Air Force Medical Readiness Agency stands up

Air Force Surgeon General Public Affairs

FALLS CHURCH, Va. – In a ceremony June 28 at the Defense Health Headquarters in Falls Church, the Air Force Medical Service stood up a new field operating agency, the Air Force Medical Readiness Agency.

Air Force Surgeon General Lt. Gen. Dorothy Hogg, and incoming AFMRA commander Brig. Gen. Mark Koeniger, spoke at the ceremony, heralding a new era in Air Force Medicine.

“We are in exciting and historic times as we engage in multiple lines of effort to transform our organi-

zation to support a more ready Air Force,” Hogg said. “Activating AFMRA streamlines our organization from a dual-focus on health benefit delivery and readiness, to one laser-focused on readiness.”

AFMRA increases the Air Force focus on operational medical readiness and supports the Air Force secretary's goal of a more ready, fighting force. The organization will oversee medical readiness programs, expeditionary medical capabilities and readiness-related Air Force mission support requirements. It will also assist the surgeon general in developing the policies to support Air Force major commands

and base-level unit missions.

Standing up AFMRA fulfills a requirement from the fiscal year 2017 National Defense Authorization Act to establish a readiness-focused organization. The previous two Field Operating Agencies in the AFMS, the Air Force Medical Operations Agency and the Air Force Medical Support Agency, were stood down at the same ceremony.

“AFMRA lets us be more responsive to emerging readiness requirements,” Koeniger said. “AFMRA improves our support to the readiness mission at military



“Our mission is your mission.” This motto serves as the backbone of everything that is the 19th Contracting Squadron.

The 19th CONS is tasked with overseeing Team Little Rock's services and commodities contracts from the time they're a squadron purchase request through the end of their life cycle.

U.S. Air Force Airman 1st Class Trenton Sikute, 19th CONS contract specialist, assists in effectively accomplishing the mission, ensuring every squadron has the necessary tools to maintain safe and agile combat airlift.

“Without contracting, every squadron would be burdened with having to find their own cost-effective contracting solutions,” Sikute said. “We allow them to focus on their mission while we enable affordable, war-winning capability on time while executing innovative business strategies.”

Contracting specialists help prepare, negotiate and award contracts to qualified vendors as well as evaluate their performances to ensure the money spent is put to its best possible use. With every squadron having a limited budget, it's paramount that their money is spent efficiently so the mobility mission isn't halted due to budget constraints.

“I've been fortunate enough to be trained by highly skilled contracting officers who help walk me through the process and tirelessly answer my questions,” Sikute said.

U.S. Air Force Tech. Sgt. Phillip Green, 19th Contracting Squadron contracting officer, has been a mentor to Sikute along with being his direct supervisor providing the tools and guidance necessary to succeed.

“Sikute went through the exercise earlier this year as a new Airman and came out the other side with a

better knowledge and feel of where he fit into the mission,” Green said. “He became even hungrier to learn because he could feel the impact that he is going to have on this base.”

Sikute recently awarded his first contract, assigning an instructor for the Vital 90 class for fiscal year 2020.

“The next time you're in a Vital 90 class sweating up a storm and getting yelled at by the ultra-fit instructors, you will know the 19th CONS had a hand in making that happen,” Sikute said.

Although it's still early in his career, Sikute recognizes his vital role played in the combat airlift mission, reaffirming his decision to join the U.S. Air Force.

“I feel really in debt to the generations before me for the sacrifices they made for us all,” Sikute said. “Serving in the military seemed like a good way to demonstrate that gratitude and to try and do my part.”

Keeping up with aircrew safety: 19th OSS AFE

Pilots and loadmasters are some of the first Airmen who come to mind when thinking about the safe execution of agile combat airlift. The 19th Operations Support Squadron Aircrew Flight Equipment Flight is responsible for maintaining all in-flight safety equipment, ensuring aircrew are properly trained in the event of an emergency.

The numerous pieces of equipment AFE Airmen work with include chemical flight equipment, deflated life rafts, and parachutes. They always stay up-to-date on equipment inspections relieving that

responsibility from the aircrew so they can focus on the aircraft and the mission.

"I've been told by a couple of aircrew members that they feel safer with our equipment there," said U.S. Air Force Staff Sgt. Niall Spradley, 19th OSS AFE craftsman. "It's one less thing they have to worry about maintaining themselves, and it's there if needed."

C-130J pilots and loadmasters do not require regular use of AFE while in-flight. However, the gear is vital to staying safe during emergencies. The 19th OSS AFE Airmen verify aircrew are trained on how to use the equipment for the rare instance it will be necessary.

“On training days, we prepare equipment for aircrew and assist them with donning, stepping and recovery procedures in a simulated-contaminated environment,” said U.S. Air Force Airman 1st Class Stephanie Reamer, 19th OSS AFE journeyman. “Upon return to base from the exercise area, we’ll address any issues they faced and make the proper repairs.”

Some of the newest chemical gear used by aircrew is the aircrew eye and respiratory protection system gear, which enable them to operate in contested environments. With readiness at the forefront for the 19th Airlift Wing, AFE Airmen verify aircrew are always prepared for exercises, as well as real-world, high-risk events while operating with this new chemical equipment.

“What they do is vital to our mission,” said U.S. Air Force Capt. Bryan Maynard, 61st Airlift Squadron pilot. “They maintain essential equipment that enables the Herk to accomplish combat airlift wherever it’s needed. I just returned from a training mission to drop jumpers from greater than 10,000 feet in the mountains, and we needed our oxygen masks at those altitudes to complete the mission.”

Spradley also mentioned a similar

situation where completing his daily work tasks potentially saved an A-10 pilot’s life.

“An A-10 (Thunderbolt II) pilot ejected with a parachute I packed with a coworker of mine,” Spradley said. “After that, it sealed the deal that my job is important. Having his wife come up to me at the hospital and thank us was an eye-opener. I was only 18 or 19 years old and just doing a job.”

Safety is a high priority for all Airmen, but the AFE flight is regularly there to train and support

the aircrew in the event they need to make a decision in an emergency situation while accomplishing the mission in any number of environments around the world.

“If we don’t maintain their oxygen masks properly, they won’t be able to breathe,” Reamer said. “Without parachutes, they wouldn’t have something to fall back on in crises. We exist to maintain equipment in place for emergencies that leave aircrew confident making split-second decisions while helping them arrive safely at home station.”

treatment facilities and Air Force major commands, while also helping the Defense Health Agency take on management of the health care benefit at MTFs.”

Koeniger is coming to AFMRA after commanding the 711th Human Performance Wing at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio.

To ensure continued support to MTFs, AFMRA will temporarily retain many capabilities focused on managing health benefit delivery at MTFs. These capabilities will move the DHA in future years.

At stand up, AFMRA headquar-

ters is in Falls Church at the Defense Health Headquarters. Other AFMRA components are split between Falls Church and the former AFMOA offices in San Antonio. Future locations for the organization are still being determined. AFMRA is expected to reach full operating capability in 2020.

“We activate AFMRA with our eyes on the future,” Hogg said. “We will continue to provide world class readiness support and modernize our capabilities to meet the demands of the Air Force we need.”

AFMRA is part of sweeping reform in the AFMS and the overall Military Health System. The next phase of reform is the administrative transition of service MTFs to Defense Health Agency responsibility on Oct. 1.
