19th LRS Airmen mark milestone

September 11, 2019, during Exercise Mobility Guardian 2019, marked the first time mobile fuel bladders have been used stateside in an uncontested environment by employing a Fuels Operational Readiness Capability Equipment system — FORCE.

Team Little Rock Airmen from the 19th Logistics Readiness Squadron Petroleum, Oils and Lubricants flight were part of this milestone, setting up the FORCE system in less than 24 hours.

FORCE systems retain readiness for Airmen by allowing them to quickly set up a fuel system in an area, providing the ability to rapidly deliver fuel to aircraft.

“This was a fully functioning fuels system that you could lay on the flight line, or anywhere,” said U.S. Air Force Staff Sgt. Mark Baker, 19th LRS POL flight NCO in charge. “It was faster to put up, more mobile and easier to use.”

The FORCE system holds up to 50,000 gallons of fuel and can be used to refuel an aircraft or provide a refueling station for fuel trucks. Using the system was an opportunity for 19th LRS Airmen to provide agile support and employment in future contingency operations.

Mark said POL Airmen rarely set up fuel systems, which is why the experience was not only unique, but trained them for future tasks.

“Not many people get the hands-on training like that because typically when we deploy, it’s already in place and we just run it,” Mark said. “Being able to set it up, use it, and tear it down all within 30 days was a lot of experience.”

The team was able to fill everything from

MG19 to Green Flag: 19th AMXS maintains readiness

Members from the 19th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron participated in Mobility Guardian 2019, Air Mobility Command's largest biennial full-spectrum readiness exercise, in order to help Airmen become joint-minded mobility leaders. Maintaining readiness is essential to upholding Rapid Global Mobility. Realistic training environments ensure Airmen are more mission-ready, capable and prepared.

As the exercise approached, the team experienced the first test of their readiness by seeing how efficiently they could collect everything they would need for Mobility Guardian 2019.

"The biggest opportunity we had to test our readiness was simulating the entire deployment process," said U.S. Air Force Capt. Michael Comiskey, 19th Maintenance Group executive officer. "We got to practice packing all of our assets up and shipping those out to make sure we could operate away from our home station."

Mobility Guardian 2019 saw many units come from all over AMC and across the world in order to train together, which

enhances the vital partnerships the Air Force relies on to accomplish the mission.

"One thing I thought was going to be difficult for us was getting used to working with the other bases," said U.S. Air Force Master Sgt. Chhaya Ung, 19th AMXS section chief. "It's not always cohesive between different units, but all these Airmen came together on day one. Everyone from senior NCOs to Airmen understood that we were there to work as a team."



The 19th AMXS assisted in maintaining seven C-130J's, which flew a total of 113 of the 388 missions, as well as provided support to the Air Force's international partners.

"We were flying the whole fleet on a daily basis," Ung said. "We proved that we can take our people and put them anywhere and they will be able to do whatever is required to get the mission done."

Exercises are put in place to test the readiness of Airmen to ensure they keep their competitive edge by providing Rapid Global Mobility whenever they are called upon.

"We could be asked to go anywhere at any time in order to execute the mission," Comiskey said. "That's why it's a big deal to practice because we are the ones who have to go out there and make sure the planes are ready to deliver at a moment's notice."

Airmen will continue to hone their abilities to

perform agile Combat Airlift in a contingency environment during Green Flag Little Rock 20-01, a joint live-training tactical exercise with a focus on combat airlift and airdrop operations, interoperability with our Joint and International partners, as well as survival, evasion, resistance and escape, just as they did during Mobility Guardian 2019.

"We are always working hard to prepare for the next big thing," Ung said. "Green Flag is what helped us prepare for Mobility Guardian so we are definitely ready to tackle Green Flag again."

Maintainers are responsible for ensuring that the planes are always capable of executing their mission. The 19th AMXS's readiness is instrumental to maintaining Team Little Rock's ability to keep planes in the air and compete on a global scale.

"It is guaranteed that every C-130's mission will start and end with maintenance," Comiskey said. "We strive to maintain our readiness because every time a plane goes around the world, there is more than likely a maintainer that's going to be with that plane to fix it and make sure it is capable of carrying out the mission."

T 19th AW invests in Trust

To kick off Phase II of the 19th Airlift Wing’s Resiliency Campaign Plan, the wing hosted a Franklin Covey workshop on Oct. 16 for command teams and key spouses to learn how to be an effective leader by inspiring and extending trust at Little Rock Air Force Base.

“Our key spouses and command teams are vital to building an environment where each member feels connected and valued,” said Col. John Schutte, 19th Airlift Wing commander. “As a wing, we are investing in them so they can continue to forge a culture of trust, where every member of the tribe feels they are a valued member, essential to the success of our Combat Airlift mission.”

More than just a training event, the class equips people and organizations to transform toxic relationships, teams, and organizational cultures and to harness high trust as a performance multiplier. This work session focused on behaviors common to high-trust leaders.

“We asked for command teams to be here because this is crucial training for them,” Schutte said.

Developing trust can help team members become energized, engaged, collaborate more effectively, operate faster, and achieve sustainable results required for cultivating a culture of Ready Warriors.

The unit commanders also had the opportunity to bring their key spouses and key spouse mentors to the training in an effort to enhance Airmen and family readiness.

The U.S. Air Force Key Spouse Program is designed to enhance readiness, personal and family resiliency, and establish a sense of Air Force community. Key spouses are commander-appointed and serve as a vital resource to command teams in an effort to support Air Force families.

“Key spouses have one of the most difficult jobs in our Air Force,” Schutte said. “They are essential to our unit readiness and resilience and we ask them to do all of this on a volunteer basis. We want to demonstrate to key spouses how valuable they are by integrating them further with squadron commanders and superintendents because they are a critical component of that unit leadership team.”

The class also went over the economics of trust and its effects on speed and cost in relationships, and how to assess trustworthiness based on character and competence.

“The course provided a lot of self-reflection of what we as leaders can do better to trust folks and gain that trust faster with individuals as well,” said Chief Master Sgt. Justin Strain, 19th AW command chief. “This training opens the door for even greater trust between the command teams, and building the trust down the chain with not only the individuals in that unit, but also their spouses, significant others and family members.”

Air Force recognizes Energy Action Month

October is Energy Action Month, an opportunity to highlight why energy is a critical enabler to combat capability for the U.S. Air Force and Department of Defense, and to encourage smarter energy use and management for installations, ground vehicles, and aircraft. Unveiled this year, the Air Force theme of “Energy Able, Mission Capable” educates Airmen about the importance of energy readiness and resilience for the global mission.

“By prioritizing energy management and resilience, we are building a strong foundation for the future warfighter and ensuring Airmen have energy when and where they need it,” said the Honorable John W. Henderson, Assistant Secretary of the Air Force for Installations, Environment, and Energy.

Every year the U.S. Air Force spends nearly \$6 billion on energy, with approximately 82 percent used for aviation fuel, 16 percent for facilities and installations, and 2 percent for ground vehicles. While energy is a necessary part of operations, as the modern battlefield grows increasingly complex, keeping it secure and readily available can pose serious risks and challenges for troops. Powering aviation assets requires complex fuel planning and logistics, all the way from refinery and storage facilities to fuel convoys and transport to the end-user. As power projection platforms, installations depend on secure, reliable and

quality power to ensure Air Force mission assurance.

The Air Force is focusing on energy resilience and optimization to sustain warfighting capabilities in the air and on the ground. For instance, upgraded aircraft aerodynamics increase range and limit the need for aerial refueling. Investments in modern software improve the effectiveness of tankers and streamline mission planning. Engine sustainment initiatives increase time on wing and prevent some maintenance issues. At the installation level, from new onsite generating capabilities to ensure energy resilient operations, to a record setting year of energy savings performance contracting, the Air Force is prepared to fly, fight and win from its installations under any conditions.

During Energy Action Month, the Air Force will emphasize the need for smart energy solutions and inform Airmen, Air Force senior leaders, policy makers, and aligned organizations about what they can do to effectively distribute, generate, and manage resilient and reliable energy across the enterprise.





C-130s to C-5s, plus all the generators to keep the tents and power carts running. Their contribution to the exercise was imperative to every day needs.

“It gives the Air Force a new aspect to be able to see it work if we dropped it anywhere,” said U.S. Air Force Airman 1st Class Kynneth Baker, 19th Logistics Readiness Squadron fuel cryogenics journeyman. “It can hold a lot of fuel and if it was needed for a quick place to fuel the fighters, it would get them going. It allows the mapping of warfare to be easier in the long run.”

This milestone showcased the flexibility and resilience POL Airmen are capable of in real-world contingency operations or contested environments.

“The overall goal was to see how fast we could set it up, how many people we would need, and how efficiently it worked,” Kynneth said. “I think all of it was successful.”
