

Language Enabled Airman Program is now accepting cadet applications

MAXWELL AIR FORCE BASE, Ala. (AFNS) — The Language Enabled Airman Program is accepting cadet applications now until March 15. Those intending to submit applications must apply online by visiting www.airuniversity.af.edu/AFCLC.

LEAP is a career-spanning program aimed to sustain and improve Airmen's language and cultural capabilities. Managed by the Air Force Culture and Language Center, the program seeks to develop cross-culturally competent leaders who can meet Air Force global mission requirements.

Participants in LEAP are required to complete online training, eMentor courses and attend periodic language intensive training events. Successful completion of program requirements will result in the participant being eligible for the LEAP Special Experience Identifier, which could give them special consideration for Foreign Language Proficiency Pay and other language-related opportunities in the Air Force.

As of December 2018, there are currently 3,084 participants in the Language Enabled Airman Program.

Innovation enhancing mission for AF's largest air mobility wing

TRAVIS AIR FORCE BASE, Calif. (AFNS) — Airmen at Travis Air Force Base are implementing innovative strategies to reduce man hours and increase mission effectiveness.

Over the past several months, the base has implemented a variety of innovations including 3D printing and 3D scanning.

Cultivating a culture of innovation is essential to mission success, said Col. Matthew Leard, 60th Air Mobility Wing vice commander.

“At Travis (AFB), Airmen are empowered to identify and solve problems at their level, rapidly,” he said. “We want Airmen to think big and try the ideas others say will never work. It does not always have to be proven technology or have a business case. Let's just try it, who knows it may just work.”


The innovations under way at Travis AFB were made possible when the Air Force distributed \$64 million in Squadron Innovation Funds in an effort to increase readiness, reduce cost, save time and enhance lethality of the force.

In October, Travis AFB procured a 3D hand scanner capable of producing three-dimensional representations of aircraft parts. The device has also been used to inspect aircraft damage.

“The scanner displays the deepest part of a dent to the nearest thousandth of an inch,” said Master Sgt. Christopher Smithling, 60th Maintenance Squadron assistant section chief for aircraft structural maintenance. “The scanner can identify the shape of a dent, as well as if it's sharp, smooth or round, which allows us to give our engineers a better damage analysis than we could before.”

Smithling said the scanner was first used in November to inspect the landing gear of a C-17 Globemaster III after a bird strike, and over the past month, has greatly reduced the time required to complete damage inspections.

“One of our C-5 aircraft went through a hail storm in 2013 and we found many dents on all the panels,” he said. “We've performed an inspection of this aircraft every 180 days and

we've had to measure every dent that's still on the wing's surface. The first few times we did that, it took us 48 hours. We had that C-5 in our hangar last week and we were able to inspect the four primary structural panels in 30 minutes.”

The 60th MXS is also in the process of procuring two 3D printers, one polymer printer and one metal printer, so they can reproduce aircraft parts.

“With the two additive manufacturing units, we will be able to grab any aircraft part, scan it, and within four to eight hours,



Multi-domain career opportunity available for AF officers

Team Little Rock commanders were briefed on a new career field the Air Force has developed for officers, with the first class commencing training summer of 2019.

The career field is described as command and control operational-level warfighting, where officers will have a variety of tasks including mission scheduling and employing forces at an air operations center.

Officers will be required to have seven to 12 years of service. Prior experience in an AOC is recommended but not required. Officers from any Air Force specialty code are eligible to apply, and waivers are available to those whose career field is critically manned.

Team Little Rock officers interested in the new career have an advantage of understanding of lethality and accuracy from their tactical experience executing agile combat airlift, helping them employ

the right operational concepts to achieve the right operational effect.

“Developing this career field within the officer corps is very important because previously Airmen were being pulled from numerous career fields to work in AOC weapons system, and after working there for a few months to three years, they’d have to return to their respective career field to keep up with training,” said Robert Barkley, U.S. Air Force Expeditionary Operations School Detachment 1 chief of education, plans and programs. “We lost people with experience and had to bring new people in to train which we’d end up losing in a few years, so we came up with a solution to create this career field.”

After applicants are accepted into the career field, they will go through special training and education during a 20-week course at Hurlburt Field, Florida, followed by additional training at Maxwell Air Force Base, Alabama.

Despite the 20-week course, developers are expecting the length of training

to slowly increase as more officers go through it.

“The new career field is opening up opportunities for officers to serve at the operational level for an extended period of time,” said Lt. Col. Andrew Smith, 19th Airlift Wing director of staff. “These officers will gain valuable experience while increasing continuity and effectiveness of operations.”

Operating with numerous air forces around the world and units in the Air Force gives combat airlifters an understanding of what’s necessary to exploit integration of current and new joint capabilities across military operations.

Officers who complete the course will

have the opportunity to be stationed at AOCs at a variety of U.S. military bases in the United States, Europe, Southwest Asia and Southeast Asia. After officers gain a general understanding of the operations of an AOC, they will be stationed at combatant commands.

Each assignment will have a different number of people depending on the resources needed at that particular base. Currently there are more than 75 people assigned to bases and completing tasks the new career holders will be performing.

we will have a true 3D drawing of it that we can send to the additive manufacturing unit to print it," Smithling said.

That capability, he said, will decrease the time Travis AFB aircraft are out of service.

"Right now, we could have one of our aircraft down for about 48 hours while we try to get the part it needs," he said. "Once we have this additive manufacturing capability in place, we will likely be able to print and replace parts in a few hours and return our aircraft to flying status much quicker."

Innovation is also leading to improved patient care at David Grant USAF Medical Center, the largest medical center in the Air Force. The Dental Clinic at DGMC

received a Form2 printer in August, which has enabled the clinic to produce a variety of items used for dental surgery.

"We currently fabricate surgical guides, hard night guards and dental models or casts with different variations," said Capt. Geoffrey Johnston, 60th Dental Squadron prosthodontist. "We are also investigating printing temporary crown and bridge restorations, complete and partial dentures and orthodontic clear aligners."

"Prior to additive manufacturing techniques, there were shapes and designs for instruments and restorations in dentistry that were either impossible or so expensive and cumbersome to fabricate, they were not feasible to create," Johnston added. "The Form2 overcomes those pitfalls and does so with resins that have been determined biocompatible for intraoral use."


This technology leads to improved patient care, said Johnston.

"By merging 3D radiographs of jaws with 3D models of actual teeth, we are able to plan exact placement of implants and with 3D printing technology added to that, we are able to carry out those plans with extreme precision," he said. "This precision of placement gives us the ability to more predictably avoid nerves, vessels and adjacent teeth with our implant placement. Also, this technology enables us to have temporary crowns made before dental implant surgery to attach to the implants at the time of surgery."

Currently, Travis AFB Airmen are working on a dozen 2018 SIF-funded projects and preparing to submit innovative ideas for the 2019 SIF campaign. Airmen can submit ideas through the U.S. Air Force Ideation Platform at <https://usaf.ideascalegov.com/>.

Airman teaches life lessons through boxing

Airmen support Operation Freedom's Sentinel and NATO's Resolute Support

Airmen from the 19th Airlift Wing and 913th Airlift Group headed out the door this week to Southwest Asia in support of Operation Freedom's Sentinel and NATO's Resolute Support.

Nearly 150 Airmen from the 19th Maintenance Group, 19th Operations Group and 19th Logistics Readiness Squadron deployed alongside over 100 Reserve Airmen from the 913th AG who would provide enhanced joint operability.

"As an installation, we are going to see nearly 500 Team Little Rock Airmen deploy by the end of the month," said U.S. Air Force Col. Gerald Donohue, 19th AW commander. "While that is a heavy lift across organizations, it is exactly what we train for."

This is the first time the 913th AG has deployed with the 19th AW as an air crew and maintenance package. For some Airmen, this is their first deployment. Airmen completed training in an effort to excel at the tasks expected of them.

"Our Airmen are going to be working closely alongside our allies to bring the fight to our adversaries," Donohue said. "We have collectively been developing our readiness over the last year, which has improved those skills our deploying Airmen will need downrange. They are unmatched in their training and execution of the mission, and they will be ready for the challenges to come in supporting our nation's defense abroad."

Approximately 94 percent of the Airmen in the 19th AW are ready to deploy at a moment's notice. The ability to train alongside the Reserves is a great example of the total force effort generated here.




