmen to step away from the mission and connect with their coworkers in a meaningful and purposeful way without the demands of their day-to-day tasks.

"This is an opportunity for folks to connect," said U.S. Air Force Chief Master Sgt. Justin Strain, 19th AW command chief. "We all come from different backgrounds, so giving people the opportunity to learn about others will help them lead, follow and trust the Airmen around them."

Airmen's Time is a continued effort pushed by U.S. Air Force Col. John Schutte, 19th AW commander, through his Resiliency Campaign Plan in response to the increased suicide rates Air Force wide.

This plan commenced with a resilience tactical pause allowing Airmen to come together and share candid feedback and concerns within the workplace while creating connections with supervision. After Schutte and his leadership team analyzed feedback, they developed ongoing efforts to bring the wing together.

This led to a culminating event for Phase I of the 19th AW's Resiliency Campaign Plan where Ready Warriors came together to complete a wing-wide survey, modified on-base dorms, showcased their missions at the Herk Nation Expo and Airmen joined together for Oktoberfest to finish off the day.

As one of the many initiatives taking place during Phase II of the RCP, Airmen's Time allows the continued focus on cultivating a culture where Airmen feel connected. Leadership aligned Airmen's Time with wing-wide training days. This allowed for a versatile day where shops could create their own schedule in accordance with training ensuring maximum participation.

"My unit started the day with some good old-fashioned physical training, then upper leadership made breakfast for the squadron," said U.S. Air Force Master Sgt. Chance Wisdom, 19th Comptroller Squadron and Wing Staff Agencies first sergeant. "You cannot beat waffles, bacon, sausage and eggs to bring people together. After breakfast, we watched a military-based movie, discussed how it related to our operations and themes we could apply to our shop daily going forward."

Since each unit was able to customize their day to fit their mission, Airmen were

able to better understand how they fit into everyday operations while bonding during group activities.

"We look forward to leveraging these opportunities to continue connecting with our teammates," said U.S. Air Force Master Sgt. Joseph Josen, 19th

Operations Support Squadron first sergeant. "Connecting with Airmen is not a new practice, although dedicating time monthly helps put folks in that mindset, to truly focus. The framework of Airmen's Time sets the foundation for daily connections."

# The Rock crosses the Pacific

YOKOTA AIR BASE, Japan – Airmen from Yokota Air Base welcomed four Air Mobility Command C-130J's from Little Rock Air Force Base, Arkansas, as part of a capstone exercise held Feb. 8-19.

"Yokota has a very unique AOR," said Capt. John Walitsch, 61st Airlift Squadron C-130J pilot. "By the 61st flying out, we get to enhance our skill set and learn how to fly in different parts of the world where there may be language barriers, different air space, and problems we may need to overcome."

The 19th Airlift Wing Airmen flew thousands of miles to integrate with

Pacific Air Forces C-130J's from Yokota Air Base, Japan, as part of a larger exercise culminating the 4/12 deployment initiative, a 12-month process focused on sharpening readiness and preparing for tomorrow's fight.

With the new 4/12 initiative, AMC squadrons can deploy all their aircraft at once, creating the same down-range impact with a more cohesive training unit at home and less time away from family.

Since 9/11, deployments have been four months long followed by four months home—sending a few aircraft at a time, resulting in a constant deployment rotation and a consistently

fragmented squadron at home, said Walitsch.

This training provided diverse flight operation opportunities while allowing the 41st Airlift Squadron and 61st AS to operate in the Department of Defense's largest area of responsibility.

To help the 61st adapt to a new environment, Yokota Airmen worked alongside the LRAFB Airmen, furthering their own training and strengthening their commitment to a free and open Indo-Pacific region.

"It really has been a wing effort to receive them," said Capt. Sean Boyington, 36th AS C-130J pilot and event coordinator. "We are practicing our reception

working group here, which encompasses every organization and squadron on base.

"It allows us to be able to receive incoming aircraft, house them, provide maintenance, and process their cargo. We are able to brief them on local air space and any kind of special instructions we have for this AOR, utilizing aircraft from other locations to help bolster our capability if necessary."



The 2020 Little Rock Air Force Base Compatible Use Study is a cooperative planning effort conducted as a joint venture between Little Rock AFB and Pulaski County, White County, Lonoke County, Cabot, Jacksonville, Sherwood, Lonoke, Maumelle, North Little Rock and other jurisdictions and stakeholders in proximity to the base. In addition to



the Little Rock AFB, the Study also includes lands near Camp Robinson and Blackjack Drop Zone, which are used by the Air Force, as well. The City of Jacksonville is the Compatible Use Study project sponsor and coordinating office.

The purpose of the Compatible Use Study is to encourage local governments, together with the state, to work closely with Little Rock AFB to implement measures that promote compatible development in the areas surrounding our military installations, but that also preserve the public health, safety, and welfare of those living and working near Little Rock AFB. — THIS WEEK IN HISTORY —

By Jeffrey Pryor, 19th Airlift Wing Historian

■ **1942** – The first class graduated at the U.S. Army Air School at Tuskegee, Alabama, created for black aviators. The five black military pilots included Capt. Benjamin O. Davis, who became a general and the commander of the Tuskegee Airmen. In 1998, he was promoted to four star general by President Clinton.

■ **1944** – Operation THURSDAY. Through March 11, allied aircraft and gliders airlifted Brig. Gen. Orde C. Wingate's Special Force with 9,000 personnel and 1,400 mules and horses from India at night to a location 200 miles behind enemy lines in Burma. In a unique technique, P-51 pilots cut Japanese telephone lines by attaching a weighted cable to the aircraft. This hung down like a pendulum and cut the lines as the aircraft flew over. In another, not-recommended instance, the pilot flew through the wires and broke them with his airplane.

■ **1965** – Operation Rolling Thunder begins with more than 100 United States Air Force jet bombers striking an ammunition depot at Xom Bang, 10 miles inside North Vietnam.

■ **2002** – Operation ENDURING FREEDOM. During Operation ANACONDA, the U.S. Air Force experienced its first combat deaths since the 1991 Gulf War. Two Airmen died in helicopter assaults near Gardez, Afghanistan. Operation ENDURING FREEDOM/SILVER STAR. A Kentucky Air National Guard pararescue specialist from the 123rd Special Tactics Squadron, Tech. Sgt. Keary Miller, cared for wounded troops and participated in a 15-hour firefight with nearby enemy forces after his Army special operations helicopter crashed on Taku Ghar mountain in eastern Afghanistan. For his heroism, Miller received the Silver Star, the nation's third highest award for valor.


