Air Force announces significant changes to Aviation Bonus Program

WASHINGTON – As part of its retention efforts, the Air Force released details on the fiscal year 2017 Aviation Bonus Program (AvB) on June 5. This year's program implements an increase in maximum bonus amounts authorized in the fiscal 2017 National Defense Authorization Act in addition to more flexibility in contract lengths.

The program, combined with additional non-monetary initiatives, is part of a holistic approach to improve readiness and capacity by increasing retention of experienced aviators.

“We hope this new approach will make it easier for more Airmen to stay in the service,” said Secretary of the Air Force Heather Wilson. “The country needs them.”

This year Congress authorized the Air Force to increase the annual AvB cap from \$25,000 per year to \$35,000 per year and has mandated that bonus amounts be based on a business case analysis to determine greatest need and appropriate monetary amounts.

“Actual bonus levels were determined by considering current and projected manning, current and projected retention levels, replacement training costs, and replacement training time,” said Lt. Gen. Gina Grosso, the Air Force manpower, personnel and services deputy chief of staff, “These are the same factors used to determine bonus needs across the Air Force, such as selective re-enlistment bonuses and critical skills retention bonuses.”

Additionally, the fiscal 2017 AvB contract options include one-year, two-year, and five-year options for all eligible 11X aviators, with the amounts tiered by the most critical needs. Bomber, special ops, and mobility pilots have a nine-year contract option while fighter pilots have nine-year and 24 years of aviation service (13-year maximum) options. RPA pilots, along with combat systems operators from various flying communities, are eligible for five-year contracts at varying amounts, tiered by critical needs.

The Air Force's strategy to mitigate the pilot shortage consists of non-monetary and monetary initiatives in three main areas: production of pilots, reducing demand/need for pilots in non-flying positions, and increasing pilot retention. Some of the non-monetary initiatives include reducing the demand signal for non-flying assignments, headquarters staff positions and developmental opportunities; creating flexible options for developmental assignments that will reduce involuntary separations and provide flexibility for Airmen and families; reductions in additional duties; addition of contracted administrative support in operational units and more hands-on consultation with base leadership when choosing who will fill various assignments.

The Air Force is also looking at additional monetary incentives for aviation, especially those targeted at mid-career aviators. The fiscal 2017 NDAA provided authorization to increase Aviation Incentive Pay, commonly known as monthly flight pay, which the service plans to increase this summer.

“One of my favorite quotes comes from Gen. Hap Arnold during the worst days of the daylight bombing campaign in Europe,” said Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. David L. Goldfein. “He said ‘the problem with airpower is we make it look too easy.’”

“While history doesn't always repeat...it often rhymes,” he said. “Defending the homeland, owning the high ground and projecting power with our allies abroad takes skilled and professional pilots who make the incredibly hard look easy. I appreciate the support from Congress to offer our pilot force increased compensation for them and their families who serve beside them.”



"I felt the need to join JROTC because I really want to serve my nation and be the best I can be," David said.

During his senior year at Cabot High School, David was accepted to the USAFA. Now a graduate, he looks forward to the trials and adventures the USAFA will offer.

"Even though I am excited to be accepted, no one is more proud than my dad," David said.



One decade later: Black Cats' humble beginnings

The 41st Airlift Squadron has been an integral part of the Combat Airlift mission at Little Rock Air Force Base for a decade. However, before the Black Cats flew the central Arkansas skies, they had humble beginnings here.

In 2007, the 41st AS moved to Little Rock AFB after a realignment ceremony at Pope Air Force Base, North Carolina.

Prior to the squadron moving to its new installation, an advanced echelon team of Airmen departed in order to set up a new home for the Black Cats.

“To stand up a squadron is an overwhelming task and takes an enormous amount of work,” said Jon Ratz, former 41st AS stand-up crew member. “Each member wanted to make the squadron the best it could be.”

A squadron stand-up involves getting every necessity ready to maintain an operational building. From aircraft and training plans, to pens and paper; a small team of 10 were in charge of it all.

“Many man hours were needed to do this and the key to it all was planning and organization,” Ratz said. “Normal work days averaged 10-12 hours but they were always thinking of what needed to be done next.”

One of the biggest challenges the team faced was setting up an operational unit to ensure the future success of all Black Cats to follow.

“The most challenging thing was to get it right,” Ratz, a retired major, said. “We had seen programs implemented poorly in other squadrons and we wanted the best for ours; we were not only trying to get things done to become operational, but also (be) the best squadron.”

Since becoming part of Team Little Rock, the 41st AS has become a vital part of the Combat Airlift mission. The Black Cats have gone on a variety of missions, from deployments to humanitarian efforts.


“Seeing what the squadron is now, it makes me very proud to be a part of the stand-up crew,” said Scott Sindle, former 41st AS stand-up crew member.

When the 19th Airlift Wing became the host unit in 2008, the 41st Airlift Squadron continued their mission as the former ADVON team eventually moved on.

Whether they separated or retired, a few members of the crew continue the mission here at the C-130J Maintenance and Aircrew Training System, a program in the 314th Airlift Wing's Center of Excellence. The Center of Excellence trains approximately 1,800 students on base.

“The C-130J community is small,” Sindle, a former chief master sergeant, said. “As people retired or separated, they eventually came here to train students.”

From loading and flying C-130s to instructing the leaders of tomorrow, the 41st AS stand-up crew's former mission comes full circle as they continue to help the Black Cats fly in the Natural State and beyond.

Little Rock AFB Airmen equip aircrew for

Before every flight, Airmen from the 19th Operations Support Squadron Aircrew Flight Equipment shop load countless bags onto the C-130. The green luggage ranges in size but serves a common purpose: To save the lives of the C-130 aircrew.

Parachutes, survival radios, oxygen masks and flotation devices are just a few of the devices stocked in the aircraft in case of an emergency.

Although crisis situations are uncommon due to the expertise of pilots and aircrew onboard, having the gear is necessary for the safety of the crew members during critical Combat Airlift missions.

As the largest AFE shop in the U.S. Air Force, their team consists of more than 60 Airmen tasked with inspecting, maintaining and distributing vital lifesaving equipment to the 19th Airlift Wing, 314th Airlift Wing and 189th Airlift Wing fleets.

Equipment specialists work 24/7 to prepare gear for all operations ranging from tactical airdrops to emergency landings.

“In the aircraft configuration section of AFE, we load up all the aircraft equipment required for any type of mission going out of Little Rock AFB,” said Tech Sgt. Jacob Long, 19th OSS AFE craftsman. “Everything they would ever use to keep themselves alive or keep themselves safe inside the aircraft.”

The shop is divided into multiple sections to maintain their vast arsenal. Airmen at each section focus on specific gear such as oxygen equipment, chemical equipment, parachutes, flotation devices and mobility kits.

Each piece of equipment is carefully and meticulously prepared down to the seams and inspected for any defects or malfunctions.

“If I were to use this equipment, I’d want it to get me home safely to my family,” said Airman 1st Class Collin Shipman, 19th OSS AFE journeyman. “That’s what I keep in mind every time I do my job, and I want the same for the crew who might have to use it one day.”

Aircrew’s lives depend on the AFE Airmen’s attention to detail and training.

Technicians are trained in each section to maintain a well-rounded skill set in preparation for any mission stateside or abroad.

“During deployments, we foster a closer relationship with each other and the aircrew because there’s usually only a handful of us there running all the equipment out to the flight line for say 70 aircrew members from just one little shop,” Long said.

Due to the intensive care performed by Team Little Rock’s AFE technicians, C-130 aircrew can face any circumstance with confidence as they deliver global Combat Airlift at a moment’s notice.



permanent disability,” said Staff Sgt. Ryan Duckett, 19th Medical Operations Squadron Immunizations NCOIC. “Some diseases are common in other countries but not in the United States so it is important to make sure you are up to date on the recommended vaccines against them.”

Staying up to date on vaccinations helps prevent the spread of disease.

“Members should receive mandatory country-specific vaccines prior to deploying or traveling overseas in order to be medically cleared,” Duckett said. “If not,

they run the risk of being non-deployable which could delay the mission. Any vaccines that are due will be highlighted Yellow (Due) or Red (Overdue) in their Immunization status.”

An estimated 1,000 people received vaccinations in May at Little Rock AFB. That number will continue to rise if deployments increase and as Permanent Change of Station season ramp up.

To check your immunizations status, log onto the Air Force Portal and navigate to the Individual Medical Readiness/AFMS link to access your records.

How to stay alert during road runs

Staying alert is fundamental to preventing possible incidents while running or jogging. Uneven ground, road edges and other hazards add to the danger of traveling near vehicles, such as slipping on loose gravel and potholes.

Many people take to the roads to get exercise and enjoy the weather as it warms up, more so than in the cooler months.

It's important to follow the rules of the road while running on base, according to marathon competitor Senior Airman Aaron Watts, 19th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron Commander Support Staff technician.

"Remembering running safety basics even when you're in the zone is vital," Watts said. "Looking both ways before crossing the street and indicating your turns can help keep you safe."

The base is regularly under improvement,

which makes construction sites and their risks common. Avoid low-light areas by taking alternate routes with adequate lighting and runner-friendly zones. Runners should also be on the lookout for animals while using running trails.

Situational awareness and being mindful can reduce the chances of accidents. Runners should be aware of drivers and make drivers aware of them.

"Especially in the morning and afternoon, use the sidewalks and crosswalks as much as possible," said Richard Myers, 19th Airlift Wing Occupational Safety manager. "Runners and joggers should wear bright reflective material so they can be easily spotted by drivers."

By paying attention to the road and surroundings, injuries and accidents are preventable.

Rules of the Road*


- Wear reflective outer garments at night or during periods of reduced visibility
- Obey all traffic devices
- Stay off roadways by running on road shoulders
- Don't obstruct traffic by running in the middle of the road
- Run single-file against traffic
- Don't wear headphones or earbuds while walking or running on roads. Sidewalks or running trails are acceptable.
