The installation's economic impact on the local community is calculated from local area spending based on budgetary expenditures.

For the computation of average pay, the local community includes Little Rock, North Little Rock, and Conway. All information captured herein is current as of Nov. 7, 2022.

The total value of Little Rock Air Force Base's economic impact is \$1.79 billion.
