# CBRN instructors prepare Black Knights for upcoming exercise

Twice per year, the 19th Airlift Wing pulls members together to exercise real-world events in a simulated, contested environment. Airmen continue to do their job in supporting and completing the mission while operating in mission-oriented protective posture gear.

Their initial training and know-how on the gear begins long before the exercise does — it begins in the chemical, biological, radiological and nuclear defense class taught by the 19th Civil Engineer Squadron Emergency Management Flight.

The CBRN defense class teaches individuals the ability to survive in a contested environment. Depending on the type of warfare presented, the training allows Airmen to understand the hazards they could face in addition to the correct protective measures to avoid these substances.

“Whatever the type of warfare — chemical agents in the air, biological warfare, or even a radiological or nuclear device — people understand the hazards around them and how to best survive while carrying out operations to complete the mission,” said U.S. Air Force Staff Sgt. Jacob Brewer, 19th Civil Engineer Squadron NCO in charge of emergency management plans and operations, and CBRN defense class instructor.

In the past, the classes and exercises have been focused on chemical and biological agents, but in their upcoming November exercise, the Black Knights will be switching it up by enhancing their skills in a simulated-radiological-nuclear environment, which requires a few minor changes to the classes.

“We’re looking at putting a slideshow in the personal support for contingency in-brief for the exercise so if someone needs

a refresher from CBRN, we can let them know the ways to protect themselves from radiological and nuclear hazards,” said U.S. Air Force Airman 1st Class Candace Carrico, 19th CES emergency management journeyman and CBRN defense class instructor.

This slideshow will review the material each Airman recieved the previous year, which contains additional information on protective measures from different radiological and nuclear weapons, such as time, distance and shielding.

The emergency management team hopes the added information to the class will demystify radiation to include the common belief that this sort of warfare is not used today.

“From what we have studied, this kind of warfare is being used,” Brewer said. “It’s important we train so Airmen can protect themselves and their fellow wingmen in the unfortunate case they’re put in a contested environment such as this.”

The CBRN defense class instructors enjoy being able to share their knowledge on the topic with the rest of the 19th AW.

“When that new Airman comes up to you in class with their gear on correctly, you realize they’re understanding the importance of the class, which is my favorite part of teaching it,” Carrico said.

# CMSAF Wright joins LRAFB Airmen for Wingman Day

Chief Master Sgt. of the Air Force Kaleth O. Wright visited Little Rock Air Force Base Oct. 3-4, to meet with Airmen and take part in the base's Wingman Day.

Wingman Day was the culminating event for Phase I of the 19th Airlift Wing's Resiliency Campaign Plan. The RCP is the 19th AW's method of connecting Airmen to not only the mission, but also to the resources and community required for cultivating a culture of Ready Warriors.

Upon his arrival, Wright visited multiple units across the installation including the 19th AW, 314th AW, 189th AW, and 913th Airlift Group to learn how Herk Nation's singular focus on Combat Airlift is underpinned by the foundation of training that happens here and is manifested in the day-to-day operations supported around the world.

"Having the opportunity to see all four of the mission sets that you have here with the three wings and the group has been an amazing experience," said Wright. "I got the opportunity to connect with quite a few Airmen today and yesterday -- I appreciate what you guys do."

For all Airmen, Wingman Day started with taking a wing-wide Defense Equal Opportunity Climate Survey. The 19th AW partnered with the 711th Human Performance Wing from Wright-Patterson AFB, Ohio, to provide a more detailed survey to approximately a third of Airmen, focusing on organizational health, mental health, and physical health trends within the force.

"We wanted to solicit direct feedback from members across the wing," said Col. John Schutte, 19th AW commander. "We will take that feedback and use it to inform what our efforts will be over the course of the second phase of our RCP."

To kick off Wingman Day, Wright along with other senior enlisted leaders on the base augmented Security Forces members helping check identification cards while greeting Airmen at the gate.

Following his time with the defenders of the base, Wright visited Camp Warlord – Team Little Rock's training complex where semi-annual full-spectrum readiness exercise are held to gain a better understanding of where Airmen practice and hone their expeditionary readiness skills.

Wright then stopped by the 19th Medical Group for a surprise visit to meet LRAFB's medical professionals.

Next, Wright was able to join Airmen at the Herk Nation Mission Expo – a festival-style display connect-

ing junior Airmen to their vital role in Combat Airlift.

“The expo gave everyone a chance to see the bigger picture,” said Senior Airman Matthew Head, 189th Civil Engineer Squadron emergency management journeyman. “It’s a good way of building community — to take a day just to reflect on what we’re doing. The mission’s important, but most effective when everyone has a clear mind and an understanding of why we’re here.”

After the Expo, Wright joined in for Operation DORM STORM, bringing more than 400 supervisors and base leaders to conduct small repairs and beautification efforts to the dorms; demonstrating leadership’s commitment to the health and well-being of Airmen.

“Operation DORM STORM is all about visibly demonstrating to Airmen at the lowest level that leaders from across the base want to dedicate our time and our efforts to take care of Airmen,” said Schutte.

Before departing, Wright sat down with Airmen for lunch at the Hercules dining facility where they spoke about their personal stories and their outlooks

on the Air Force.

Wingman Day ended with a family-friendly Oktoberfest celebration for TLR to strengthen the bonds of community and celebrate the successes of Phase I of the RCP.

“Whether it’s Wingman Day or what we did with the Resiliency Tactical Pause, we all need to just stop for a minute and kind of reassess where we are and what we’re doing,” said Wright. “I like that part of your Wingman Day was helping Airmen around the installation connect to the primary mission.”

The 19th AW plans to leverage the momentum of the RCP by continuing to focus on a culture where Airmen feel connected, protected and respected.

“As we end the first phase of our RCP, I hope Airmen enjoyed Wingman Day as much as I did,” said Schutte. “In addition to having the honor of sharing in these events with Chief Wright, this was an excellent culmination of efforts from across our wing over the past two months to really focus in on what unites and connects us.”

Phase 2 of the RCP will be a multi-faceted education effort; redoubling efforts in Airman Leadership School, Flight Leadership Course, Key Spouse Training, various other Developmental and Leadership seminars and courses, and forging Ready Warriors through Full Spectrum Readiness exercises.

## 19th MDG excels in Joint Commission inspection

The 19th Medical Group at Little Rock Air Force Base recently underwent a two and a half day inspection from The Joint Commission.

The Joint Commission is an independent, not-for-profit organization that evaluates over 20,000 health care organizations and programs across the United States.

“They have a very long list of items that they look at that’s designed toward improving the quality of care across the country as a whole, ensuring that a particular facility is adhering to the best standards of quality,” said U.S. Air Force Lt. Col. Micah Schmidt, 19th MDG chief of medical staff.

Per Air Force instruction, LRAFB must get an inspection every three years, which evaluates over 800 elements ensuring every aspect of the 19th MDG are providing patients with quality care.

The inspection process begins as soon as the patient walks in the door and continues through every appointment and pharmacy visit, including follow-up appointments.

“The inspection went very well,” Schmidt said. “It was encouraging receiving feedback on our team stating ‘it is highly impressive that you have junior Airmen who understand the process so well, that they be an instructor to others in the medical field.’”

The 19th MDG received five best practices during the inspection. A best practice means that not only was the standard for the specific element met, but it was exceeded. The most highlighted new practice, which will become graded in early 2020, was the antimicrobial stewardship.

“The Joint Commission suggested that we publish the new stewardship on their website, which is a big deal — a great honor,” said U.S. Air Force Lt. Col. Luvenia Manning, 19th MDG chief nurse executive.

The goal of the new stewardship is to ensure patients are receiving the exact amount of antibiotics needed to prevent overexposure to antibiotics by improving overall health of the patient.

“We have a stated Air Force and Defense Health Agency standard that we call antibiotic stewardship,” Schmidt said. “What we’re trying to create is a patient safety goal; if you were exposed to antibiotics when you don’t need to be, that can have health repercussions both for you and for everybody around you.”

While keeping up with a rapidly evolving industry such as the medical field, the 19th MDG worked alongside U.S. Air

Force Maj. Peter Easter, Defense Health Agency director of clinical registries, Joint Base San Antonio-Lackland, Texas, to design a tracking process.

“We’ve established a database driven tool to look at every antibiotic prescription, and target our physician peer review process for when you come and see a doctor for a certain number of those charts, a second doctor is going to read that chart and provide feedback,” Schmidt said.

According to Schmidt, the 19th MDG performed in the top 10 percent on standardized measures for antibiotic prescribing in 2018. This program has further reduced unnecessary antibiotic usage, that may harm patients, by an additional 90 percent in the persistent pursuit of the best possible medical care.

“For me this is a proud moment,” has been replaced with “According to Schmidt, the 19th MDG performed in the top 10 percent on standardized measures for antibiotic prescribing in 2018. This program has further reduced unnecessary antibiotic usage, that may harm patients, by an additional 90 percent in the persistent pursuit of the best possible medical care.”
