





Superintendent addresses racial slurs at USAFA

U.S. AIR FORCE ACADEMY, Colo. – The Air Force Academy superintendent addressed cadets, faculty, staff and cadet candidates Sept. 28 in the wake of racial slurs recently written on the dormitory message boards of five African American cadets at the Academy's Preparatory School.

"If you're outraged by those words, then you're in the right place," said Lt. Gen. Jay Silveria. "That kind of behavior has no place at the Prep School, has no place at USAFA and has no place in the United States Air Force."

Silveria advised cadets to engage in open discussion on the topic and focus on solutions.

"What we should have is a civil discourse and talk about these issues," he said. "That's a better idea."

He referenced current race issues across the country, to include Charlottesville, Virginia, Ferguson, Missouri and the protests in the National Football League, and gave an example of a recent forum the dean of faculty hosted for cadets to discuss Charlottesville.

Silveria went on to talk about the power of diversity.

"It's the power that we come from all walks of life, that we come from all parts of this country, that we come from all races, that we come from all backgrounds, gender, all make-up, all upbringing," he said. "The power of that diversity comes together and makes us that much more powerful."

Silveria left cadets with what he called his most important thought on the subject.

"If you can't treat someone from another race or different color skin with dignity and respect, then you need to get out," he emphatically said. "If you can't treat someone with dignity and respect, then get out."

This was not the first time the new superintendent discussed the topics of dignity and respect. In his first address to cadets, faculty and staff in August, he made it clear where he stands, "If you want to find a red line with me, it will be in the area of respect and dignity."

Air Force Academy Security forces are investigating the incident.





Air Force Academy: Apply for brighter future

Airmen looking to change course in their career, may be interested in commissioning as an officer in the U.S. Air Force through the Leaders Encouraging Airman Development program at the Air Force Academy.

The Air Force Academy is for those who want a challenge and who want to be pushed to the limit—to learn, achieve and to be future leaders in the U.S. Air Force, according to the Air Force Academy admissions.

To qualify Airmen must meet the following requirements;

- Have high moral character;
- Possess exceptional leadership potential;
- Meet all USAFA entry requirements
- Cannot be past their 23rd birthday by 1 July for USAFA entry, or not past their 22nd birthday on July 1, 2017, of the year of entry to the Preparatory School;
- Cannot be married or have dependents (non-waiverable) and must

be a U.S. citizen upon entering USAFA;


■ Upon graduation, LEAD individuals are commissioned as a 2nd Lt. in the United States Air Force.

The minimum postgraduate service obligation is five years. In the aviation career path, the minimum obligation is 10 years after completion of Undergraduate Pilot Training.

Airmen are encouraged to retake the SAT and/or ACT to ensure the most recent standardized test scores are submitted and that their scores are as competitive as possible. As part of the application process, Airmen must complete an Air Force form 1786 with their commander's recommendation, complete and submit an online application and be deemed qualified to compete for an appointment.

The completed AF form 1786 must be received by the Admissions Office no later than Dec. 31, 2017.

Little Rock AFB Airman supports family in Puerto Rico from MacDill AFB

MACDILL AIR FORCE BASE, Fla. – In times of adversity, many turn to their families for emotional support. Loved ones become safety nets when one of their own faces strife. But what does a person do when his family is in jeopardy on an island thousands of miles away?

Airman 1st Class Kenny Rivera Rojas, 19th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron crew chief, responded to his family by offering his helping hands to not just his family, but the entire Puerto Rican population, by helping maintain aircraft headed to Hurricane Maria for aeromedical evacuation missions.

Rivera Rojas's family is part of the 3.4 million people in Puerto Rico affected by Hurricane Maria. They reside in the city of Canovanas, Puerto Rico, 30 minutes away from San Juan. Rivera Rojas's only way to contact them is through his sister, who works at San Juan Luis Munoz Marin Airport.

"They mean the world to me," Rivera Rojas said.

"I'm very close to everyone, even my extended family. Although my sister hasn't gotten the chance to talk to them, I try to call at least once a day. Since there isn't electricity, all I hear is the phone ring. They don't know I'm here."

The challenges his family is facing is the same as other Puerto Ricans who are struggling to find food, water and gas. So far, the U.S. territory has received support from federal and private agencies.

"It's heartwarming to see people donate to help so much," Rivera Rojas said. "I didn't think there was going to be the amount of support there is."

So far, Rivera Rojas has contributed to maintenance operations supporting responding aircraft by aiding in flight pre-checks and loading supplies onto aircraft headed to Puerto Rico and will continue to do so as long as he can.

"Until I see my family again, I'm willing to do anything in my power to make sure they're OK," he said. "I'm here. I'm doing my best to help out and be there. I love you."

GREEN FLAG Little Rock: Securing joint operational readiness

The 34th Combat Training Squadron coordinated the 50th anniversary of Air Mobility Command's GREEN FLAG exercise.

The two-week exercise, conducted at Fort Polk, La., grows the bonds and coordination between Mobility Air Force's assets and their Army brethren.

"One of the best ways for a loadmaster to learn is to hear how to best tackle a problem from another, more experienced, loadmaster," said Staff Sgt. Whitney Woolverton, 34th CTS instructor loadmaster. "I have a lot of experience I can share with other loadmasters and I love being able to do that."

Woolverton participated as an observer, coach and trainer, or OCT,

during the exercise. This involved flying with various aircrews and observing or assisting them perform certain tasks encountered during deployments or temporary deployments.

One of these tasks is Combat Offload Method B, a method used when a piece of cargo cannot be offloaded by conventional methods because it's either too big or the proper equipment needed is unavailable.

The method consists of hooking chains attached to a forklift to cargo and anchoring it in place while the aircraft slowly moves forward. As the piece of cargo is removed from the aircraft, aircrew place barrels underneath to keep its height consistent and from falling over. Once this process is complete, the aircraft can immediately begin to take off

procedures if needed. However, the aircrew may take their time safely moving the piece of equipment.

"GREEN FLAG is a good, controlled environment to get critical training for deployments," said Airman Dalton Clark, 40th Airlift Squadron loadmaster. "I'm trying to get as much training as I can before an actual deployment comes up."

The wealth of information and training gained during this exercise is just one of the many avenues available to ensure service members are prepared to answer their nation's call.

"I've seen plenty of stuff I've never encountered before," Clark said. "It's good to be able to experience things that are out of your norm and learn how to prepare for that."

Changes are coming to TRICARE

Changes are coming to your TRICARE benefit beginning Jan. 1, 2018. These changes will give you more benefit choices, improving your access to care, simplifying cost shares and allowing you to take command of your health.

“Taking command of your health means empowering you to make the right health care and coverage choices for you and your family,” the announcement said. “Leading up to Jan. 1, 2018, we will connect you with TRICARE resources to navigate your benefit questions.”

The best way for you to prepare now is to update your information in DEERS, sign up for TRICARE benefit updates, and visit TRICARE Changes.

Here are changes that you will need to know about:

Region Consolidation

Currently, there are three TRICARE regions in the U.S.: North, South and West. The North and South regions will combine on Jan. 1, 2018 to form TRICARE East, while TRICARE West will remain mostly unchanged. Two new contractors, Humana Military and Health Net Federal Services, will

administer these regions. This change will allow better coordination between the military hospitals and clinics and the civilian health care providers in each region.

TRICARE Select

On Jan. 1, 2018, TRICARE Select will replace TRICARE Standard and TRICARE Extra both stateside and overseas. Stateside, TRICARE Select will be a self-managed, preferred provider network option. You will not be required to have a primary care manager (PCM) and therefore you can visit any TRICARE-authorized provider for services covered by TRICARE without a referral. If you live overseas, TRICARE Overseas Program Select will be a preferred provid-

er organization-styled plan that provides access to both network and non-network TRICARE-authorized providers for medically necessary TRICARE covered services. TRICARE Select adopts a number of improvements, including additional preventive care services previously only offered to TRICARE Prime beneficiaries.

TRICARE Prime

TRICARE Prime is a managed care program option. An assigned PCM provides most of your care. When you need specialty care, your PCM will refer you to a specialist. Active duty service members and their family members do not pay anything when referred to a network provider by their PCM. All others pay

annual enrollment fees and network copayments.

Enrollment

All current TRICARE beneficiaries will be automatically enrolled into plans on Jan. 1, 2018 as long as they are eligible. TRICARE Prime enrollees will remain in TRICARE Prime. TRICARE Standard and TRICARE Extra beneficiaries will be enrolled in TRICARE Select. During 2018, you can continue to choose to enroll in or change coverage plans.

In fall 2018, TRICARE will introduce an annual open enrollment period. During this period, you will choose whether to continue or change your coverage for the following year. Each year, the open enrollment period will begin on the Monday of the second full

week in November and run through the Monday of the second full week in December.
