

# Spouses key to mission success

Spouses of service members currently attending Airman Leadership School took their seat at the table May 3 and their importance to the Air Force mission was reaffirmed by Col. Gerald Donohue, 19th Airlift Wing commander.

“The transition from Airman to NCO is a pivotal transition in an Airman’s career,” Donohue said. “I want to make sure that transition happens for each of our Airmen and, more importantly, for each of their families. Your Airmen wouldn’t be successful in the Air Force without your support.”

The goal of including military spouses early on is to help them understand the military and how it functions as well to help them support their Airmen. By doing so, this early immersion also gives military spouses the support needed take care of their families and reach their greatest potential while their spouses are here or deployed.

“Our collective goal is to expose you to the resources your spouse will need as an NCO and remind them because in the middle of (a challenging situation), they might overlook a few key items – such as contacting a key spouse or that there’s a (particular) helping agency available,” Donohue said.

A spouse’s support is twofold with the first way being supportive of the service member.

“As they move from being responsible for only themselves to being responsible for others, my goal is to help you continue to help them succeed,” the commander said. “They are going to come home with struggles after a long

week and they are going to get a phone call just after coming home because one of their Airman (needs their help) and they have to respond to that. You can be a great asset to them as they tackle that challenge.

Another way spouses can help is by being a part of support network for other women and men who are a part of the military simply because she or he chose to love and Airman.

“Sometimes, (the call may come) in the middle of the night and you not only can help your Airman handle a situation, but also that family in need,” Donohue said.

The role the spouses play is a powerful catalyst to ensuring Airmen will be able to find a healthy balance between taking care of themselves and their families as well as their Wingmen.

“(The Air Force) has really become inclusive; it makes me feel more involved and less like a number,” said Natalie Dove, spouse of Senior Airman Patrick Dove assigned to the 19th Maintenance Squadron. “I understand what my husband does a lot more now and it helps me talk to him about his day. I am able to give him another perspective which may help him make better decisions.”



# Military child doodles way to Google award

Ethan Darby, military dependent and homeschool student from Little Rock Air Force Base was selected as the state's finalist for the 10th annual nationwide Doodle 4 Google contest.

The contest allows children in grades K-12 to submit drawings for the chance to be featured on Google's front page, and compete for various prizes including scholarships.

The United States public will vote online May 7-18 for their favorite doodle from the national winners. These votes will help determine the national finalists.

A panel of Google executives will choose one of the five national finalists and announce the national winner the first week of June.

The seven-year-old was chosen by Google from thousands of submissions for his entry in this year's theme, "What inspires me?"

"At Google, we find ourselves continuously inspired by the world around us. There is so much beauty to draw from, and we would love to see what kids find inspirational," according to a Doodle 4 Google vision statement.

"I drew robots because I am inspired by them," Darby said. "I want to invent them when I grow up."

Surprising Ethan with a celebration and awards ceremony, Google representatives gave him items including virtual reality

glasses, a large poster with his doodle design and a Chromebook.

"Children in general have such big imaginations," said Victoria Gazulis,

Google Double-Click account executive out of Google's San Francisco, California office. "As we move into adulthood that can sometimes get lost in the redundancies of our day; kids like Ethan are our future."

If Darby is selected as the national winner, he will receive a college scholarship and his homeschool community will receive \$5,000 in value toward various technology or programs through Google. Also, he may donate \$45,000 in value toward the establishment or improvement of a computer lab or a technology program for a public library or school in his community.

"It's awesome that Google reached out to not just in-seat schools but homeschools as well," said Staff Sgt. Joseph Darby, Ethan's father, 19th Civil Engineer Squadron electrical power productions technician. "As a military family, the fact that Google and my whole squadron came to celebrate with us speaks volumes. I want Ethan to take that to heart and know that they're not just coworkers, they're family."

# Healthcare providers strengthen lines of communication

Healthcare providers from Little Rock Air Force Base, Ark., networked with their off-base counterparts April 19 to share processes and best practices.

The multitude of healthcare providers worked towards forming a robust communication network in an informal setting at Hangar 1080.

"The purpose is for the providers here to meet the providers from off base and open up lines of communication," said Lt. Col. Nathaniel Decker, 19th Medical Support Squadron commander. "We have limited capabilities in our clinics so we send patients off base to get the care they need from our partners and face-to-face meetings make those communication lines stronger."

Members in charge of organizing the event saw an increase from a little over 70 attendees last year to 101 attendees this year. One of the goals of the event was

for healthcare providers to talk to other members in their field and discuss different healthcare techniques and collaborate on how to more effectively process referrals.

"Each clinic has a different process for how they route referrals and we compare that to how we process referrals," said Regena Handley, 19th MDSS contract liaison officer. "We work to ensure that everyone is on the same page with how we process referrals. Also, we share information and ideas and crosstalk about the specialties that they're providing the services."

Working towards bettering their different practices and processes helps Team Little Rock members and their families receive better care and stay mission-ready.

"We're very thankful to the off-base providers for choosing to be a part of the TRICARE network and for coming out to get to know our providers and staff," Decker said. "Our primary goal is making sure our patients have the best healthcare we can provide them."

# Law Day obstacle course teaches kids legal system

Children from the youth center participated in a team-based obstacle course while learning about Law Day on May 1 at Little Rock Air Force Base.

The American Bar Association recognizes Law Day on May 1 annually, celebrating the role of law in society to cultivate a deeper understanding of the legal profession by providing the theme legal offices will teach at their base.

This year, legal offices nationwide competed using the theme “Separation of Power: Framework for Freedom.”

The 19th Airlift Wing Judge Advocate Office decided on an interactive obstacle course using riddles and teamwork to teach children how the three branches of government work together to have a

functional democracy.

“The three branches of government have their own abilities, but they all have

to play off of one another to develop a functional democracy,” said Capt. Clinton Hicks, 19th AW Judge Advocate Office

chief of general law. “The kids could all do things independently, but they realized they had to rely on one another to accomplish a bigger goal just like the three branches of government.”

Teams of three went to different stations accomplishing tasks such as crouching through ropes, popping balloons and knocking down stuffed animals with a dart gun. The overall goal at each station was to retrieve a key. The children won a prize after collecting six keys.

“Teaching our children about the legal system and how laws are created is important to ensure they’ll have a better understanding for the future,” said Staff Sgt. Joyce Bray, 19th AW Judge Advocate Office NCO in charge of military justice.

## FINDING POTENTIAL MISHAPS BEFORE THEY HAPPEN

Gloved hands pull a vital aircraft component from glowing, toxic pools of chemically-laced liquid designed to reveal otherwise unseen dangers.

A nondestructive inspection Airman searches for cracks capable of taking down an aircraft by analyzing the suspect piece with eyes specially trained for the job.

Airmen from the 19th Maintenance Squadron NDI shop perform aircraft integrity checks, at set intervals and upon request, using liquids and a variety of other methods to assist them in seeing cracks and additional imperfections in aircraft parts.

“NDI’s mission is to test aircraft and aircraft parts for integrity purposes and structural health,” said Airman 1st Class Tye Braden, 19th MXS nondestructive

inspection journeyman. “We deal with a lot of minute problems; if you mess up, a lot can go wrong. If you miss a crack, it can keep expanding, and a wing can fall off.”

NDI Airmen operate equipment to see cracks imperceptible to the naked eye — cracks as small as one-tenth of an inch. They scan the aircraft for faulty elements, with some items located inside the aircraft.

“We work with engineers to figure out which parts of the plane need to be scanned,” said Staff Sgt. Joe Hayes, 19th MXS assistant NCO in charge of nondestructive inspection shop. “We do a little bit of everything to verify the integrity of the materials we scan.”

This verification process involves using scanning techniques such as ultrasonic waves, fluorescent

penetrant, magnetic particle inspection, radiography and eddy current. NDI Airmen scan more than 2,000 parts a year using these techniques.

NDI Airmen are responsible for intensely searching for naturally occurring dangers on aircraft from the 19th Airlift Wing, 314th Airlift Wing, 189th Airlift Wing and transient aircraft.

Harsh chemicals, electric currents, sound waves or even x-rays are exercised regularly to ensure the structural integrity and health of aircraft. NDI Airmen implement these techniques to keep the Little Rock aircraft safe, flying and mission-ready at all times.


