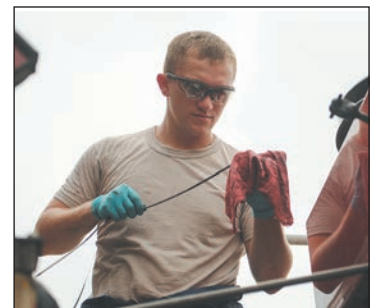

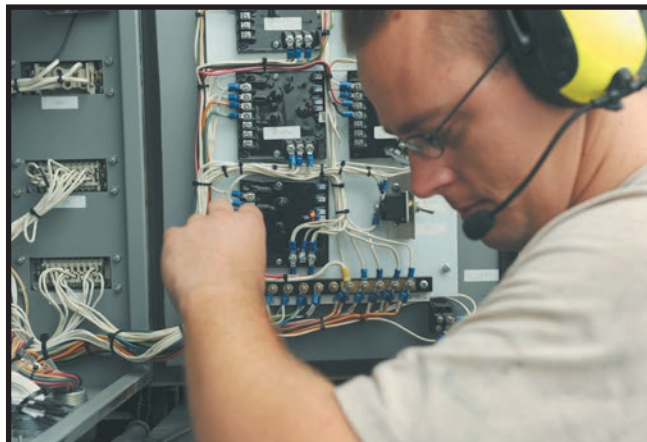

*The 19th Logistics Readiness Squadron vehicle management flight's mission is to provide Team Little Rock with the most reliable transportation possible and to maintain its \$52 million and 529-vehicle fleet in the utmost safe and serviceable condition. The 19th LRS vehicle management flight consists of six different shops: vehicle management and analysis, general purpose, special purpose, fire-truck maintenance, material handling equipment and refueling maintenance. Vehicle management maintains and services all Team Little Rock's general purpose transportation as well as fire protection vehicles, cargo loaders, forklifts, aircraft refueling vehicles, flightline support and civil engineering heavy equipment. The flight also conducts maintenance on vehicles that support training missions at Fort Polk and Alexandria Air Park, La. The vehicle management flight plays a key role in TLR's mission generation by providing its personnel with safe and serviceable transportation that's capable of safely loading, unloading and servicing the world's largest C-130 fleet and sustaining fire protection for all base personnel, residents and assets.*

## SCORECARD: 314TH AIRLIFT WING

The 314th Airlift Wing is the nation's C-130 "Center of Excellence." The wing is responsible for training C-130 aircrew members from across the Department of Defense, to include the Coast Guard and 46 allied nations. # BAH recertification process still underway

In March 2014, the Air Force announced the basic allowance for housing recertification process. The Air Force-wide initiative was established to allow the Air Force to validate Airmen's BAH entitlements and ensure every dollar spent on BAH is auditable.

Financial service analysts at Little Rock Air Force Base have been working diligently to ensure the base is compliant with the expectations by the Dec. 31 deadline. The team has taken great strides in the recertification process and looks at the deadline with confidence.

"We are currently at 87 percent complete," said Staff Sgt. Arielle Wilson, the 19th Comptroller financial services supervisor. "The 19th CPTS must complete BAH recertification for Little Rock AFB and all geographically separated units by Dec. 31, 2014. We only have

11 squadrons left to revalidate."

The process for Team Little Rock members has been rolling along quickly and smoothly. The remainder of the squadrons will receive notification by the financial services office and will have 30 days to provide the required documentation. If the documentation is not provided in the allotted amount of time, Airmen will have their housing allowance status reduced to single-rate BAH. Airmen deployed, on extended leave or temporary duty will be give special consideration in meeting the 30-day deadline.

Although the recertification process has gone smoothly, some discrepancies were found. The financial services office quickly acquired all necessary documents from each member and updated their pay records.

"We had a few members with significant underpayments," said Wilson. "We quickly identified the discrepancy, however, and paid

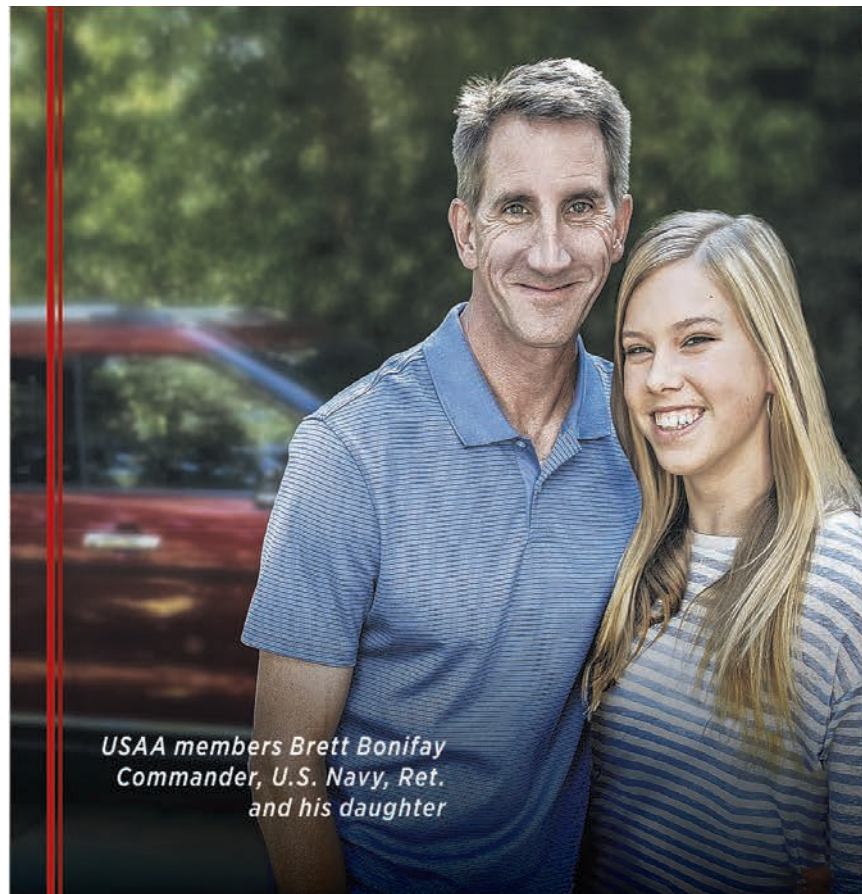
back the member their due entitlements."

The Air Force is making every effort possible to save money and ensure the public knows how taxpayer dollars are being spent.

In a recent memorandum regarding the BAH recertification process, Gen. Mark A. Welsh III, Air Force Chief of Staff explained the necessity of the revalidation process and what it means to the community the Air Force supports.

"America entrusts the Air Force not only to spend taxpayer dollars wisely and efficiently, but also to account and justify that expenditure," said Welsh. "Preparation for this important and legislatively-mandated effort rests in the hands of every Airman, not just the financial community."

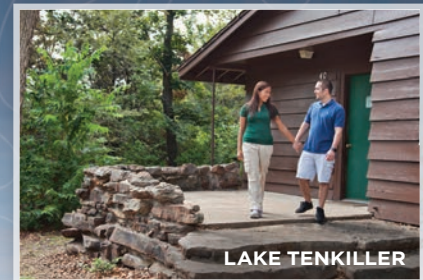

# Little Rock Air Force Base turns 59

Little Rock Air Force Base celebrated its 59th Anniversary on Oct. 9. Since the inception of the base, in 1955, partnership has been part of its foundation, and the Team Little Rock partnership would not have been possible without the community 59 years ago.

In 1951, local leaders sent a letter to the Secretary of the Air Force to propose building an Air Force base near Little Rock. In January 1952, the Air Force agreed to the proposal and made plans to build the base. By September of the same year, community members had raised nearly \$1 million to contribute 6,100 acres to the establishment of the base.

From the funds raised by the local community, land was purchased from more than 150 landowners and construction of the base began Dec. 8, 1953. By Sept. 10, 1955, air traffic started to flow in and out of the base, and Little Rock Air Force Base was airborne.

Nearly a month later the base was officially dedicated Oct. 9, 1955. The Secretary of the Air Force, Donald Quarles, and Gen. Curtis LeMay, Strategic Air Command commander, were in attendance as well as approximately 85,000 visitors from the community.

"Since that time, Little Rock Air Force Base has been home to a wide variety of aircraft and weapon systems that have provided global vigilance, reach, and power," said Col. Rhatigan, 19th Airlift Wing commander, in his Herk Call newsletter.

The base has been host to many aircraft and missions including the RB-47, RF-101 Voodoo, KC-97, KC-135, as well as the B-58 Hustler and even the Titan II missiles. Many commanders have come and gone, along with squadrons, groups and wings.

Currently the home of C-130 combat airlift, Little Rock AFB finds itself constantly transforming. All Airmen, civilian and active duty, Guard and Reserve, instructors and students, work in partnership to create one Team Little Rock.

"Even as we celebrate this year's anniversary, we're already making plans for a big 60th Anniversary bash next year," said Rhatigan. "The Little Rock Air Force Base Community Council is very excited about the opportunity to recognize our rich heritage and to honor the Airmen of Little

Rock, both past and present."

In order to celebrate not only the 59th anniversary of The Rock, but the upcoming 60th anniversary in 2015 as well, the 19th Airlift Wing will be delving into the exciting history of Little Rock AFB and encouraging Airmen and their families to follow suit.

- Although Columbus did not 'discover' America, his voyage initiated regular contact between America and Europe.



## Retreat: The story behind the salute

Every duty day at Little Rock Air Force Base ends with a loud bugle call heard across the installation through the “Giant Voice” speaker system. At this time, people who are outside stop what they are doing and face the flag or music. Vehicles come to a halt, and salutes are rendered by all military service members in uniform.

The ceremony is called Retreat and is held at most U.S. military installations. Since the birth of the U.S. Air Force in 1947, Airmen have performed retreat ceremonies at the end of every official duty day.

Retreat ceremonies date back to the French Army during the Crusades-era. Originally, the bugle call was sounded at sunset, and its purpose was to communicate specific orders. It was meant to instruct sentries to be vigilant until sunrise and to tell the other troops to remain safe in their quarters throughout the night.

The tradition made its way to the U.S. when the American Army observed the ritual during the Revolutionary War and implemented Retreat with the sound of drums.

Commanders now designate a specific time for the Retreat ceremony. At Little Rock AFB, the call rendered during the week at 4:30 p.m.

After the initial bugle call is sounded, the “The Star-Spangled Banner” is played.

When Retreat sounds, service members who are outside should face the flag, or music if unable to locate a flag, and stand at parade rest. At the first note of the national anthem, the service member will come to the position of attention and render a salute. Those in civilian clothes should remove any headgear and place their right hand over their heart.

At some bases, the U.S. flag is lowered and folded each day toward the end of the Retreat ceremony and a cannon is fired. The legend surrounding the ceremony suggests that a gun or cannon was originally fired to drive away evil spirits.

Today, Retreat symbolizes more than the end of the official duty day. For many, it holds a significant purpose.

“I never realized how important Retreat was until I joined the Honor Guard,” said Airman 1st Class Kelsey Cook, a 19th Airlift Wing honor guardsman. “Some ceremonies seem trivial, but when you look at the true meaning, it really hits home.”

The observance also serves as a reminder of the sacrifices made by all service members. It allows Airmen to reflect on their own commitment to the Nation. Retreat remains an American tradition to this day.

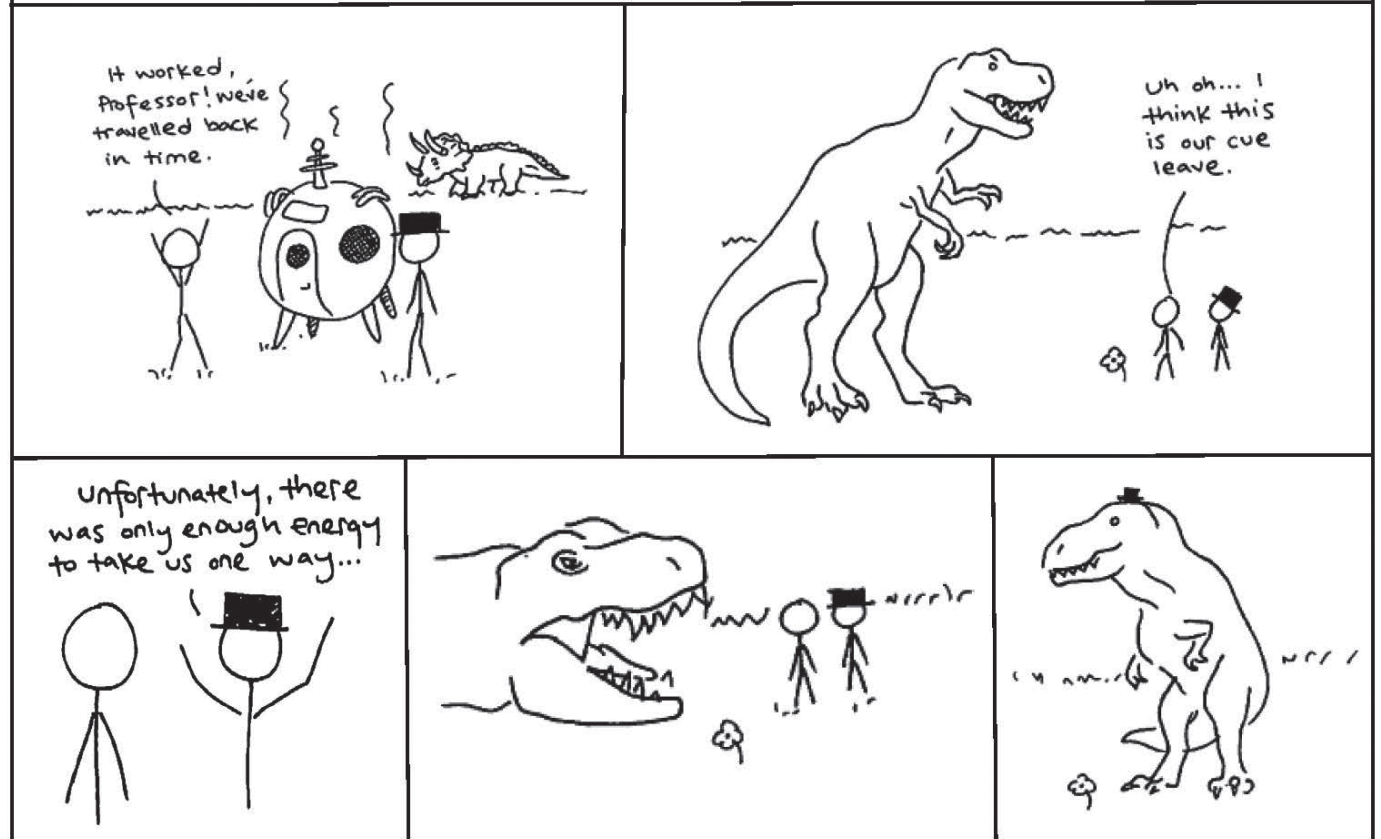

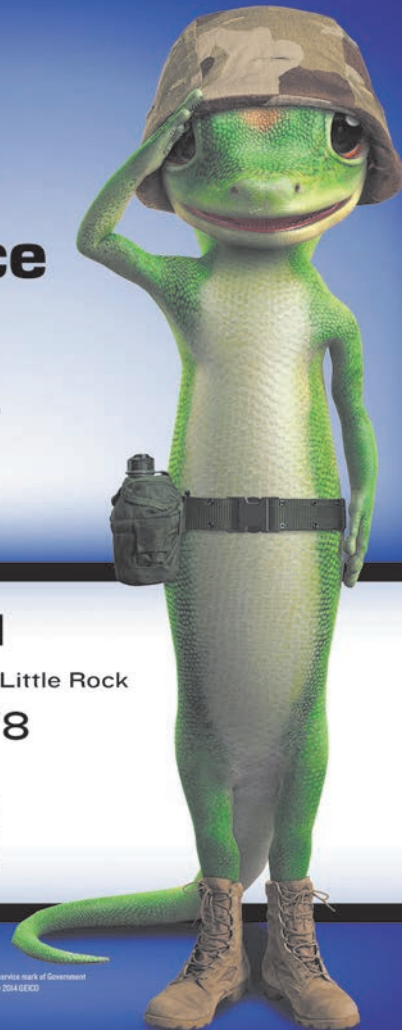

**New Leave Accrual guidelines**

The portion of the 2013 National Defense Authorization Act that authorized members to accrue leave up to 75 days is set to expire 30 September 2015. Effective 01 October 2015, unless Congress extends the authorization between now and then, members will only be allowed to accrue 60 days of leave. At that point, any accrued leave over 60 days will be lost if not used.

However, members may still qualify for Special Leave Accrual on a case by case basis.

The accrued leave increase to 75 days was originally authorized in 2008, as a result of members' inability to use accrued leave due to deployments and other mission requirements.

Members should be cognizant of their leave balances throughout the fiscal year and coordinate any accrued leave over 60 days through the appropriate channels. Otherwise, they may risk losing up to 15 days of ordinary leave should Congress not extend the authorization.
