Note: You can request a 90 day supply from a network pharmacy but you will be charged separately for each 30 days. For example, a 90 day supply of a generic drug will cost you \$30.

Note: <u>Maintenance drugs must be obtained from the base or Express Scripts</u>. If you order your maintenance drug(s) from a network pharmacy (example Wal-Mart); the first time you will receive a notification from TRICARE. If you order from a network pharmacy a second time, you will again be notified by TRICARE. If you continue to use a network pharmacy expect to pay full price on your third order.

## **Tricare Urgent Care Pilot Program:**

Note: Medicare/TRICARE for Life enrollees are not subject to these restrictions.

Under this program, retirees enrolled in TRICARE Prime will be allowed two visits per year to an Urgent Care facility without getting a referral from their Primary Care Manager (PCM). Appointments may be scheduled with any TRICARE-authorized network or non-network provider. Visits in excess of two per fiscal year must be approved by your PCM or point of service fees will apply. Retirees uncertain as to the need for urgent care and who are assigned to an on-base clinic can call the clinic for an evaluation. After normal duty hours contact the after-hours nurse at (501) 987-8811. Non-assigned retirees can use the 24-hour TRICARE Nurse Advice Line at 1-800-874-2273.

Urgent Care while traveling: If a referral is needed contact Humana at 1-800-444-5445.

The Urgent Care Pilot Program will remain in effect until May 23, 2019.

## **Optometry Clinic**

Retirees with an off-base prescription can now obtain, at no charge, 1 pair of glasses per year from the Optometry Clinic.

# VA Funded Home Based Primary Care

Under this program a team of health care professionals will provide in-home instruction to caregivers and family members caring for veterans in home care because treatment at an outpatient clinic is not recommended. Instruction will teach caregivers and family members about medical problems (medicine, food, etc.) and provide guidance for care. It does <u>not</u> provide emergency, daily nursing, therapy or housekeeping services. This service is currently available in Pulaski, Faulkner, Saline and Garland Counties as well as Cabot, Ward, Austin. Beebe, Pine Bluff, Redfield, Sheridan, East End and Malvern. ## **Military Personnel Section**

#### **Customer Support, DEERS Office (ID Cards)**

Note: It would be wise to contact Customer Support or the Retiree Activities Office before traveling to the DEERS office for an ID card or DEERS update. The DEERS system will occasionally go down without notice; there are periods of scheduled maintenance outages; and the office may be closed for holiday/family days, or directed no-notice reasons.

**Agent Letters:** Agent letters enable an individual designated by a disabled or aged retiree to access the base for the purpose of shopping, picking up medications and other services that the retiree or spouse can no longer perform for himself or herself . Letters will be issued by appointment only. Call Customer support at (501) 987-6831 to schedule an appointment.

#### Initial Issue, and replacement for lost, stolen or expired IDs

**Two forms of documentation** are required in order to obtain an initial issue ID or replacement for a lost, stolen or expired ID. In addition, the sponsor must be present unless the applicant has a power of attorney specifically authorizing DEERS updates. One form of documentation **must be a valid/unexpired State or federal photo ID**. Examples include a driver's license, passport, or concealed carry permit. The second form of ID can be a Social Security Card, Birth Certificate, another state or federal photo ID, or voter registration card. **All documentation must be the original or a certified copy and can not be laminated**. **Unacceptable forms of ID**, include your expired ID, credit/debit cards, a line badge, school IDs, Sam's card, or a hunting or fishing license.

#### **Initial Enrolment into DEERS documentation**

**-New Spouse:** a certified and recorded marriage license, a birth certificate (original or certified copy and not laminated), a Social Security Card (original or certified copy and not laminated), and a current drivers license.

- **Children:** Certificate of live birth naming both parents, including the child's full name, and signed by the attending physician or responsible individual or birth certificate (original or certified copy and not laminated), and an original or certified copy of the child's Social Security Card that is not laminated.

In the event of their death, retirees can simplify things for their surviving spouse or other next of kin by making the following readily available to them now:

- Your DD Form 214
- Your Retiree Account statement
- Any Applicable VA Paperwork
- Information on insurance policies
- A current will

The Casualty Assistance Office will be glad to help identify and acquire the necessary documentation. *Note: Surviving spouses should be made aware that remarriage to a non-military individual will result in their losing all ID card privileges. If that marriage is terminated for any reason the spouse can re-apply for an ID card under the name of the original sponsor however, reinstated privileges will <u>not include</u> <u>Medical or TRICARE benefits</u>.* 

In the event of a retiree death, surviving spouses or next of kin should contact the Little Rock Air Force Base casualty Office (501-987-3580) as soon as possible. This office can provide invaluable service including;

- Application for arrears pay
- Survivor Benefit application and information if applicable
- VA Contact information if applicable
- Assistance with insurance
- Any other applicable assistance.
- The office will also assist surviving spouses in obtaining a new ID card.

*Note;* Surviving spouses living outside of the local area can complete their claims paperwork via the US mail. Initial contact should be made using the above referenced phone number or email.

#### Summer Safety Tips for Retirees

As they get older retirees need to keep in mind that their natural ability to regulate temperature decreases with age. In addition, seniors tend to perspire less, making it harder for them to keep cool. Two conditions are of particular concern - heat exhaustion and heat stroke.

*Heat exhaustion* is indicated by headache, blurred vision, nausea, upset stomach, vomiting, sluggishness, fatigue, thirst, profuse sweating, low blood pressure, and a moderate increase in body temperature. If you begin to experience these symptoms use your common sense and get out of the heat. Find a cool place; lie down if you can; loosen your clothes if you can; drink cool, but not iced, water; and, if possible, apply ice wrapped in a towel to the head, neck, armpits and groin - areas that will bring the body temperature down. Sports drinks will help. Untreated, heat exhaustion can lead to heat stroke, which can lead to death.

*Heat stroke* occurs when the body loses its ability to cool itself. Sweating stops and the body's core temperature rises. Conditions common in seniors - obesity, cardiovascular disease and diabetes increase the risk of heat stroke as do many medications, dehydration, and alcohol. Symptoms include: headache, dizziness, high or low blood pressure, disorientation, agitation, confusion, hot dry skin, loss of consciences, increased body temperature, rapid heartbeat and hallucinations. Heat stroke requires immediate medical attention so don't fool around thinking it will go away.

You can avoid heat exhaustion and stroke by taking a few simple precautions.

- **Drink lots of fluids**. Seniors, particularly those over 65, tend to not drink enough fluids and are subject to dehydration. Severe dehydration can be very dangerous.

- **Stay out of the sun** during peak temperature hours. Tee off, exercise, go shopping, garden or cut the lawn early in the morning or in the evening and when you do, limit your activity to a reasonable amount.

- Take frequent breaks preferably in a cool place. Any place that is air conditioned is best
