# How ISIS was defeated in Iraq

(Hint: It's thanks in part to air-ground teamwork)

WASHINGTON (AFNS) – For more than three years, the people of Iraq have endured unspeakable suffering under the dark shadow of Islamic State terrorists. That shadow has now receded, as a result of the defeat of the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria forces that was declared in early December by Iraqi Prime Minister Haider al-Abadi.

As commander of 21,000 coalition Airmen who continue to fight alongside our Iraqi partners to fully annihilate ISIS and prevent its return, it's my privilege to congratulate our Iraqi allies on this historic occasion and pause to honor the thousands who perished in the brave fight.

Every inch of ground the Iraqi Security Forces pried from ISIS is testament to their courage in the face of desperate enemy forces who employed suicide bombers, routinely shielded themselves with civilians and rigged schools and homes with explosives.

The Iraqi Security Forces paid dearly to free their country, but they were never alone. Every step of their advance was covered by coalition airpower and enabled by air-ground teamwork.

Air-ground teamwork is nothing new. The U.S. military and its coalition partners have trained for years to ensure that air and ground forces can operate seamlessly. Yet the campaign to defeat ISIS ushered in a new approach.

Instead of a large U.S. and coalition ground force shouldering the effort, we worked with our local partners, who were supported by a small footprint of coalition conventional and special operations ground troops, all enabled by ever-present coalition air forces.

Throughout the fight, coalition airpower, along with an increasingly capable Iraqi Air Force, provided the Iraqi Security Forces an asymmetric advantage over

their enemies. When Iraqi Security Forces fighters were pinned down by fire, coalition air controllers embedded with them called in precision airstrikes to silence the enemy.

When suicide vehicle bombers raced towards exposed Iraqi Security Forces fighters, airpower delivered precision weapons to stop the enemy forces from completing their grisly mission.

This complex teamwork spanned the globe and required extensive synchronization to ensure it worked in harmony. Surveillance aircraft - including unmanned aircraft flown by Airmen in the U.S. - served as the Iraqi Security Force's eyes to monitor ISIS around the clock and provide intelligence.

Coalition planners in Qatar used this intelligence to develop airstrikes to the smallest detail, from weapon selection to timing, in order to effectively destroy targets

while minimizing civilian casualties.

Coalition reconnaissance aircraft served as the ears of Iraqi Security Forces, intercepting ISIS conversations and warning of impending attacks. Airborne refuelers ensured this protective blanket of aircraft remained in the skies 24/7.

Coalition planners worked tirelessly so the Iraqi Security Forces' ground attacks were in lockstep with the air plan. Our Iraqi allies advanced when our aircraft were overhead, and paused to rest when they were not. Together, we shaped the battlefield.

Before Iraqi Security Forces advanced to liberate Tal Afar, weeks of persistent surveillance and precision airstrikes targeted vehicle bombs like those used against the Iraqi Security Forces in the previous battle for Mosul.

By removing this threat early, our Iraqi allies liberated Tal Afar in a 12-day battle where only a handful of vehicle bombs were detonated. By creatively adjusting our tactics, we wrote a new chapter in the history of air-ground teamwork and liberated a nation.

The citizens of Iraq, especially those displaced by the difficult and destructive urban fights, now begin the slow process of returning home and rebuilding. As reliable partners, coalition nations and non-governmental organizations have begun to help, starting with clearing out booby traps and rigged explosives left behind by ISIS.

Much hard work remains. Providing basic safety and security is the first challenge, because no rehabilitation can happen without a secure and stable environment.

The liberation of Iraq does not spell the end of the fight. Coalition and Iraqi airmen continue to patrol the skies, hunting ISIS' demoralized remnants to prevent their return. We will continue to hone our air-ground teamwork to safeguard the hard-won gains. As Iraqis celebrate their newfound liberty, it is worth pausing to embrace an accomplishment achieved together.

# 774th EAS continues tactical airlift operations in Afghanistan

BAGRAM AIRFIELD, Afghanistan – Utilizing the C-130J Super Hercules powerful performance and tactical abilities, the 774th Expeditionary Airlift Squadron continuously accomplishes its mission in an austere environment where other airframes have fallen short.

Since being redesignated the 774th EAS on Dec. 4, 2001 and activated at Bagram Airfield, Afghanistan, on Jan. 6, 2006, the Weasel Squadron has been the only tactical airlift squadron currently deployed to this area of responsibility.

“Our mission is to provide and sustain the logistical bridge for Operation’s Freedom’s Sentinel and Resolute Support through combat airlift, airdrop, and aeromedical evacuation,” said Lt. Col Angela Ochoa, 774th EAS commander. “With the assistance we provide, our coalition partners are able to continue the train, advise, and assist campaign.”

The 774th EAS operates the C-130J, which is capable of taking off and landing from austere, unimproved dirt strips and is the prime transport for airdropping troops and equipment into hostile areas.

“Our crews perform wet wing defuel operations at austere airfields (downloading fuel from internal fuel tanks with engines running) in order to keep forward operating bases operational,” said Maj. Danny Bellissimo, 774th EAS deputy officer. “In addition to air land and airdrop, the 774th, in conjunction with 455th Expeditionary Aeromedical Evacuation Squadron, executes aeromedical evacuation of routine patients and battlefield injured troops.”

Ochoa stressed the importance in teamwork in order to continue mission success for the squadron.

“Teamwork is absolutely critical to the ‘tactical airlift’ mission,” said Ochoa. “Tac airlift has been a vital component of every major campaign since our roots in the Army Air Corps, but it is more than what we do. What makes an Airman a tac airlifter is the mindset that we bring to the fight—whatever or wherever the mission is, we will find a way to yes and make it happen. Tac airlift doesn’t happen because of one person, but because the entire team comes together with their own unique talents and ideas to make it happen, whatever ‘it’ is.”

Even though the 774th EAS has been providing successful critical airlift operations for the AOR for more than 11

years, it still faces some challenges in this austere environment.

“The most challenging aspect of our mission is communication across all our partners,” said Ochoa. “We provide combat airlift for a variety of customers across the country, with a controlling agency over 1,000 miles away, and report to a local chain of command,” referring to the Combined Air Operations Center at Al Udeid, Air Base, Qatar.

“Our mission is executed alongside professionals from the maintenance, aeromedical evacuation, logistics, and security forces squadrons,” she added.

According to Ochoa, the 774th EAS is the central node to deliver 24/7 combat airlift.

“Since our rotation’s arrival to Afghanistan in Sept., the 774th EAS has flown 355 missions, amounting to 1,655 combat sorties, and over 1,800 hours flown,” said Bellissimo. “During that time, the Weasel Squadron has airlifted 8,800 cargo tons, 14,400 passengers, 102 Distinguish Visitors, 30 patients, and de-fueled over 300,000lbs of fuel. In addition, the 774 completed two paratroop High Altitude Low Opening airdrops.”

Bellissimo added that since being at BAF, the squadron have seen an increase of over 350% of the wet-wing defuel capability employed in comparison to this time last year and 46% more than the previous rotation.

“Also, we have seen an increase of 18% of the missions supported from the previous rotation, resulting in an increase of 30% of cargo and passengers delivered in the same amount of time,” said Bellissimo. “We are doing so with the same amount of aircraft and people. We’re just working more efficiently and effectively to maximize our limited resources.”

The Weasel Squadron is a close knit family and is expected to take care of one another, which in return will take of the mission.

“The Weasels deliver unrivaled combat airlift, no matter who, what, when or where, we will find a way to get it there,” said Ochoa. “I expect precise and professional mission execution. I demand that we take care of each other and make our mark to make the team and each other better. I ask everyone to critically think about and modernize how we deliver combat airlift so that we can continue to create and grow. The final ingredient to our success is that we have fun, because if you aren’t having fun then you are doing it wrong.”





# ALS instruct

Staff Sgt. Keith Debose, an Airman Leadership School instructor, found a way to give back by combining two loves of his life: the military and Jiu Jitsu.

Within the Air Force it is highly suggested to give back to the community through volunteer work. However, it can at times be a struggle for Airmen to find a volunteer opportunity that mirrors their passions as well as off-duty interest.

“I was never a fan of volunteering before,” Debose said. “Thankfully, I had a supervisor who made it a point to explain to me why volunteering is important.”

Debose found a deep love for Jiu Jitsu. It was a new form he could learn and it kept him in shape.

“Once I’m done instructing for the day, it’s straight to the gym to go roll (the practice of fighting for position and submission),” he said. “I train six to seven times a week. It’s definitely something I’m very passionate about.”

With a strong sense of passion for the military and Jiu Jitsu, and the advice of his supervisor, Debose began conducting research. He wanted to find a way to make volunteering something he truly enjoyed. After talking with some of his friends and learning about what they went through, as combat veterans, he was steered in the direction of finding a non-profit organization.

“Last year, I wanted to raise awareness for veterans suffering from post-traumatic stress disorder,” Debose said. “I wanted to show people that rolling for 24-hours is willing, and I could quit at any moment, but there are others out there who have to deal with things like PTSD every day. It’s part of their life.”

Debose came up with the idea to create a Roll-a-thon Fundraiser. The Roll-a-thon is a 24-hour endurance based training event that focuses on takedowns, pins or control leading to submissions by joint lock or strangle hold. The 2016 event had a good turn out and was very well received.

Again, in 2017, Debose wanted to find a way to help alleviate stress for others. The Roll-a-thon created that opportunity. With the help of his Jiu Jitsu teammates, a second Roll-a-thon Fundraiser was successful.


The money raised in 2017 went to a non-profit organization Debose used the previous year, and would help rebuild United States Marine Corps retired Sgt. Eric Morante’s house, making it 100 percent handicapped accessible.

“I feel like I’m doing something that matters,” Debose said. “This is really important to me and I can’t see myself stopping any time soon.”

# Iraqi air force graduates first C-130 craftsman maintenance technicians

MUTHANA AIR BASE, Iraq (AFNS) – The Iraqi Air Force certified its first 7-level craftsman C-130 Hercules maintenance technicians in a ceremony on Dec. 27.

The occasion represents a landmark in the Iraqi Air Force's goal of achieving self-sufficiency through the development of its own skilled technical workforce. Currently they rely on C-130J contract logistics support teams to provide the same skills, at a cost of approximately \$140 million per year.

The new capability to train and certify craftsman technicians will enable the government of Iraq to redirect funds away from contractor requirements to efforts of rebuilding infrastructure and cities and promoting stability and economic progression.

"Today marks another forward step for the Iraqi Air Force towards a brighter future," said Iraqi Air Force Brig. Gen. Husni Khazaal Al maliki, Al Muthana Technical Wing commander. "A promising future that I could see reflected in the faces of all of our graduates, due to their achievements. The dedication and hard work are very appreciated by both the students and their instructors. At the same time, I urge all graduates to continue this hard work throughout their professional life in the Iraqi Air Force and to help this wounded country stand strong against enemies of humanity."

During the ceremony, Husni thanked the instructors and air advisors assigned to the 770th Air Expeditionary Advisor Squadron for making sacrifices to help Iraq and for being away from their families and friends during the holiday season.

In 2006, advisors from the 770th AEAS began introducing career field education training plans to Iraqi Air Force

work center. CFETPs are comprehensive education and training documents which identify the training requirements and minimum core tasks needed for technicians to be signed off as being proficient in a specialty.

Upon a recent review of Iraqi Air Force aircraft maintenance proficiency data, the advisors identified a critical shortage of certified 7-level craftsmen maintainers. Craftsmen are expected to be fully qualified technicians who have proven they are ready to fill various supervisory and management positions.

The air advisors also determined there was a need to establish a maintenance training standard comparable to the U.S. Air Force, which requires 40 percent of qualified personnel to have their 7-level certification.

Lt. Col. Ronald Llantada, 770th AEAS commander, said this 40 percent target will enable the Iraqi Air Force to take care of their home station aircrew training and mission requirements. This will give them the ability to employ their C-130J aircraft at other locations dictated by their mission.

Llantada commended his team for objectively assessing and identifying the training requirements required to improve Iraqi Air Force capabilities, enabling them to achieve the self-sufficiency they desire. He said their work generated a great return of effort and set a path for their replacements to continue the forward progression.

"As advisors, relationships greatly matter when trying to move the ball forward in a partnered journey," said Llantada. "I would like to personally thank Brig. Gen. Husni for being receptive to our team's recommendations, being ready to make decisions for the betterment of the Iraqi Air Force and for his hospitality and a friendship."

Husni echoed this sentiment.

# Winterize your Home



- ### 1. KEEP FAUCETS DRIPPING



When the weather is very cold outside, let the cold water drip from the faucet served by exposed pipes. Running water through the pipe - even at a trickle - help prevent pipes from freezing.
- ### 2. SET THERMOSTAT



Keep the same temperature both day and night. You may incur a higher heating bill, but you can prevent a much more costly repair job if pipes freeze and burst.

If you will be going away during cold weather, leave the heat on in your home. Set to a temperature no lower than 55 degrees F.
- ### 3. OPEN CABINETS THAT CONTAIN PLUMBING



When the weather is very cold outside, let the cold water drip from the faucet served by exposed pipes. Running water through the pipe - even at a trickle - help prevent pipes from freezing.
- ### 4. CLOSE GARAGE DOORS



Keep the garage door closed in order to prevent the pipes inside from freezing
- ### 5. WRAP PIPES



Use a heating tape product to wrap pipes that are located in unheated areas. Both hot and cold water pipes should be insulated
- ### 6. INSULATE



Add insulation to attics, basements and crawl spaces. Insulation will maintain higher temperatures in these areas.
- ### 7. REPORT



Be sure to report incidents as soon as they occur.

Also report any unusual conditions, such as particularly cold indoor temperatures or the smell of smoke.

### SAVES Level 1

“The SAVES program is very similar to the force protection conditions,” said Stephanie Wynn, 19th Airlift Wing community support coordinator. “There are three levels that are colored coded: green, yellow and red depending on the amount of incidents occurring within a 60-day rolling period.”

Saves LEVEL ONE indicates a steady state where day-to-day operations are meant to be maintained indefinitely, similar to FPCON Alpha. This includes random entry point checks at base gates.




