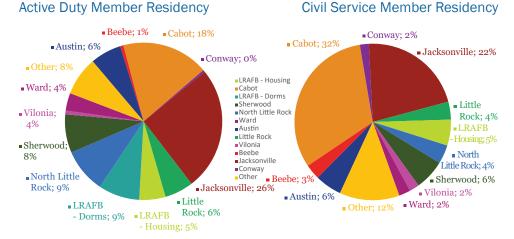
Team Little Rock - Total Force:
