

# DoD delays Post 9/11 GI Bill changes

GRISSOM AIR RESERVE BASE, Ind. – The Department of Defense delayed the implementation of a policy that would limit a service member's ability to share education benefits with family members.

The policy, originally slated to take effect July 12, will discontinue the transfer benefit for members with 16 years or more of service.

The implementation has been delayed until Jan. 12, 2020, giving long-serving members more time to transfer their education benefits to spouses or dependents.

Currently, members who serve a minimum of six years and commit to serving another four years can transfer their education benefits to dependents.

Those who agree to four additional years but who are unable to complete them because of a service-connected injury, medical discharge or receive a waiver can also keep their transfer benefits.

## Post 9/11 GI Bill changes

The Department of Defense delayed an issued change in policy regarding service members transferring their Post-9/11 GI Bill educational benefits. Implementation has been delayed until Jan. 12, 2020, giving long-serving members more time to transfer their education benefits to spouses or dependents.

If a service member has more than 16 years of service after Jan. 12, 2020, he or she will not be able to transfer GI bill benefits.

Purple Heart recipients will be able to transfer any unused benefits regardless of years of service.

“This extension will be significant for our Airmen, or

any service member, with longer careers,” said Senior Master Sgt. Adam Oswald, 434th Air Refueling Wing training technician. “It gives them more time to make an informed decision or start the transfer process.”

## Retired CSAF, former residents revisit TLR

Retired Chief of Staff of the Air Force Gen. Norton Schwartz, his wife, Suzie, and 19 former residents of Little Rock Air Force Base toured the installation July 13 to revisit the place each at one time called home.

The purpose of the tour was to acquaint the former residents with the current mission set of Little Rock AFB, as well as to offer a chance for lifelong friends to come together to see how the installation has evolved over the past few decades.

"It's been almost 50 years since we were here — I never dreamed I would be able to come back to this base," said Debbie Osteen Green, a former resident and tour participant.

The event began at the Jacksonville-Little Rock AFB University Center, where participants discussed with Col. John Schutte,

19th Airlift Wing commander, some of the changes the base has seen over the years and what the base was like when they were growing up.

Schutte emphasized one key thing that has not changed over the years: the partnership Team Little Rock has with the local community.

"Our community partners outside the gates provide invaluable support to our mission along with our Airmen and their families," Schutte said. "And because of the close ties we have forged, we know that our time in Central Arkansas is not just an assignment — it's a home."

Many of the former residents found that home while growing up on Little Rock AFB, specifically on Alabama Drive — a road within base housing that still has occupied houses with residents today.

"The area of Alabama Drive had a teenager in every single house," said Cindy Ptak. "And so, when you

moved in, you had an automatic group of friends."

At the end of the event, the group had the chance to stop and see Alabama Drive, reminiscing with one another about the good times and camaraderie built from living in such a close community on base.

"We played football together, we went to school together," Ptak said. "Coming back here and seeing these people — it's almost like a family reunion."

Schwartz, who served as CSAF from August 2008 to November 2012, was previously stationed at Little Rock AFB in 1974 for C-130 initial qualification training and again in 1977 as a flight examiner with the then-61st Tactical Airlift Squadron.

Since retiring from the Air Force in 2012, the Schwartz family has maintained close ties to the base and the Central Arkansas community.

U.S. Air Force Staff Sgt. Quincy Brayton, 19th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron flying crew chief, walked onto the flight line to begin his shift under the night sky not knowing the events that would soon unfold.

As three C-130Js landed, maintainers went to recover and turn the aircraft for the next mission. Brayton and his crew performed inspections while numerous aircraft specialists were on the plane performing maintenance.

It was around 2 a.m. when Brayton noticed some unusual activity coming from the power cart that had been providing electricity to the aircraft for about three or four hours.

“The power cart started backfiring,” Brayton said. “I ran up to the flight deck, ensured power was turned off to the aircraft, and ran to the power cart and hit the emergency stop.”

The backfiring caught the attention of several Airmen, including multiple supervisors and quality assurance Airmen, leading them over to investigate. Aerospace ground equipment personnel also came to determine the problem with the power cart they maintain.

“AGE came over to see what was wrong with the cart, which is when we noticed smoke was coming out of it,” Brayton said. “We opened it, and then flames started shooting out of the firewall by the exhaust, so I ran and got the fire bottle.”

Brayton had never encountered a situation like this in the four years he has served in the Air Force. Safety precautions are taken every day by following job guides and inspections, but that night Brayton had to react quickly to prevent excessive damage.

“Putting out the fire not only saved the aircraft, but also the 10 to 12 people working inside and around it,” Brayton said.

Brayton did not wait until the fire department arrived – he took it upon himself to react efficiently and use the fire bottle to put out the flames, managing to keep each Airman and the flight line safe in the process.

“I reacted the way I did because those power carts have fuel in them,” Brayton said. “If the fire would have spread, it could have become a much larger issue, and I didn’t want that to happen.”

The 19th AMXS leadership recognized Brayton during one of the production meetings thanking him for responding to the situation the way he did.

“Brayton’s quick thinking and response epitomize the values our aircraft maintainers uphold while working on the flight line,” said U.S. Air Force 1st Lt. Jordan Bauman, 19th AMXS assistant officer in charge. “As a leader on the flight line, his diligence and action safeguarded tens of thousands of dollars’ worth of Air Force assets, which prevented a loss of critical maintenance time directly affecting mission continuity.”

“We don’t do our job for recognition,” Brayton said. “Some people do their job because they have to, some people do their job because they love it, but for the most part, we do our job to make sure the aircrew are safe and the mission can progress to maintain combat airlift.”

# No rest for the pest: 19th CES pest management

With the health and welfare of Team Little Rock being a top priority, one flight's main goal is to prevent pests from adversely affecting Airmen.

The 19th Civil Engineer Squadron Pest Management Flight ensures the mission remains on track by establishing and maintaining safe, effective and environmentally sound integrated pest management programs.

"Our job is to control disease vectors and pests to prevent the mission from coming to a halt," said U.S. Air Force Airman 1st Class Laura O'Connor, 19th Civil Engineer Squadron pest management apprentice. "One of our bigger tasks is conducting daily sweeps along the flight line to ensure the weeds are controlled, as well as checking for animals that could prevent an aircraft from taking off."

Once pest control is called, the process begins. In the majority of cases, they head

to the site to confirm the pest problem. Then, determine the best way to get rid of the problem with the least amount of chemicals possible to both protect the Airmen in addition to the animals, allowing a chance for relocation.

"A big misconception we have around base is we kill the animals we capture," said Billy Graves, 19th Civil Engineer Squadron pest management coordinator. "In reality, 99 percent of them will be relocated or rehabilitated off base."

Recently a C-130J Super Hercules was preparing for departure and was swarming with bees. A queen bee had attempted to make a hive inside the wing of the aircraft, drawing in another few thousand bees. Unable to begin the mission on time, the pest management flight and two local beekeepers went to safely capture all the bees and properly relocate them to a bee farm.

Not only does the flight respond to calls,

they also make sure to remain proactive, coordinating the best time to spray for pests before an infestation occurs.

"We do preventative maintenance on facilities to ensure cleanliness standards are being upheld keeping pests at bay," O'Connor said.

Having a shop consisting of only four members means each individual has a lot of responsibilities alongside necessary leadership roles required to support operations.

"A big part of being good at your job

is enjoying what you do," Graves said. "O'Connor comes to work every day ready to go, looking forward to what the day has in store."

O'Connor said she enjoys coming across a trapped animal. After an animal is trapped, she ensures the animal is in good health before relocating them off base to Holland Bottoms State Wildlife Management Area.

O'Connor and the four-member team secure the mission's success by providing a pest-free environment allowing Airmen to maintain combat airlift around the clock.




