LITTLE ROCK FAMILY HOUSING

FIREPIT AND CHIMNEA GUIDELINES

General Rules

- Tenants may not construct, dig, or use non-commercial fire-burning equipment.
- Tenants must carry sufficient insurance to cover property damage or personal injury related to firepit/chiminea use.
- All state, county, local, and military installation regulations must be followed.
- If a **burn ban** is issued, all firepit/chiminea use is strictly prohibited.

Usage Requirements

- Hours of usage will be set by the Owner.
- Firepits/chimineas must be used **only in backyards**, never in common areas or front/side yards.
- Fires must be **small and manageable** (≤ **3 feet in diameter**).
- A competent adult must supervise the fire until fully extinguished.
- Fires are prohibited within 15 feet of structures or combustible
 materials (siding, fences, tree limbs, sheds, awnings, power lines, etc.).
- Keep a fire extinguisher, garden hose, or water bucket nearby.
- Place equipment only on **noncombustible flat surfaces**.
- No accelerants may be used to start fires. Burning trash,
 painted/stained wood, or construction debris is prohibited.

- Fires are not allowed when winds exceed 10 mph.
- Fires must be extinguished if smoke interferes with neighbors' enjoyment of their property.

Ash Disposal

- Wait at least 24 hours after extinguishing before handling ashes.
- Use a metallic shovel to remove cooled ash.
- Place ash in a dedicated metal bucket never in a trash can.

Storage

Store firepit/chiminea equipment in the garage, carport, or back
 patio only after it has cooled completely.

Firewood

- Firewood may not be stored inside the home.
- Firewood must be stored at least 22 feet away from buildings to prevent insect infestation.
- Tenants are responsible for any damage caused by improper firewood storage.
