Under Secretary of the AF highlights budget, readiness

WASHINGTON (AFNS) – The ability to adapt and stay ahead of potential adversaries is one of the greatest challenges the Air Force faces, Under Secretary of the Air Force Matthew Donovan said during an Air Force Association breakfast in Washington, D.C., on Jan. 18.

To help meet this challenge, the Air Force is focusing on a budget that will further the service down its path to improving readiness. The service has initiated a zero-base budget review program for the first time in more than two decades.

“The idea here is to get after the relevancy of what we’re doing,” said Donovan. “We’ll look at each and every program and requirement to see if it’s increasing our lethality for the future threat environment as we prepare for (fiscal year 2020) and the Future Years Defense Plan, and ensure we’re getting the best use of every taxpayer dollar.”

Fiscal 2018’s budget keeps with the previous year’s focus on readiness and capacity by keeping funding on track for the F-35 Lightning II, KC-46 Pegasus,

B-21 Raider and other important programs. However, Donovan warned that a continuing resolution would have a negative effect on manpower and on these programs.

“The further along you go into the fiscal year, with the short term CR’s, the more

likely a full term CR becomes and that’s not a good thing for us,” said Donovan. “It will have damaging impacts (with) readiness and modernization taking the biggest hits.”

Looking toward the future, Donovan highlighted the fiscal 2019 President’s Budget request – a strategy-driven budget that aligns with the direction of the new National Security Strategy and with the objectives of the new National Defense Strategy. For the Air Force, the fiscal 2019 request builds the size and mix of capabilities the service needs to compete, deter and win in the joint environment by focusing on people, readiness, modernization, nuclear deterrence and space.

Despite future budget uncertainties, the military and the Air Force is ready to support any military options that may be required and the Air Force will prevail.

“We are still the greatest air and space force on the planet,” said Donovan.

TRICARE changing prescription copayments

Beginning Feb. 1, 2018, copayments for prescription drugs at TRICARE Pharmacy Home Delivery and retail pharmacies will increase. These changes are required by law and affects all TRICARE beneficiaries except active-duty service members, dependent survivors and medically retired service members and their dependents.

While retail pharmacy and home delivery copayments will increase, prescriptions filled at military pharmacies remain available at no cost. Patients can save the most money by filling prescriptions at military pharmacies.

"Military pharmacies and TRICARE Pharmacy Home Delivery will remain the lowest cost pharmacy option for TRICARE beneficiaries," said U.S. Air Force Lt. Col. Ann McManis, Defense Health Agency Pharmacy Operations Division.

TRICARE groups pharmacy drugs into three categories: generic formulary, brand name formulary and non-formulary. Individuals pay the least for generic formulary drugs and the most for non-formulary drugs, regardless of whether they receive prescriptions via home delivery or a retail pharmacy.

Retail network pharmacy copayment changes (up to a 30-day supply)

■ Non-formulary drugs will increase from \$50 to \$53. Non-formulary drugs are generally only available through home delivery.

TRICARE pharmacy home delivery copayment changes (up to a 90-day supply)

■ Generic formulary drugs will increase from \$0 to \$7.

■ Brand-name formulary drugs will

increase from \$20 to \$24.

■ Non-formulary drugs will increase from \$50 to \$53.

■ Military treatment facility pharmacy copayment changes

Beneficiaries can still fill their prescriptions for no cost at military treatment facility pharmacies.

"Patients wishing to switch to a military treatment facility from mail-order medications must get a new prescription from their doctor; those wanting

to switch from off base pharmacies are not required to but may do the same or request a transfer of medications at the military treatment facility pharmacy," said Maj. Rachel Copeland, 19th Medical Group Pharmacy Flight Commander. "We aren't able to accept transfers of prescriptions from-mail order, so patients are encouraged to visit the military treatment facility pharmacy before they run out of medicine."

Copeland added that patients need to contact Express Scripts to cancel any future automatic refills for any prescription they want to receive from the military treatment facility.



In-service recruiter guides Little Rock Airmen to AF Reserve

Many Airmen who separate from active duty want to continue serving their country without a break in service. One way to do that is by joining the Air Force Reserve.

Tech. Sgt. Maritza Moore, Central Recruiting Squadron Air Force Reserve in-service recruiter, is responsible for recruiting Airmen separating from active-duty service into the Air Force Reserve at Little Rock Air Force Base, Ark.

The in-service recruiter is there to help guide active-duty Airmen to a career in the Reserve without a break in service through the Palace Chase and Palace Front programs.

The Palace Chase program is for Airmen who don't have a date of separation, but want to get out of their active-duty role early and join the Reserve.

For Airmen to become eligible for the Palace Chase program, they must have either completed a full enlistment or have completed half of their current enlistment. This process can take anywhere from six to eight months.

The Palace Front program is for Airmen who already have a date of separation. The members separating are required to meet with the in-service recruiter a minimum of six months before their separation date.

"It's our job to find the people that are getting out [of the Air Force] and contact

them months in advance to offer them these programs," Moore said.

Airmen separate from active duty for numerous reasons such as being unable to cross-train into their desired career field or being unable to promote. Fortunately for them, the Reserve have a different system for promotion along with opportunities to cross-train, Moore said.

"Unlike active duty, to promote you don't have

to test against everybody, you're basically testing against yourself," Moore said. "You make sure your fitness is good, your professional military education is completed and when you can test, just test."

Joining the Reserve has many benefits including health insurance, the Reserve GI bill adding to the GI bill active-duty Airmen already earn,

tuition assistance and Airmen keep their rank.

The Reserve has many full-time jobs similar to active duty like a military training instructor or an in-service recruiter, Moore said.

"I am here as a counselor or an assistant to help active-duty members transition to the Reserve, so when they go back home they have a job lined up," Moore said.



Legal Blotter: Fourth quarter 2017

COURTS-MARTIAL

■ A Staff Sergeant assigned to the 19th Operations Support Squadron was found guilty of one violation of Article 112A – Wrongful use of methamphetamine, a schedule II controlled substance, and received a reduction to Airman Basic and seven days confinement.

ARTICLE 15 ACTIONS (NON-JUDICIAL PUNISHMENT)





Winterize your Home




1. KEEP FAUCETS DRIPPING



When the weather is very cold outside, let the cold water drip from the faucet served by exposed pipes. Running water through the pipe - even at a trickle - help prevent pipes from freezing.

2. SET THERMOSTAT



Keep the same temperature both day and night. You may incur a higher heating bill, but you can prevent a much more costly repair job if pipes freeze and burst.

If you will be going away during cold weather, leave the heat on in your home. Set to a temperature no lower than 55 degrees F.

3. OPEN CABINETS THAT CONTAIN PLUMBING



When the weather is very cold outside, let the cold water drip from the faucet served by exposed pipes. Running water through the pipe - even at a trickle - help prevent pipes from freezing.

4. CLOSE GARAGE DOORS



Keep the garage door closed in order to prevent the pipes inside from freezing.

5. WRAP PIPES



Use a heating tape product to wrap pipes that are located in unheated areas. Both hot and cold water pipes should be insulated.

6. INSULATE



Add insulation to attics, basements and crawl spaces. Insulation will maintain higher temperatures in these areas.

7. REPORT



Be sure to report incidents as soon as they occur.

Also report any unusual conditions, such as particularly cold indoor temperatures or the smell of smoke.


