

Little Rock AFB Community Council wins Abilene Trophy

The Abilene Chamber of Commerce officially presented the Little Rock Air Force Base Community Council with the 2018 annual Air Mobility Command Community Support Award, known as the Abilene Trophy, at a ceremony on Little Rock AFB, May 14, 2019.

The Abilene Trophy was established in 1999 to recognize the community that best supports an Air Mobility Command base each calendar year. The Abilene Trophy was given to the Little Rock AFB

Community Council as a way to feature the outstanding support they provide Airmen, their families and the combat airlift mission.

“The support the surrounding communities give to our Airmen and their families is really incredible,” said Col. Gerald Donohue, 19th Airlift Wing commander. “What I think about as the installation commander is if I have to generate a force and send it overseas into conflict, I will have the power to get that done because of the effort this community council puts forward.”

Air Force to pay up to \$500 for spouse occupational license transfer during PCS

ARLINGTON, Va. – The Air Force announced the spouse re-licensure reimbursement program, May 15, which would provide financial relief up to \$500 to Airmen whose spouses must obtain state occupational relicensures or recertifications during a permanent change of station or assignment across state lines.

The Air Force will reimburse qualifying relicensure and recertification fees incurred during PCS/PCAs authenticated on or after Dec. 12, 2017.

“Part of taking care of Airmen and families means making it easier for spouses to continue their careers after a military move,” said Secretary of the Air Force Heather Wilson. “This policy reduces financial burdens and makes the professional careers of our Air Force spouses more portable.”

The 2018 National Defense Authorization Act authorized the military services to reimburse service members for occupational state relicensing and recertification costs their spouses incur due to a PCS/PCA. While some states authorize reciprocity for certain types of occupational licenses, not all states do, resulting in the spouse needing to update a license or certification according to the new state’s requirements.

“The strength of the nation’s Air Force

is not the platforms we operate or the technologies we employ; it is our Airmen and their families. Family readiness is Airman readiness,” said Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. David L. Goldfein.

The new policy will allow for reimbursement of relicensing fees including exams, certifications and registration, and will cover occupations such as teaching, cosmetology, real estate and nursing. Qualifying relicensing costs must be incurred and paid after and within 24 months of the date the member’s PCS/PCA orders are authenticated.

“We can’t do enough to support Air Force families. This is a positive step in the right direction to support our spouses as they pursue their own careers,” said Shon Manasco, assistant secretary of the Air Force for manpower and reserve affairs.

Public Health works toward public good

Public Health Airmen work to keep members of Little Rock Air Force Base, Arkansas, healthy from countless diseases and potentially unsafe work conditions.

They regularly perform inspections across the base and teach methods to prevent a wide variety of hazards from slowing down Team Little Rock, ensuring mission readiness.

“The saying, ‘Jack of all trades’ really does apply to public health,” said U.S. Air Force 1st Lt. Allan Licudan, 19th Aerospace Medicine Squadron officer in charge of force health management. “We have many programs, and we function both in the line side and medical side of the mission. Our ultimate goal is taking care of the members on base by keeping them healthy and deployable.”

The responsibilities of public health can be broken up into two categories: the Force

Health Management and Community Health sections. They cover a variety of duties including: deployment health, individual medical readiness, entomology and vector surveillance, communicable diseases, food protection, and sanitation. Spinning so many plates means Public Health Airmen have to expect the unexpected when they walk through their office doors.

“You never get bored here,” said U.S. Air Force Senior Airman Madison Wade, 19th AMDS public health technician. “I like the job a lot and you learn something new every day because we cover so many things.”

Along with the issues that may make their way to the 19th Medical Group, Public Health Airmen also manage to get out of their office and aid their fellow wingmen by regularly inspecting the different working environments for potential health risks, as well as all

food service centers on base.

"We do food inspections three to four times per week depending on the facility," Wade said. "We always have something going on. If the inspections don't go well, we have to route them up to our commander."

Keeping up with a regular inspection routine is important, but the most critical service offered by the public health team is a much simpler one: preventative medicine.

"Practicing preventative medicine can keep you safe from most diseases," Licudan said. "Proper hygiene and cleanliness are key factors in keeping a community healthy. If I could give one piece of advice to everyone, it'd be to just wash your hands regularly and clean up after yourself."

Team Little Rock Airmen recognized Police Week with numerous competitions and events at Little Rock Air Force Base, Arkansas, May 13-17, 2019.

“Police Week is meant to celebrate serving police officers, so the events are designed to be competition-based, but most of them require teamwork,” said U.S. Air Force Master Sgt. Justin Buchholz, 19th Security Forces NCO in charge of operations. “In the spirit of honoring [the] service of law enforcement officers, this is an opportunity to build camaraderie among our sister services and local Defenders.”

Kicking off the week was the opening ceremony paired with a 3-mile run. Defenders and many Team Little Rock members participated in numerous events such as a German armed forces course of fire competition, German armed forces proficiency badge competition, Defender's challenge, shooting competition, and many more.

Not only did Team Little Rock participate, but local law enforcement officials brought K9 teams out to compete in the hard dog/fast dog competition. Each team competed for speed of the dog and the bite intensity.

This also gave them the opportunity to train alongside K9 teams and see how they can work together for future missions.

“Our dog teams do support civilian missions,” Buchholz said. “The reason we train together is because we have an agreement that if our civilian comrades need support, we send a K9 team out and they already know how each team operates.”

Camaraderie and wingmanship developed between law enforcement units has been one that has grown since the early 1960s, when Police Week and Peace Officer's Memorial Day were first recognized nationally.

In 1962, President John F. Kennedy signed a proclamation designating May 15 as Peace Officers' Memorial Day. The week this date falls on is thereby known as Police Week and this tradition TLR follows.

The week celebrated current and past law enforcement officers but May 15 was a day to recognize law enforcement officials who have fallen in the line of duty.

“Let's continue to remember those officers since they are our heritage,” said U.S. Air Force Lt. Col. Donald Bartholomew, 19th Security Forces Squadron commander. “They left a legacy we need to carry on.”

Civic leaders worked closely with the base during a significant focus on returning to readiness throughout the year. Participating in and supporting such events as the Airlift/Tanker Association quarterly meeting, the second-annual C-130J fly-in, and advocating for critical issues important to Airmen and families, communities vigorously supported Airmen as they accomplished the mission.

"We're here to serve the base as a whole," said Annabelle M. Davis, Little Rock Air Force Base Community Council executive secretary. "This is just a testament to the communities' support of the base that

we are willing to step up and provide what they need."

Some of the major accomplishments of the community council include securing a \$330,000 grant for a cyber-security curriculum for Jacksonville High School, helping with a 50-year lease with City of Jacksonville Water Department to provide water and maintenance to Little Rock AFB, and donating nearly \$100,000 for the 2018 Thunder Over the Rock Air and Space Show while providing over 600 volunteer hours.

"No matter what we face as a team, we know there is a community supporting us, rallying around our Airmen to make sure we have what we need in order to progress and defend our nation," Donohue said.

This is the third time the Abilene Trophy has been awarded to the Little Rock AFB Community Council since 2009.






