

Mobility Command welcomes new commander

SCOTT AIR FORCE BASE, Ill. – Air Mobility Command welcomed a new commander at Scott Air Force Base, Illinois, Sept. 7.

Air Force Gen. Maryanne Miller took command of AMC from Air Force Gen. Carlton D. Everhart II, who retires after more than 35 years of service. Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. David L. Goldfein, officiated the change of command ceremony.

Miller is the thirteenth commander to take the reins since the major command was designated as Air Mobility Command, June 1, 1992. She is the first traditional Reservist to be promoted to four-star general and lead an Air Force major command outside of Air Force Reserve Command.

Goldfein opened the ceremony by expressing a personal connection to the Airmen and capabilities of AMC.

“My admiration and appreciation for the Airmen of this command is very personal,” he said. “You see, I’ve been pulled out of many a bad place by air refueling tankers, crews willing to risk everything to provide me and my wingmen the gas we desperately needed to get back to friendly territory.”

The chief of staff echoed the words of his senior joint colleagues who have referred to AMC and U.S. Transportation Command as “the most ‘can-do’ force on the planet.” He then reflected on Miller’s leadership and expertise.

“In a command where rapid global mobility is not achieved without total force synergy, General Miller brings the perfect blend of operational expertise, servant leadership and strategic policy savvy to take this team to new heights,” Goldfein said.

As AMC commander, Miller is responsible for employing and integrating all Mobility Air Forces comprised of nearly 120,000 civilian, active duty, Air National Guard, and Air Force Reserve personnel along with nearly 1,100 aircraft. AMC sustains America’s military operations

worldwide through its airlift, aerial refueling, aeromedical evacuation and air mobility support capabilities. The command also responds to humanitarian crises at home and around the globe.

Addressing the men and women of AMC for the first time as commander, Miller expressed enthusiasm about assuming her new position leading the command.

“It is an honor and tremendous privilege to take the flag, to lead Air Mobility Command,” Miller said. “Air Mobility is at the heart of our nation’s military response.

There is a common bond which guides all of us as individuals, Airmen and public servants: the bond of our core values and the inspiration that comes from being part of something much bigger than ourselves.”

One of only 14 four-star generals serving in the Air Force, Miller previously commanded Air Force Reserve Command, the 349th Air Mobility Wing, Travis AFB, California, and 932nd Airlift Wing, Scott AFB, Illinois. In those positions, Miller directly led the organizing, training and equipping of Mobility Air Forces for

America. This is a role she intends to build upon while responsible for the warfighting and humanitarian components of AMC’s Total Force mission.

“We stand as one force, shoulder-to-shoulder with our Reserve and Guard Airmen and families,” said Miller. “As a Total Force we will continue to improve our readiness and sharpen the edge of our rapid and resilient operations.”

Air Mobility Command is the air component of United States Transportation Command, a unified, functional combatant command which provides support to the nine other U.S. combatant commands, the military services, defense agencies and other government organizations for a wide array of joint mobility missions.

Army Gen. Stephen R. Lyons, U.S. TRANSCOM commander, spoke about his experience with AMC Airmen and welcomed Miller to the command during the ceremony.

“As a Soldier, Air Mobility Command has carried me on their back to every major operation throughout my career, whether on a parachute or at the end of a dirt landing strip,” he said. “General Miller is unquestionably the best leader for our Mobility Air Forces at this time. Every assignment along her mobility career has prepared her for today. Her reputation precedes her as a servant leader.”

Miller concluded the ceremony by encouraging AMC’s Airmen to let their core values lead them in the conduct of rapid global mobility.

“As Airmen, we succeed. As Airmen, we invest in serving our great nation and each other. As Airmen, we lead from the front, kneel by those in need, share in the work of our teammates, respect their lives and honor their contributions ... Let’s get after it!” she concluded.

Air Force's first Invisible Wounds Center opens

EGLIN AIR FORCE BASE, Fla. (AFNS) – The 96th Medical Group opened the Air Force's first Invisible Wounds Center on Aug. 30 at Eglin Air Force Base.

More than 120 people attended the event and toured the new facility, including Air Force Surgeon General, Lt. Gen. Dorothy Hogg, 96th Test Wing installation commander, Brig. Gen. Evan C. Dertien, and members of the local community.

Hogg, the guest speaker for the ceremony, thanked everyone who helped standup the center and also reaffirmed the Air Force's commitment to providing 'Trusted Care' to our military members.

"Standing up this facility is just the first step of many in our commitment to care for our warriors with invisible wounds," she said. "We owe these brave men and women the very best treatment possible. Today, we make good on that commitment."

The center will serve as a regional

treatment center for post-traumatic stress, traumatic brain injury, associated pain conditions and psychological injuries.

"The center is ready to treat retirees, Guard, Reserve, and active duty members from our sister services who carry the weight of invisible wounds," said Hogg. "Our goal is to eliminate barriers to care. We want to treat our service members with dignity through every phase of their recovery."

The IWC, modeled after the best practices of the Intrepid Spirit Centers, will assemble a team of 18 specialties under one roof, providing treatment in an individually tailored, holistic and integrated fashion, using a combination of conventional and complimentary therapies.

"We're here for you, we're ready to serve you," said Dertien. "The facility and the capabilities we are building here have the impact and the potential to change people's lives. This sends the message that we can talk about invisible wounds. It's okay to ask for help."

Art and music therapy, yoga, acupuncture, physical and occupational therapy

and mental health services will also be included in treatment.

"Having all these services under one roof, complimenting each other, provides treatment and healing in ways that are only now being recognized," said Hogg. "The providers will also address physical, spiritual, mental and social well-being to further ensure positive health outcomes."

Hogg shared positive accounts from wounded warriors she met at Intrepid Spirit Centers on military installations around the country. She attributed their success to the mind and body approach to treatment and community involvement. She also noted patient, caregiver and family education is key component in the healing process.

"We learned the best outcomes occur when a host of people are involved in the healing process," she said. "Complete healing and reintegration requires healing the patient as well as the family."

The ceremony concluded with a

good-news, momentous announcement for the military community.

Hogg said the Department of Defense recently accepted a proffer from Arnold Fisher, honorary chairman of the Intrepid Fallen Heroes Fund, to build an Intrepid Spirit Center at Eglin AFB, making it the tenth of its kind and the first on an Air Force base. Plans for the ground breaking are underway, and officials expect a completion of the facility in 2020.

Fisher described these facilities as "centers of hope," and adds that these center are not built by the government, but by donations from the American people. He said that thought is reassuring because Americans believe this is the right model to treat invisible wounds, according to Hogg.

"Fisher is determined to continue his mission to build Intrepid Spirit Centers," said Hogg. "Today the Air Force is forever grateful to him and all the donors who will make the Intrepid Spirit Center here a reality."



Gary Fletcher, Jacksonville mayor, on improvements being made in the local community to help Air Force families' growth and involvement in the Jacksonville community and school system. Afterward, the key spouses received an overview of the Airmen and Family Readiness Center, and programs provided for families.

"As military spouses, you have so much to offer, and I'd like to know when you leave here, part of you is still here within the community," said Fletcher. "Everyone has a choice to make on what they leave behind. They either leave their footprint or their fingerprint, and only one of them makes a difference."

The next stop in the immersion saw the spouses traveling to the 314th Airlift Wing to learn about the training side of the Combat Airlift mission. After the training briefing, the spouses got to experience the food services and dining establishments available to them and their Airmen on LRAFB by having lunch at the Hercules Dining Facility.

During their lunch, the spouses heard from different wing staff agencies, such as the base chapel, the judge advocates' office and the public affairs office, on the resources within the wing available to them.

The immersion concluded with a tour, starting with a briefing from the 189th AW, and continued to different facilities on base, such as the flight-line, youth center and base chapel, to familiarize the spouses with the layout of Little Rock AFB.

Airmen, families de-stress with Brazilian jiu-jitsu

As students bow to the instructor, all stresses from the day fade away as Airmen and civilians from Little Rock Air Force Base channel their troubles into gentle but deliberate movements of precision as they begin a Brazilian jiu-jitsu class.

Brazilian jiu-jitsu, or BJJ, is a submission-based martial art focused on groundwork and grappling, both of which are forms of wrestling. While it can be challenging, it can also lead to a sense of mental and physical confidence.

“Airmen can come here to get a sense of community so they’re not stuck in the dorms,” said Letia Eclavea, military spouse and University of Maryland University College student. “Getting out more can help them be more resilient for the military lifestyle.”

The class is taught by U.S. Air Force Staff Sgt. Peter Beyer, 19th Civil Engineer Squadron firefighter, and his wife, Eclavea. They share a passion for Brazilian jiu-jitsu and host free training sessions Monday through Thursday at the Fitness Center on Little Rock Air Force Base.

“When we came to Little Rock, there weren’t a lot of people who did BJJ and there wasn’t availability on base,” Eclavea said. “There was a need, so I thought we could fill it.”

To the students, the class could be the difference between succumbing to the stress of the day or coming to the mat and grappling troubles away.

“No matter if I’m having a bad day or not, I can’t wait to go to BJJ,” said U.S. Air Force Airman 1st Class Audrey Schaad, 19th Airlift Wing Postal Service Center apprentice. “I feel comfortable in my own skin here and am able to be myself. If I’m having a hard day, I can have a good roll on the mat and unwind from the day.”

BJJ helps stimulate the mind, body and spirit while creating social bonds, which strengthen the four pillars of Comprehensive Airman Fitness. CAF is a program built to sustain a thriving and resilient Air Force community through mental, physical, social and spiritual fitness.

“The last eight months of BJJ have made me more confident, and because of that I feel like a better person, and I’ve met a lot of amazing people here,” Schaad said.

The pillars don’t just apply to Airmen. One of the class’ youngest students, Marshall Thorn, 8, also benefits from learning control through the martial arts.

“Martial arts are always a good way to instill confidence and discipline in children,” said Marshall’s father, U.S. Air Force Master Sgt. Nathan Thorn, Arkansas U.S. Air Force Reserve recruiter. “It’s good for him because he’s always going to be a little smaller (because of genetics). BJJ is geared toward technique versus being bigger and stronger. It’s right for him because it instills confidence so he doesn’t feel like he’s going to get bullied and be afraid.”

Students of BJJ learn how to remain calm in high-pressure and physically uncomfortable situations. This is especially useful to military families who may be without their member for long periods.

“Not everyone’s ready for a violent attack,” Eclavea said. “The class gives individuals the knowledge to know how to defend themselves, giving the military member peace of mind knowing their families are doing something productive that won’t leave them defenseless.”

No matter the background or personal struggles, Airmen and their families can find solace and confidence on the classroom mat or in the competition ring.

“I want to improve here, which makes me want to improve in life; I feel like I’m not as shy as I was before BJJ,” Schaad said. “It helped me not miss my family as much and reminded me I could have a life by coming here and talking to people. It’s kept me going.”

Chief Master Sergeants meet to discuss future, force

OFFUTT AIR FORCE BASE, Nebraska (AFNS) – Chief Master Sgt. of the Air Force Kaleth O. Wright, joined by six of the previous Chief Master Sergeants of the Air Force, participated in the 2018 Senior Enlisted Statesman Forum Sept. 6 at Offutt Air Force Base, Nebraska.

The forum, the first of its kind since Wright's tenure began, was an opportunity to discuss the future of the Air Force focusing on policy, training and resilience.

"I updated them on the current enlisted programs we have, ranging from enlisted Professional Military Education to promotions to policy updates and some potential changes like bereavement leave and fitness," Wright said. "I admire, respect and look up to them, and I wanted to spend some time with the folks whose shoulders I stand upon."

Although many strides have been made over the years in realms such as technology, Wright said there is an overlap in the hurdles he faces today to those faced in the past. The forum was a means for him to receive instant feedback and gain perspective and knowledge from the prior Chief Master Sergeants of the Air Force.

"They are very experienced," Wright said. "They have lived the same life in various eras, so it was really good to hear from them and their perspective. I was able to glean some knowledge and mentorship about how they handled things during their time in the seat.

I think the value of having mentors, period, is extremely important."

Wright's predecessors, although retired, still play a huge role in developing Airmen. Many still engage frequently with Airmen at venues such as Professional Military Education schoolhouses, making it vital for them to be informed of program innovations.

"The former Chief Master Sergeants of the Air Force are still tremendously involved in our Air Force," Wright said. "They continue to do speaking engagements at graduations, banquets and professional enhancement seminars, so I wanted to make sure they are kept up-to-date on what we are doing and we are in sync in terms of messaging."

While the attendees may have benefited from the forum, Wright said he wants the real beneficiaries to be the 295,000 enlisted Airmen across the service. His focus is on growing those numbers and retaining the talent already in-house.

"I think the enlisted force will benefit in that I will take the advice, guidance and mentorship I received and continue to make all the enlisted programs better," Wright said. "We will continue to do things we have been doing to help our enlisted Airmen become more lethal, ready and resilient and better led."

Although no date is set for the next forum, Wright said he hopes to continue open dialogue with the retired chiefs.

"I think we will do this once a year," Wright said. "We get other opportunities to meet, just not as focused as what we did yesterday, so we agreed that we would like to come together like this."


