

123 C-130s removed from service

SCOTT AIR FORCE BASE, Illinois – Gen. Maryanne Miller, Air Mobility Command commander, ordered the temporary removal of 123 of 450 Total Force C-130 Hercules from service on Aug. 7, after atypical cracks were discovered on the lower center wing joint or “rainbow fitting” during programmed depot maintenance.

In consultation with aircraft maintenance and engineering experts, General Miller directed an immediate time compliance technical order inspection to identify and correct any cracking to ensure airworthiness of these C-130 aircraft. In accordance with the TCTO, in-depth visual and modified non-destructive inspections of the wing box will be conducted on affected C-130H and J-model aircraft that have not received the extended service life center wing box and have greater than 15,000 equivalent flight hours.

If cracking is identified during the 8-hour inspections, a depot-level replacement of the rainbow fitting will be required. Aircraft that are inspected and determined to have no cracking will be immediately returned to service. The Air Force takes the safety of its Airmen and aircraft very seriously and is working diligently to identify and repair affected aircraft as soon as possible. At this time, it has been assessed that this temporary removal of service will not impact ongoing C-130 support to overseas contingency operations.



Keeping Herk Nation airspace safe

“Essentially we’re putting a puzzle together,” said U.S. Air Force Senior Airman Jared Asher, 19th OSS air traffic control journeyman. “With our ground traffic and the planes flying back to base, we have to work a puzzle. If the pilots listen and everything flows the way it’s supposed to, the puzzle comes together. There are times when there is generalized chaos and it causes the puzzle to get jumbled, but it’s our job to put it back together.”

Similar to other careers, on-the-job training for air traffic controllers is a must in order to ensure agile Combat Airlift is delivered anywhere and anytime. Airmen assigned to this unit learn alongside a fully qualified and experienced trainer, so there is no room for error when it comes to mission success.

“We monitor the newer Airmen closely, but when they’ve received certifications for the numerous positions, we let them work as though they are fully trained,” Asher said. “We sit back and watch unless we need to step in.”

While the trainees are learning, they move through-out three different positions: clearance and delivery, ground control, and local. Each position has one goal in mind – ensuring aircraft stay a safe distance apart, whether they’re on the ground or in the air.

“I didn’t understand the importance of the job in technical school,” said U.S. Air Force Airman 1st Class Tanner Bohannon, 19th OSS air traffic control apprentice. “It was rewarding becoming operational and understanding our role within Herk Nation: to bring aircrew home safely when they return from a mission.”

Luckily, Team Little Rock’s routine operational and training missions utilizes the same airframe – the C-130. This means air traffic rules and regulations don’t differ much when guiding aircraft on Little Rock AFB.

“The mission aspect makes air traffic a lot easier because we only have one airframe, with similar missions,” Asher said. “Air traffic is an interesting job because every base does the same job and follows the same procedures, but it differs when it comes to the size of the airspace and type of aircraft being used.”

Combat Airlift is a constant mission – 24 hours per day, seven days per week – so air traffic controllers must stay ready to lead air traffic at all times. The high risk of guiding aircraft on a base comes with high reward.

“I wouldn’t trade any job for this one,” Asher said. “Receiving a short-notice call about a humanitarian mission and seeing the C-130 come back knowing our mission helped save people’s lives is why it’s all worth it.”

IPE supervisor sets standard for Airmen

To an average person, managing a supply warehouse of individual protective equipment worth nearly \$9 million, as well as securing and deploying an armory worth \$2.1 million, and supervising 14 Airmen every day would be seemingly impossible – but not for one Airman.

U.S. Air Force Staff Sgt. Erika Harlan, 19th Logistics Readiness Squadron IPE supervisor, tackles this daily challenge with positivity and a smile while maintaining nearly 650 different pieces of equipment.

“Not everyone can be on a plane,” Harlan said. “There has to be someone back here doing material management and I’m proud to be the one to do it.”

Harlan is responsible for supervising and training Airmen in the material management flight, often referred to as supply, who work every day to maintain inventory throughout the warehouse ensuring assets are ready for use.

“I try to keep them pumped about

supply being our pride and joy, no one messes with it, and we take care of it,” Harlan said. “I try to let the Airmen know why what they’re doing is important, not just that they have to count something again.”

U.S. Air Force Tech. Sgt. Isaiah Vance, 19th LRS NCO in charge of IPE, said Harlan constantly checks on Airmen’s well-being and encourages them to better themselves both on the job and outside of work.

“In today’s Air Force it’s imperative that supervisors have that balance between personal and professional relationships,” Vance said. “Harlan is the standard for having and maintaining this balance. She is a great leader and a great example for our younger Airmen to follow. We need more leaders like her.”

Vance said Harlan keeps a positive attitude around the Airmen and engages with them about their personal lives.

“My Airmen are my motivation,” Harlan said. “They always give me a new

challenge every day. They're my motivation to make sure that once they walk out the door, they're happy."

The supply flight is critical in making sure Airmen have the proper equipment while in training and deployed environments providing essential Combat Airlift. Harlan saw how material management affected the broad scheme of things during a deployment in Qatar.

"I've held bloody equipment downrange," Harlan said. "I've seen armor with a bullet in it and had we not done our job properly, they wouldn't be here today."

Harlan said that the amount of teamwork, knowledge and communication that's needed in material management can be seen as a shock, but supply has a huge impact on the overall mission of the Air Force.

"This is a job that saves lives," Harlan said. "You won't see supply, but we're there. We affect and touch everything. This is one of the jobs that doesn't get a lot of limelight but it's definitely one of the bloodlines that make the Air Force's heart pump."

to what TLR is accomplishing but to the support you provide us. There is no way we could accomplish these successes if it wasn't for the support of this amazing community."

Hutchinson echoed the same sentiment.

"It really goes to show that there's not a community in the nation that is more dedicated to an Air Force base than the community in support of Little Rock Air Force Base," Hutchinson said.

Earlier this year, Hutchinson signed the bill into law providing automatic licensure for military spouses and veterans easing the challenges of relocation.

The community council also received a \$377,000 military affairs grant program award that has helped Jacksonville High School develop a first-of-its-kind cyber security training curriculum. It was part of the Military Affairs Initiative, which was announced in 2015 and is designed to support and grow military installations in Arkansas.

"I'm grateful for the men and women on this base that do not drop the flag of the United States of America," Hutchinson said. "You carry the banner of freedom, you carry the defense of our country globally, nationally and we're grateful for it. That is why Arkansas is delighted to partner with you as a community to make sure this base remains strong in the defense of our country."




