## **Economic Impact**

The Economic Impact Statement (EIS) provides unclassified information about the resources and economic impact of Little Rock AFB on the surrounding community.

This document is made available to senior military officials, federal, state, and local officials, as well as local business leaders and visitors to the base.

The installation's economic impact on the local community is calculated from local area spending based on budgetary expenditures.

For the computation of average pay, the local community includes Little Rock, North Little Rock, and Conway. All information captured herein is current as of March 1, 2024.

The total value of Little Rock Air Force Base's economic impact is \$1.38 billion.
